# Stop meddling in Grameen Bank affairs

BNP asks govt

The BNP has asked the government to stop interfering in the affairs of Grameen Bank.

"We (BNP) are with the 84 lakh borrowers of Grameen Bank. If we win in the next parliamentary polls, we will bring back the bank into its previous structure," said Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, acting secretary general of the BNP.

Fakhrul said no political issues were discussed in the 40minute-long meeting that started around 9:00am, adding that he had visited Yunus to greet him on his winning the US Congressional Gold Medal. From the beginning of its tenure, the government had

been insulting and harassing the Nobel laureate, Fakhrul alleged, terming the move to split the GB a conspiracy of the government. He asked the government to use the wisdom of Yunus in

the greater interest of the nation. BNP chairperson's Foreign Affairs Adviser Sabihuddin

Ahmed accompanied Fakhrul during the meeting.

The meeting was held at a time when the Grameen Bank Inquiry Commission formed by the government is planning to place a set of proposals for restructuring the microcredit organisation.

Shamsul said he found Nizami as chief of Al-Badr, an auxiliary force of the occupation Pakistani army, in newspapers in 1971. The proceeding was adjourned till July 7.


At a press conference in the capital's Crimes Reporters' Association office, Joshna Begum, an aunt of Rafiul Islam Raza, 21, and Mohammad Roni, 18, said the two went missing with two of their friends--Nizzol Ahmed, 21, and Nahim Ahmed, 21--from Lalbagh on April 25.

Nizzol and Nahim were found critically wounded after 20 and 26 days respectively in Narsingdi but her two nephews still remain missing, she said.

The four friends, all residents of Kalinganj in Keraniganj, went to Lalbagh to visit the fort. Quoting a shopkeeper in Lalbagh, Joshna said some

plain clothes men bundled the four into a microbus identifying them as "policemen".

Two separate general diaries (GDs) were filed with South Keraniganj Police Station on June 13 in connection with the disappearance of Raza and Roni.
