### Illegal kitchen market persists Repatriate Rohingyas on Uttara footpath HELEMUL ALAM paid officials of Dhaka North City Fasiullah said the shortage of kitchen

Despite being removed several times since it was established during the last caretaker government, an illegal kitchen market has been running on the footpath of Jasim Uddin Road at the capital's Uttara Sector-1. The market stretching around 150

metres on the road's southern side was set up by shop owners who were earlier evicted from the footpaths near the DIT market of Uttara Sector-6, according to locals. "Jashim Uddin Kantchabazar" is

being run by a group of people who call themselves members of the community police. They also erected a signboard at the illegal market site reading "Community Policing Unit-2, Airport Police Station".

Benozir Ahmed Belayet, general secretary of the unit, said the owners of the 80 shops running business on the footpath were members of the community police.

Locals say in order to operate the sector-6 and sector-11. unauthorised market, the shop owners

Corporation (DNCC), police and local goons. They use the signboard of the community police to get some advantage, they add. Benozir, however, denied bribing

anyone and said they collected money from people who rented or owned the shops to pay the salaries of five security guards and a cleaner dedicated for the market. He added that as they did not get salary from the government as members of the community police, they ran the market.

A shop owner said Tk 20 to Tk 100 was collected from his shop every day.

Although there is a shortage of kitchen markets in Uttara, no illegal market is acceptable, said Hasan Zoberi, a resident of Jasim Uddin Road.

According to a former official of Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk), every sector in Uttara needs a kitchen market. So far 14 sectors of Uttara have been developed, but the authorities constructed only two kitchen markets--in

markets was created because Rajuk did not keep any place for kitchen markets during its development. Rajuk Chairman Nurul Huda recog-

nised that some necessary civic facilities like kitchen markets and graveyards were absent in the planning of Uttara. Fasiullah said DNCC had already

conducted two drivers against the illegal markets in Uttara but they returned again. He said it was not possible for them to monitor it round the clock. "We are considering giving them

(Jashim Uddin market) scope to continue the business at the place by charging toll to bring it into a system, but we will not give them any allotment or lease."

Officer-in-Charge of Airport Police Station Shamsuddin Saleh Ahmed Chowdhury said there was no relation with the community police and the illegal market, and trashed accusations of taking bribe from the market shop owners.

# Dipu Moni urges Myanmar DIPLOMATIC CORRESPONDENT

Bangladesh has offered to cooperate with Myanmar to promote socio-economic development in Myanmar, including in the Rakhine State, and urged authorities to resume voluntary repatriation of Rohingya refugees. Foreign Minister Dipu Moni made the offer during a

bilateral meeting with Myanmar Foreign Minister Wunna Maung Lwin on the sidelines of the 20th ASEAN Regional Forum Ministerial Meeting in Brunei yesterday. She stressed the need for addressing the citizenship issue

of the Muslim minorities in Rakhine State and urged the Myanmar authorities to resume voluntary repatriation of Myanmar refugees in Bangladesh. In response, the Myanmar foreign minister said the Myanmar government would actively consider resuming the

repatriation process of the refugees already verified last year. He said the process could start once the housing and relocation of the Muslim minority people currently residing in makeshift camps in the Rakhine State were completed.

Dipu Moni hoped that Bangladesh and Myanmar would be able to resolve this outstanding issue in the spirit of good neighbourly relations existing between the two countries. Dhaka also proposed Naypyidaw launch a bilateral

security dialogue to discuss the entire gamut of security related issues, including information about criminal networks and activities. The Myanmar foreign minister assured of further follow

up on Bangladesh's proposal to establish an institutional mechanism to enhance dialogue between the two border security forces.

# CTG ARMS HAUL CASES IO denies torturing accused for confession

The lastest and fifth investigation officer (IO) in the Chittagong arms haul cases yesterday denied physically torturing an accused and threatening to kill him in crossfire during interrogation for forcing him to confess his involvement in the 2004 arms smuggling.

The IO Md Moniruzzaman, additional superintendent of police of the Criminal Investigation Department, denied this while being cross-examined at Chittagong Metropolitan Special Tribunal-1.

Advocate Abul Hasan Shahabuddin, defence lawyer for former field officer of National Security Intelligence (NSI) Akbar Hossain Khan, told the IO that during his seven day remand in Dhaka from April 27, 2009, Akbar was tortured with his eyes

blindfolded and hands handcuffed behind his back from midnight to dawn every day.

He was also left hanging from a moving ceiling fan at night and was given electric shock in the daytime during the remand period, the lawyer claimed.


Moniruzzaman denied doing both of

these things. The lawyer also alleged that the IO took signatures of Akbar on nine white sheets during the remand, and later a magistrate wrote dictation of the IO on the papers to produce those as Akbar's confessional statements under section 164.

The IO said it was not true.

On April 2, 2004, around 1,500 wooden boxes containing huge arms and ammunition were seized from two vessels at the jetty of Chittagong Urea Fertiliser Ltd (CUFL).
