# 4 hurt as DU, Tejgaon College students clash

day afternoon when students of the college and Dhaka University clashed in phases in the capital's Farmgate following altercations. The clash also caused traffic congestion in the area.

At least four students of Tejgaon College were injured yester-

All the injured, who were admitted to a private hospital, are activists of Tejgaon College unit of Bangladesh Chhatra League, claimed students of the college.

The clash broke out at around 3:45pm when some Tejgaon College students wanted to board a bus carrying Dhaka University students, said Amjad Ali, the university's acting proctor.

As they were prevented from boarding the bus, enraged college students vandalised the bus, said a witness.

Shortly two other buses of Dhaka University arrived at the spot and the students got off the buses and attacked the college, he added.

They hurled brick chips at the Tejgaon College, shattering glasses up to its third floor, he further said.

When Tejgaon College students came out of their classes to retaliate, police fired at least five rounds of blank shots and three rounds of teargas shells to disperse the unruly students, said Biplob Kumar Sarkar, deputy commissioner of Tejgaon Division of Dhaka Metropolitan Police. Panic gripped the usually bustling area as pedestrians ran amok.

# Results show govt's popularity loss

Speakers tell BBC Bangladesh Sanglap

The defeat of the Awami League-backed mayoral candidates in the five recent city corporation elections has indicated a serious decline in government's popularity, majority of the audience members viewed at BBC Bangladesh Sanglap yesterday. Shipping Minister Shajahan Khan, however, differed,

saying government's popularity would be justified through the results of the upcoming parliamentary election. "The government is not worried because the voters will consider national issues in the national election. And the

government has many successes in national issues," he said at the dialogue in the capital's Biam auditorium. BNP Vice Chairman Abdullah Al Noman said the voters had rejected the AL-backed candidates because they had lost

faith in the government due to corruption, nepotism, loot-

ing and politicisation of law enforcement agencies. "It's a message," he added. Dhaka University teacher Dr Shafiul Alam Bhuiyan and ActionAid Country Director Farah Kabir viewed that the government had failed to fulfil some electoral pledges but said it was

difficult to tie the dip in its popularity to the candidates' defeat. Farah Kabir said the price hike of essentials and electricity and deterioration of the law and order situation might have

impacted the decision-making of the voters. Both the panellists and the speakers from the audience dismissed that the sinking popularity was a result of the AL "ignoring" Jatiya Party.

The participants and the panellists also talked of the state's injustice towards college student Limon Hossain which, an audience member feared, might influence the Abdullah Harun Chowdhury young voters' decision-making in the next general election.

#### Plan for Rampal power plant opposed

Speakers at a seminar yesterday demanded that the government refrains from constructing the coal-based thermal power plant in Rampal upazila of Bagerhat, near the Sundarbans.

They emphasised conducting an international **Environment Impact** Assessment and making public the project's details to assess its positive and negative aspects. The seminar, "Rampal coal-based power plant project's impact on the Sundarbans and environment", was organised by the National Committee to Protect Oil, Gas, Mineral Resources, Power and Ports in Khulna Press Club.

The government signed an agreement with India's state-run National Thermal Power Corporation on January 2012 to set up the 1,300-megwatt plant at Rampal, 14 kilometres

away from the Sundarbans. The committee Member Secretary Prof Anu Muhammad and Prof were present.

## Freedom fighter 'commits suicide'

A freedom fighter allegedly committed suicide in Chaktai area of Chittagong city yesterday.

Police recovered Arun's body hanging from the ceiling in his rented house, said Talat Mahmud, sub-inspector of Bakalia Police Station.

The reason behind the death could not

"We freed the country through the War of Liberation. But I became defeated in the struggles of my life. None is responsible for my death," was written in the diary.

The incident might have occurred between 9:00am and 5:00pm yesterday, the SI said.
