School students show mistakes in textbooks to education minister

Frustrated by the mistakes in his mathematics textbook, a class eight student boldly stepped up at a meeting in presence of the education minister yesterday to say that some answers in it were incorrect.

Taking up the meeting moderator's challenge to solve one problem, Arafat Hossain showed within minutes that his claim was true.

Some 56 school students hailing from the country's seven divisions attended the views-exchange meeting on primary and secondary level textbooks jointly organised by Campaign for Popular Education (CAMPE) and Manusher Jonno Foundation in the capital's Local Government Engineering Department.

Another class eight student, Sumaiya, found incorrect chemical equations in her chemistry book. Most students opined avoiding such mistakes and use of lucid language.

This year's textbooks contain several printing and technical mistakes "as it was a huge task" to introduce new curriculum in 111 textbooks and distribute those across the country, said Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid. Some 27 crore textbooks were published in 2012 for

Shibir cancels today's plan for countrywide hartal STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Islami Chhatra Shibir yesterday backed off from its plan to enforce a countrywide daylong shutdown today due to inclement weather and "examinations of the National University" The Jamaat-e-Islami

backed student body, however, gave a 72-hour ultimatum to the government to release its leaders, including Shibir President Delwar Hossain, and warned that if the leaders are not freed within the time, the organisation will go for tougher programmes including hartal from July 3.

Shibir, which had decided to enforce a shutdown today if their leaders were not freed by yesterday, said in a statement, "It has decided not to go ahead with the plan due to inclement weather and some scheduled examinations at the National University".

FOREIGN WORKERS IN SAUDI ARABIA

Projects to be delayed if amnesty deadline not extended: JCCI STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The Jeddah Chamber of Commerce and Industry (JCCI) has said numerous projects of Saudi Arabia, where migrant workers are employed, will be delayed if the kingdom does not extend the grace period allowing foreign workers to legalise their status beyond July 3. "All companies and establishments hurried to rectify

the status of their workers but many of these processes take a long time and there is crowding in all the related departments due to the grace period being so short, said Khalaf Al-Otaibi, member of the Industrial Committee in JCCI. JCCI urges authorities to extend the grace period at least

until the end of the current Hijri year (November 2013) reported Saudi Gazette from Jeddah yesterday. Meanwhile, the Saudi labour ministry on Wednesday proposed an extension of the July 3 deadline upon requests

from diplomats of a host of labour exporting nations. The amnesty declared early May allows irregular foreign workers, mostly employed in construction projects, to legalise their status, transfer jobs and professions or return home

without facing any penalty. The Saudi labour ministry says only 1.58 million of the irregular foreign workers were legalised while half of about eight million expatriates in the Kingdom need their status corrected.

According to officials, about three lakh of the five lakh irregular Bangladeshis in Saudi Arabia have to correct their status.

60 percent of healthcare cost Seminar told

Public bears

The fundamental constitutional right to healthcare services turns into a hollow promise as above 60 percent of the total healthcare cost come from the people's pockets, experts said yesterday.

In order to cope with that cost, families have to cut back on their other expenditures so much that they often fail to maintain their consumption of necessities, they told a seminar on universal health coverage at Brac Centre in the capital. Hossain Zillur Rahman,

executive chairman of Power and Participation Research Centre (PPRC), which organised the programme, said, "The poor become even poorer when they cover the healthcare expenses on their own." The reasons why people

have to spend so much on healthcare include low utilisation and poor performance of existing public healthcare infrastructure, high and irrational diagnostic costs, and absence of successful health insurance solutions, he said. At the seminar, Health Minister Dr AFM Ruhal
