Two JCD men confess to hurling bombs at Inu's house

COURT CORRESPONDENT

Two Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) activists yesterday confessed to their involvement in hurling crude bombs at the residence of Information Minister Hasanul Haq Inu in the capital's Mirpur on June 9.

In their confessional statements before a magistrate in Dhaka, Mahbubul Alam, 28, and Akil Mahmud, 32, said they had carried out the attack upon direction of the Dhaka north JCD president but they did not mention the leader's name, said court

The duo told the magistrate that they were given promise of higher positions in the organisation in exchange for carrying out the attack.

Metropolitan Magistrate Md Erfan Ullah recorded their statements separately between 12:00pm and 5:00pm. He later sent them to jail.

Inspector of Detective Branch of Police Nibaron Chandra Burman, investigation officer of the case, produced the JCD activists before the magistrate after four days of their remand, as the duo had agreed to narrate the incident.

During interrogation, they admitted their guilt and they agreed to give confessional statements before the magistrate, said Burman.

On June 25, police arrested the activists of ICD, a pro-BNP student body, on charges of hurling the bombs.

Detectives arrested Mahbubul Alam at Bailey Road and Akil Mahmud at Rupnagar in the capital. Police also recovered one of the two motorbikes used during the bombing.

Later in that day, a Dhaka court granted a seven-day remand for the duo.

77 percent schoolboys in Schoolboy found dead near hostel capital indulge in porn Says Manusher Jonno Foundation study

STAFF CORRESPONDENT Almost 77 percent of the male schoolchildren in Dhaka city are involved in watching, sharing and producing pornography

according to a study, said Abdullah Al Mamun, programme manager of the governance division of Manusher Jonno Foundation (MJF), in a seminar yesterday. Males of the age group of 12-25 were found to be most suscep-

tible to these activities, he added, citing the study done by MJF. "Girl children are often tricked or forced into being the sub-

jects of such material," said Mamun in his keynote address. In addition, children forced into prostitution are often also victims of the business of pornography, speakers discussed.

The seminar titled "Implementation of Optional Protocol to the UNCRC on the Sale of Children, Child Prostitution and Child Pornography: Role of Stakeholders" was held in the Biam auditorium.

"This issue remains unaddressed because the parents refuse to accept that their children may be involved," said Mahmudul Kabir, country director of Terre des Homes-Netherlands.

Meher Afroz Chumki, state minister for women and children affairs, said while such acts may be prevented using the Pornography Control Act activated last year, social awareness is a more effective way to deal with the issue.

The legal procedures to deal with children should be sensitised so as not to affect them negatively, recommended Abdullah Al-Mamun. Dr Mohammad Shahjahan, secretary general of the Bureau of Human Rights Bangladesh, spoke among others.

A residential class V student was found dead one kilometre off his school hostel in Mawna intersection area in Sreepur upazila Saturday night.

Family members alleged that teachers tortured Khokan Mia, 13, to death and dumped his body at Amtali Pukurpar to cover up the incident.

His body bears injury marks near the ear, said police. Khokan is the son of late Abdul Khalek and Maksuda Ahkter of Betjuri village, Sreepur. Maksuda filed a murder case against eight persons, including Principal of Mawna Public School and College Rawsan

Alam Rubel. Khokan used to reside on the third floor of the hostel. The teachers and the managing committee members have gone into hiding.

200 RMG workers fall sick Boy's body recovered

Drinking impure water might have caused illness

Around 200 workers of a RMG factory at Ashulia on the outskirts of Dhaka were hospitalised yesterday as they fell sick after drinking "contaminated" water.

The workers of The Rose Dresses Ltd -owned by Atiqul Islam, president of the Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association -- started to fall sick one after another around 9:30am after drinking the water supplied by the factory. "I have fallen sick after drinking con-

taminated water from the tap," Noyon Moni, a helper of sewing section, told a correspondent from Savar. The sick workers were whisked off to

nearby Enam Medical College Hospital, and the Centre for Women and Child Health with stomach disorder. Md Rafiqul Islam, chief operating officer of the CWCH, said 188 workers

were taken to their hospital. "Most of them complained of nausea. Some vomited, but none of the cases were serious," he said, adding, all left after receiv-

ing primary medical treatment. The authorities shut their production production on Saturday.
