\$890,000 Chinese stamp

One of China's rarest stamps sold for HK\$6.9 million (\$890,000) at auction in Hong Kong, the auctioneers said yesterday.

With just 32 recorded copies, the Qing Dynasty "1897 Red Revenue Small One Dollar" stamp is "China's rarest regularlyissued stamp", Interasia Auctions said in a press release.

The bright red stamp, symbolising luck and good fortune in Chinese culture, is rare because the characters "Qing Dynasty postal service, one dollar" were considered too small, prompting the printing of a second version.
