Bangladesh set to join elusive club of 28 GM crop growing countries



- Traditional brinjal is very vulnerable to pests. Excessive use of pesticides by farmers poses health hazards
- Genetically modified brinjal is infused with a bacterial gene that destroys pests. No pesticide is needed.
- Anti-GM activists say govt is not sharing test results; farmers will have to buy seeds from multinationals
- Scientists/regulators say there will be public consultation before its release; farmers will be able to use its seeds

Bangladeshi scientists have readied the country's first genetically modified (GM) crop -- brinjal infused with pestresistant genes -- that will see a drastic fall in the use of harmful pesticides in the crop. Bangladesh Agricultural Research

Institute (Bari) will apply to the National Technical Committee for Crop Biotechnology on Sunday for its release next month, said officials concerned.

Once cleared, the GM crop will go through a bio-safety regulatory process and public consultation before its release, they said.

Of all vegetables produced in the

country, brinjal tops the list in terms of pesticide use.

Fruit and shoot borer (FSB), considered the most devastating pest in South and Southeast Asia, ravages brinjal fields and can cause loss of the crop by as much as 70 percent unless a heavy dose of pesticide is used.


