**BNP leader stabbed, 1 held**

A BNP leader was stabbed by a gang at Mushribhujia Bazar under Bholahat upazila of the district on Saturday night. The victim, Mozammel Haque Chutu, 58, is general secretary of Bholahat upazila unit of the party. SM Abu Farhad, officer-in-charge (OC) of Bholahat Police Station quoted locals as saying that the gang led by Chhatra League activist Sohel stabbed Mozammel Haque Chutu while he was sitting at a tea stall at the bazaar at around 8:30pm. Locals rushed him to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital in a critical condition. Later, angry people set fire to Sohel's house at Mushribhujia village. Being informed, police rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control. They arrested Sohel, 22, at Poladanga village under the upazila early yesterday for his alleged involvement in this incident.

**Boy killed in wall collapse**

A teenage boy was killed in a mud wall collapse in Biral upazila of the district on Saturday night. The deceased was identified as Md Monjurul Islam, 13, son of Md Nur Islam of Kanaibari village in the upazila. Locals said Monjurul sustained injuries when a mud wall adjacent to their cattle shed collapsed on him at around 8:30pm. He was taken to Dinajpur Medical College and Hospital where the doctor declared him dead.

**Pistol found in train**

A pistol was found in a Khulna-bound intercity train at Joypurhat Railway Station on Saturday night. Acting on a tip-off, a team of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) raided Simanta Express at the station at around 10:30pm. The elite force searched the train and found the pistol in a compartment. They later deposited the gun to Joypurhat Police Station.

**Contractor murdered**

A contractor was murdered at Udoypur-Dhanbaria village under Sadar upazila. Yesterday. The dead was identified as Sultan Ahmed, 38, son of Khandakar Abdul Mojib of ChotoKamarkundo village under the same upazila. He was a contractor in the town. Victim's brother Jafar said another contractor named Chanchal Hossain called his brother out of his house over cellphone at around 5:30 pm on Saturday and since then he had been missing. Locals found his body in a sack on a cropland at Udoypur-Dhanbaria village yesterday morning. Being informed, police went to the spot and recovered the body which bore injury marks.

**HEAVY RAIN, TIDAL SURGES DAMAGE DYKES**

**50 Patuakhali villages go under water**

Over 50 villages in different areas under Patuakhali district have gone under water as flood control embankments at different places in Kalapara, Dashmina and Galachipa upazilas got damaged due to pressure from tidal surges during the last several days.

Incessant rainfall for a week worsened the situation.

Local met office recorded about 400 MM rainfall in last three days in Patuakhali district.

During the last three days, tidal surges washed away at least 500 feet embankment areas on the bank of Ramnabad River in Sudhirpur and Nizampur areas under Kalapara upazila.

Water entering through the damaged portions submerged at least eight villages in Lalua union under Kalapara upazila during high tides.

Dakkin Debpur village in Dhankhali union under the same upazila is also flooded as the local dyke collapsed at four places.

At least 20 villages

including Syedjafor, Auliapur, Char Ghunee, Bashmaria, Ambaria, Dhodonia, Char Botham, Char Symon, Char Hadi, Char Shahjalal got flooded as dyke collapsed at different points on the bank of Buragourngo and Tentulia rivers in Dashmina upazila.

Over 20,000 people of around 4,000 families have been affected as water entered the villages through the breached dykes, keeping the villages under water for the last four days, said Md Nazrul Islam, former member of Dashmina union

parishad.

"Local farmers are worried about their aman cultivation as the seedbeds have gone under water. Besides, fishes from different ponds and ghers (enclosures) have been washed away due to heavy rainfall and tidal surges," he said.

Md Delwar Hossain, executive engineer of Water Development Board in Patuakhali, said, "We are measuring the areas of damaged dykes to send an estimate to the higher authorities concerned for repairing them as soon as possible."

**Indefinite transport strike in Rajshahi division starts today**

Transport workers will enforce an indefinite strike in Rajshahi division from today to press home their 10-point demand.

The demands include immediate issuance of appointment letters to the transport workers, enhancement of monthly salary, issuance of driving licence on easy terms, ban on plying of Nasimon and Karimon on highways, removal of roadside markets, and an end to harassment in the name of police checking on the roads and highways.

At a press conference held at Bogra Press Club on June 27, Kamal Hossain Robi, secretary of the regional committee of Bangladesh Sarak Paribahan Sramik Federation, threatened to go on an indefinite strike from

July 1 if their demands were not met by June 30.

He also accused the authorities concerned of harassing the truckers on different bridges in the name of checking and demanded immediate steps to stop illegal toll collection on Singra, Dinajpur and Mohananda bridges.

Abdul Latif, president of Rajshahi Regional Committee of Bangladesh Sarak Paribahan Sramik Federation, said they will go on an indefinite strike from 6:00am today as the authorities concerned have failed to meet the 10-point demand within the deadline.

"We will continue strike in all eight districts of the division until the demands are met," said Latif, also the president of bogra district Motor Owners' Samity.

**ATTACKS ON COPS, POLICE STATION**

**55 Jhalakathi BNP men charge sheeted**

Police yesterday pressed charges against 55 BNP men in two cases for attack on cops and vandalising Rajapur Police Station on June 22.

Officer-in-Charge of Rajapur Police Station, also the investigation officer (IO) of the cases, submitted the charge-sheets to the Judicial Magistrate's Court, Jhalakathi.

After investigation, the investigation officer dropped the names of two accused mentioned in first investigation report (FIR) from the charge sheets as their involvement was not found.

He, however, said that charges were pressed against seven other BNP men as investigation found their involvement in the incidents.

"We prepared the charge sheets after watching video footage and photos taken by Journalists during the incidents," said Md Mohidul

Islam, additional superintendent of police.

Following a clash with cops, BNP men attacked Rajapur Police Station and vandalised its windows and a motorbike on June 22. The clash ensued as police intercepted a BNP procession at Rajapur Jail Road at around 6:00pm on the day.

As part of a countrywide demonstration, Rajapur upazila unit of the BNP organised a rally at the party office at bypass intersection of the upazila headquarters.

Though they were allowed to hold the rally, BNP men took out a procession. When the procession reached Rajapur Jail Road, police intercepted it, said SI Azizul, adding that local Jubo Dal leader Nasim had threatened him to leave the place.

Being refused, the BNP men attacked the police personnel. They hurled brickbats at police, leaving at least four of them injured. Two separate cases were filed with police station the same day.

**UNREST CONTINUES**

**BCL enforces indefinite class boycott at PUST**

Bangladesh Chhatra League yesterday enforced an indefinite class boycott in Pabna University of Science of Technology (PUST) demanding removal of the university proctor.

Earlier on June 22, the university authorities suspended classes till June 24 as activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) and Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) got locked in a clash.

Later the university opened on June 26 but the teachers boycotted classes on June 26 and 27 protest-

ing assault of a teacher of the institution.

After a week-long suspension of classes, academic activities of the university resumed yesterday but the BCL leaders asked the teachers to leave the classes.

BCL also announced continued class boycott until the proctor is removed.

"The proctor organises the JCD and Shibir in the university. The students have continued demanding removal of the proctor for long but the university authority have not taken any step. As a result JCD and Shibir got organised to

create violence in the campus," said Mizanur Rahman Sabuj, convener of the PUST unit of BCL.

"If the university authority does not take step in this regard we will continue agitation," he added.

Contacted, Md Kamruzzaman, proctor of the university, termed the students' agitation as unreasonable.

Denying the BCL's allegation against him, the proctor said, "We try to maintain peaceful atmosphere in the university. I do not side with any group."

**AL man hacked to death after BNP supporter shot**

The supporters of BNP hacked to death an Awami League (AL) activist, apparently in retaliation to causing fatal bullet injuries to a BNP man in Alokballi union under Narsingdi Sadar upazila yesterday.

The deceased is Liakat Ali, 65, father of Billal Hossain, president of Alokballi union unit of Jubo League, while the critically injured BNP supporter is Khorshed Mian, 55.

There was a longstanding feud between BNP supporter Mizan, and AL supporter Shaheb, both members of the local union parishad, over domination in the area, said Md Asaduzzaman, officer in

charge of Narsingdi Model Police Station.

Following an altercation between supporters of the two rivals, AL men shot Khorshed Mian, a supporter of Mizan, yesterday morning.

Critically injured Khorshed was admitted to Narsingdi Sadar Hospital from where he was sent to Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

As a rumour of his death spread in the area, Mizan's supporters attacked the houses of their opponents.

Liakat Ali was brutally hacked to death during the incident.

A tense situation is prevailing in the area.

A good number of policemen have been deployed there to avert any untoward incident.

**PBCP leader abducted**

A leader of Parbatya Bangalee Chhatra Parishad (PBCP) was allegedly abducted by criminals from Ramasa Bazaar area under Guimara Police Station of Matiranga upazila on Saturday.

The victim, Mohammad Haider Ali, 20, is general secretary of PBCP Guimara thana unit.

Family members lodged a general diary (GD) with Guimara Police Station the same day, stating that Jahangir was picked up by a gang from the market at around 9:00am.

Contacted, Officer In-Charge Bashir Ahmad of the police station said they have

launched a drive to rescue the PBCP leader.

In a press release issued yesterday, Masum Rana, general secretary of PBCP Khagrachhari district unit, said the cadres of United People's Democratic Front (UPDF) abducted Haider (UPDF) abducted Haider. He demanded immediate release of the PBCP leader.

Refuting the allegation, UPDF Press and Information Secretary Niran Chakma said PBCP blamed his party for the incident to incite communal tension in the area.

On June 17, Guimara thana Awami League President Jahangir Alam was abducted by UPDF cadres. They released Jahangir on June 22 in exchange for ransom.
