Classes under open sky till there is no rain

Academic activities of the schools, colleges and madrasas that were damaged during the onslaught of cyclone Mahasen on May 16 are greatly hampered during the ongoing rainy season as the institutions have remained without any repair.

In Patuakhali district, 208 educational institutions (primary and high schools, madrasas and colleges) were fully damaged and 352 others partly damaged by Mahasen, said sources at the district administration.

The fully damaged institutions include 97 in Kalapara upazila, 56 in Rangabali, 52 in Galachipa, two in Dashmina and one in Dumki upazila under Patuakahli district.

Visiting Naubhanga Alim Madrasa in Nilganj union under Kalapara upazila a couple of days ago, this correspondent found students attending their classes under the open sky as the lone tin-shed house of the institution was ravaged by the cyclone.

"We arrange classes on the sunny days but it cannot be done when it starts raining. Authorities should take immediate step to repair the institution as the rains have already set in," said Ziaul Islam Habib, principal of the madrasa.


Similar scene was found at Nabipur Government Primary School in the same union as two tin-shed houses of the school were fully damaged by the cyclone. Benches, chairs and tables were also found broken there.

Class V, said, "We have to attend classes under the open sky. Classes break and our books and khatas wet when rain comes."

Grabbers build market on railway land illegally

Men allegedly belonging to the ruling Awami League (AL) constructed a market on a leased agricultural land of Bangladesh Railway (BR) beside Boral Bridge station in Bhangura upazila under the district.

The BR on May 8 issued a notice to remove the illegal construction within 30 days but the grabbers are yet to comply with, official sources said.

"The occupiers filled up the agricultural land of the railway and built a commercial market there illegally. When they started the construction in December last year, we made an official inquiry and asked them to stop the work but they continued it. The son of a local lawmaker backed the grabbers," said Md Shariful Islam, a surveyor of the estate department of BR.

Asked about the matter, Md Golam Hasnayen Russel, son of the lawmaker, League." said, "I have provided bricks from my brick kiln for the market construction as they sought my assistance. I am not involved with the land occupation."

Md Fazlul Haque, a resident of Chowbaria village near the station, took lease of 10 decimal lands beside Boral Bridge station as per a 'license for agriculture land' on November 8 in 2009 on condition of paying Tk 388 as yearly revenue, official sources said.

But with the help of local AL leaders, grabbers constructed a market illegally on the railway's agricultural land in violation of BR Act, said Md Nurul Islam, stationmaster of Bhangura.

Lessee Md Fazlul Haque said, "The land is leased in my name but the market has been built on 9,000 square feet land here with belonging to the Awami moment."

"It was a low land when

the lease was taken in 2009. We have already spent over Tk 50 lakh to use the abandoned land for commercial purpose. Now the land has turned valuable and our rivals started conspiracy," said Md Saidul Islam, organising secretary of Bhangura upazila unit of AL, also one of the partners of the mar-

"We have paid Tk 72 thousand as compensation to the railway authorities for changing status of the land," he added.

Kiron Chandra Roy, divisional estate officer of Railway in Pakshey, said, "There is no scope to change the status of a railway land. The accused used agricultural land for commercial purpose, violating BR Act. As they ignored the May 8 notice for removing the illegal construction within the partnership of some 30 days, we will conduct other local traders, all eviction drive any

RECRUITMENT EXAMINATION IN DINAJPUR

Invigilators 'kind' to ten, rude to 28 others!

Invigilators at a room of Dinajpur Government College, which served as a centre for the recruitment examination of Family Planning Directorate, allegedly gave question papers with answer marks to 10 candidates during the exam-

ination on Friday. When a few candidates protested the matter, invigilators asked them to 'answer quietly or quit the room', alleged the candidates requesting anonymity.

As many as 5,456 candidates from Dinajpur district sat for the test held at six centres including Dinajpur Government College for recruitment to different posts under four categories,

official sources said.

The MCQ test started at 10:00am and ended at 11:00am.

Two teachers of Dinajpur Government College were invigilators of room No 207 of Science Building of the

There were 38 candidates at the room, college sources

But the two teachers allegedly marked the right answers on 10 question papers and served them to the same number of candidates ten minutes after start of the examination, said several candidates seeking anonymity.

When contacted, Shahidul Islam, one of two invigilators under question, denied the allegation, say-


ing, "Nothing happened like that. The examination was fair and free from any influence."

The other invigilator, Md Rashedul Islam could not be contacted for his comment.

Mokarram Hossain, principal of Dinajpur Government College, also brushed aside the allegation.

He declined to tell the names of the two teachers who worked as invigilators of room No 207 but this correspondent later managed to get the names from other sources of the college.

Contacted, Didarul Islam, deputy director of the Dinajpur office of Family Planning Directorate, said he is yet to get any complaint of such incident.

10 hurt as BCL, JCD clash over toll collection

More than 10 students were injured in a clash between A teenage girl, who was set on the activists of Chhatra League and Jatyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) over toll collection at Pabna University of Science and

Technology yesterday. The authorities suspended all classes until tomorrow following the mayhem, said proctor Md Kamruzzaman.

University sources said a group of BCL and JCD men engaged in an altercation over toll collection in the name of holding a programme at Electrical and Electronic Engineering (EEE) department.

At one stage of altercation, a chase and counter case took place between the two rival student parties, leaving over 10 students injured.

Of the injured, Atik Hossain of EEE, Akhter Hossain of Bangla, Md Mamun of BBA, Ullash of Mathematics and Al Amin of EEE department, were admitted to different local clinics

while the rest given first aid. Contacted, the proctor said the clash took place over collecting toll for holding a farewell programme at EEE department.

Mizanur Rahman Sabuz, convener of the university unit BCL, blamed JCD for creating anarchy. However, JCD men refused to talk on the mather.

Away in Comilla, at least 10 people were injured in a clash between the activists of BCL and Chhatra Shibir Laksam Nawbab Faizunessa Degree College yesterday, reports a correspondent.

OC Abul Khair of Laksam police station said, the clash took place over admission of first year students around 2:30pm.

At least seven shops, a diagnostic centre and an ATM booth were also ransacked during the incident, said the OC.

Girl set afire by stalkers dies

fire by three alleged stalkers in Fulgazi upazila on June 16, succumbed to her burn injuries at Dhaka Medical College and Hospital (DMCH) yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Aklima Akter, 15, a class eight student at a local madrasa at Uttar Daulatpurvillage.

Md Asadur Rahman, elder brother of the girl, filed a case with Fulgazi police station accusing Md Sumon, 20, Md Kamal Uddin, 23, and Shanta Shaha, 20, of the area.

The trio used to tease the girl on her way to madrasa, said Md Solaiman Chowdhury, officer incharge of the PS.

On the midnight of June 16, a gang allegedly led by Sumon set Aklima on fire by pouring kerosene near her house when she disclosed the names of the stalkers to a madrasa teacher.

Aklima was admitted to Feni Sadar Hospital with 90 percent burn injuries and later shifted to DMCH as her condition deteriorated.

Two people were held for interrogation as the accused went into hiding, said police.

Teenage domestic help 'commits suicide', minor beaten up

A teenage domestic help at a contractor's house at Khatapra Majhar village under Saptibari union in Aditmari upazila allegedly committed suicide on Friday night.

Police recovered the body and sent it to the Lalmonirhat Sadar Hospital morgue for autopsy but they could not confirm the reason behind the incident.

Akhter, 13, who was working charge of taking biscuits at contactor Golap Hossain's house for last five years, hailed from Nageshwari upazila in Kurigram district.

The girl might have been compelled to commit suicide due to something wrong at her master's house, locals said.

In Jamalpur, an 11-yearold girl who was serving as domestic help at a residence in Dhaka, is fighting for life at a local hospital as she was allegedly tortured at her three days from June 17. Victim Marjina is daugh-

ter of Abdul Mutaleb, a farm labourer of Daudpur village in Melandah upazila of the district, reports our correspondent. Her family members said

that the girl was sent to the residence of fruit trader Nasir Uddin at Tejgaon in Dhaka to serve as a domestic help eight months ago. Housewife Sheuli Begum

They said Momena beat her up severely on without any permission and so did Nasir on return to house on June 17.

On June 20 morning, the girl was sent back alone by a Dewanganj-bound train from Tejgaon station.

"The girl is now seriously sick as she was badly tortured on the most parts of her body including head There are several injury marks and a big swelling in the victim's body", said Dr Narayan Chandra Dey at employer's residence for Jamalpur General Hospital.

Housewife murdered

A housewife was beaten to death at Sarcarpara village in Boda upazila in Panchagarh on Thursday evening. The victim was identified as Asia Khatun, 45, wife of Haidar Ali of the same village. Sub-Inspector of Boda PS Din Mohammad told this correspondent over cell phone that a local gang numbering 10/12, led by Amir Hossain of the same village, went to the woman's house at about 7:00pm and beat her mercilessly with sticks, leaving her dead on the spot. Her husband Haidar Ali and Amir Hossain's group had a previous enmity over a piece of disputed land, police said. Amir Hossain was arrested at night after Haidar Ali filed a murder case.

Strike at tea estates

Police said the body of Ovimoon, who went missing on Thursday, was found at the tea garden at around 9:00pm. Tea workers of the two gardens began an indefinite strike at around 10:00am yesterday, protesting the murder of Ovimoon and demanding immediate arrest and exemplary punishment of the killers. The workers postponed the strike at 6:00pm at the request of Rajghat Union Parishad Chairman Bijoy Benarjee.
