On information, police recovered the decomposed body. An unnatural death case was filed.


Presidency University celebrates 10th founding anniversary

Hand over charges to four new city mayors soon: Moudud

BNP standing committee member Moudud Ahmed yesterday asked the government to hand over the charges to the newly elected mayors and councillors of four city corporations immediately.

He made the comments as the government said the new mayors, who were sworn in at Prime Minister's Office Sunday, would take office after terms of their predecessors ended.

None of the previous four mayors' five-year tenure will end until at least one month later, said a new mayor.

Moudud yesterday paid homage to former president Ziaur Rahman at his grave in the capital with the four new mayors--Ariful Haque Chowdhury of Sylhet, M Moniruzzaman Moni of Khulna, Ahsan Habib Kamal of Barisal, Mosaddek Hossain Bulbul of Rajshahi. He, however, said, "The BNP is happy, as the prime minister administrated the oath to the mayors."

Secretary to the Local Government Division Abu Alam Md Shaheed Khan said handing over charges to the new mayors before end of the previous mayors' tenures would be a violation of the City Corporation Act 2009.

Ticfa signing within few weeks: Dan Mozena

UNB, Dhaka

The much talked-about Trade and Investment Cooperation Framework Agreement (Ticfa), aimed at boosting bilateral trade and investment between Bangladesh and the USA, is likely to be signed within the next few weeks, US Ambassador in Dhaka Dan Mozena said yesterday.

He said this while talking to reporters after a meeting with Foreign Secretary M Shahidul Haque at the foreign ministry.

On June 17, the cabinet approved the draft of the Ticfa, a legally "nonbinding" agreement that emphasises prohibition of protectionist trade policy.

The US envoy also talked about issues relating to the Generalised System of Preference (GSP), connectivity, Rohingya and the foreign secretary's recent visit to Myanmar. Mozena said the US wanted good relations between Bangladesh and Myanmar.

Responding to a question on the Grameen Bank issue, he said there had been many successes that the bank carried and everybody would have to be careful about its future. The US expects that an acceptable managing director will be appointed for the Grameen Bank, he added.

Shahidul Haque said no date was fixed for signing the Ticfa.

The US envoy also met State Minister for Women and Children Affairs Meher Afroze Chumki at her office and discussed issues of the GSP, women's empowerment, child mortality and RMG sector.

At the meeting, Mozena said the US would work with Bangladesh to make its ready-made garment (RMG) No 1 brand in the world if Bangladesh could prevent accidents like Rana Plaza.

Meher Afroze said cancellation of the GSP facilities for Bangladesh would hamper women's empowerment in the country.

The public sector must reduce migration costs and ensure safe work environments abroad for Bangladeshi workers, said Foreign Minister Dipu Moni yesterday.


"The government is always concerned to protect the rights of migrant workers. So, the private sector must be alert over any form of malpractice in sending workers abroad," she said.
