# 11,000-strong law enforcers to maintain peace in polls

More than 11,000 law enforcers including members of Border Guard Bangladesh and Rab have been deployed to ensure safe and peaceful conduct of voting in the first Gazipur City Corporation election today.

The mayoral election in Gazipur, the biggest city corporation in size, came to greater focus after all the pro-government candidates had miserably lost to their opposition-backed rivals in the last month's polls in Barisal, Khulna, Rajshahi

## All eyes on Gazipur

Govt, opposition face off in crucial polls today

In a crucial battle of pride for the Awami League and the BNP, Gazipur city goes to polls to pick its mayor and councillors today, just a few months ahead of the general election.

Although non-partisan in nature, today's city election has already influenced the national politics as archrivals AL and BNP have been campaigning hard to secure the mayoral office.

In the campaign trails, the two parties

employed their full strength engaging their central leaders, MPs and even ministers.

Winning the polls will boost the winning camp and help challenge its rival in the coming days.

For the mayoral office, Ajmat Ullah Khan is running with AL support and MA Mannan with BNP backing. Five other candidates are also vying for the post but they are not seen as frontrunners.

## AL, BNP leaders in war of words

As the main opposition BNP keeps accusing the government of plotting to rig tomorrow's Gazipur city polls, the ruling Awami League insists the party will do nothing to mar the successes of elections held during its tenure.

BNP acting secretary general Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir yesterday alleged the government, apart from dishing out crores of black money, had assembled listed criminals in Gazipur from outside the country and as it has a "blueprint to rig the voting".
