RMG workers stage demo

50 hurt in clash with cops

Garment workers yesterday staged demonstrations at three points in Gazipur district over several issues, including a pay hike, which was followed by clashes with law enforcers and production suspension.

At least 50 people with 12 policemen were injured in a clash between police and garment workers at Panisail on the Kaliakoir-Nabinagar highway.

Around 10:00am, workers blocked the road in protest against the shutdown of Machhihata Sweater Factory.

The demonstration was a sequel to Thursday's incident when a group of employees of the factory beat up an official following an altercation over their demand for a pay hike, said Shah Mohammad, an assistant sub-inspector of Gazipur Industrial Police. The workers had been agitating for higher pay for the last three weeks.

Thursday's incident prompted an announcement through which the factory was closed for an indefinite period. Enraged by this, around 4,000 workers, including

emplyees of adjacent factory units, blocked the highway yesterday for about two and a half hours, local people said. They also broke down glasses of at least 15 factories.

Clashes took place when police tried to move them from

Mass promotion in civil administration

200 deputy secretaries to become joint secretaries

The government is set to give promotion to around 200 deputy secretaries to the rank of joint secretary this week although the number of joint secretaries has already doubled the approved 250 posts.

The Ministry of Public Administration last week sent a summary to the Prime Minister's Office containing names of the officials to be promoted.

"The summary did not get the nod as the prime minister was on an overseas trip. It is expected to be approved soon," said a senior official of the ministry asking not to be identified.

The seven Bangladeshi crew members, who had been abducted from a sinking vessel off Somali coast on July 7, are alive and have been shifted to another hijacked fishing boat by pirates, claims the govern-

According to the foreign ministry, the update has been primarily confirmed through London-based Maritime Piracy and Humanitarian Response Programme (MPHRP) that contacted sources in the UN office for Somalia, Nairobi.

In a press release the foreign ministry yesterday said it had learnt that the Bangladeshi crew members of the Malaysian flag vessel MV Albedo that reportedly sank on July 7 off the coast of Somalia were on board before the ship had capsized.


Russia faces US wrath


Russia yesterday faced stark warnings from the United States against granting asylum to fugitive US leaker Edward Snowden after he broke three weeks of silence to tell activists he wanted sanctuary in the country.

In an indication that already tense US-Russia ties could strain further over the affair, the White House warned Russia not to grant Snowden a "propaganda platform" as top allies of President Vladimir Putin argued he should be given sanctuary.

US President Barack Obama spoke to Putin by telephone Friday on issues including the Snowden affair, the Kremlin and White House both said, but no further details were forthcoming. The Obama-Putin call had been scheduled for several
