

## Too eager for Savar posting

The police stations at Savar and Ashulia on the outskirts of Dhaka are in high demand among police personnel as posting to the industrial zone opens up opportunities to make money from extortion.

Different sources in the police department say police personnel at different tiers usually spend a huge amount of money to get postings to these two police stations.

Once they get a posting, they try to recoup the amount by extorting, the sources added.

Allegations also run rife that Officer-in-Charge Mostafa Kamal has allegedly paid Tk 30 lakh to get his posting at Savar Police Station.

Mostafa, however, denied the allegation brought against

He said, "I joined Ashulia Police Station in 2009 as subinspector, was promoted to Inspector as OC (investigation) in 2011, and later posted to Savar Police Station."

Meanwhile, the custodial death of businessman Shamim Sarkar, who died in police custody a day after police picked him up from an area under Savar Police Station on June 5, has opened up a wide array of crimes committed by the police in a desperate bid to earn money through illegal channels, which substantiates the version of the police

## ME peace talks may resume

Israel to free Palestinians as 'gesture' for talks after Kerry efforts break deadlock

Israel yesterday announced it will release some Palestinian prisoners as a "gesture", after the two sides agreed to lay the groundwork to resume peace negotiations frozen for three

Some of those to be released have been held in Israeli prisons for decades, Israeli Intelligence Minister Yuval Steinitz told public radio.

His announcement came hours after US Secretary of State John Kerry said on Friday that Israeli and Palestinian negotiators had agreed to meet to pave the way for a resumption of direct peace talks.

The last round of direct talks broke down in 2010 over the issue of Israeli settlements in the West Bank and east Jerusalem.

Kerry gave away very little detail of the agreement, which came after he spent four days consulting the Israeli and Palestinian leadership.

Just minutes before boarding a plane to fly home from Jordan, Kerry told reporters both sides had reached "an agreement that establishes a basis for resuming direct final SEE PAGE 2 COL 5

#### Bangladeshi shot dead in South Africa

Criminals shot dead a Bangladeshi national in Johannesburg of South Africa early yesterday.

The victim was identified as Taj Uddin, 32, son of Syed Ahmed of Mahatabpur village under Companiganj upazila of Noakhali district.

Taj, father of a son, used to run a crockery shop in Johannesburg, said his family members.

Raihan Islam, brother of the victim, said, "A gang of criminals were demanding money from Taj as extortion for the last couple of days."

Failing to get the money, the criminals had opened fire on Taj at his shop about 6:00am, leaving him dead on the spot, Raihan added.

The International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea (ITLOS) has appointed Jean-Pierre Cot as arbitrator to settle the maritime border dispute between Bangladesh and India.

The president of the tribunal appointed him to the arbitral court on Thursday following consultations with the two parties. A French professor of international law and a judge at the tribunal, Cot has replaced Tullio Treves (Italy), who resigned the five-member court.
