## if govt loses more land Land minister cautions DCs

The government will take necessary action against responsible officials if it loses any of its land properties by losing the ongoing cases in court due to their negligence or poor performance, Land Minister Rezaul Karim Hira said yesterday.

The government will make its custodian concerned responsible if any government land, canal, river or wetland is found to be registered as private property, he said, while delivering his speech at the deputy commissioners' conference in the capital. "You are the owner of the government's land. If you cannot protect the land, how would you hold your post?" the minister asked the DCs.

In recent years, the government had to hand over many of its valuable properties to grabbers in compliance with court's directions as the officials did not act properly to protect the lands, Hira said. "Being the land minister, it is not pleasing for me to see the government losing its land."

The minister also said every day newspapers were publishing reports of corruptions and harassment of the people in land-related issues. "You have to think why you cannot curb those corruptions and provide better services to the people," he said, as all those officials involved in corruptions at district level or bellow worked under the DC.

The minister said the DCs had multiple tasks to do, but the land related activities should get priority. "Otherwise, the law and order situation of the society will be deteriorated centering the land disputes."

The DCs requested that his ministry take necessary steps regarding issues including lack of proper laws for the agricultural land protection and lack of fund related to vested property return act, among others.

#### Nahid laments inadequacy of university based research

Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid yesterday said the country was lagging behind due to the inadequacy of university based research which was a pre-requisite for the

#### Officials to be punished Convicted war criminals to lose voting rights the Bangladesh Collaborators Order, 1972 STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The Election Commission has decided to exclude from the national voter list the names of convicts who were sentenced by the International Crimes Tribunals or found guilty under Bangladesh Collaborators Order, 1972.

The commission has prepared a proposal to amend the Electoral Roll Act, 2009 in which the new provisions have been incorporated, Election Commissioner Shah Nawaz told reporters at the Election Commission (EC) Secretariat yesterday.

"The name of a person will be excluded from the electoral roll or will not be included in the voter list if he or she is found guilty under

(now abolished) or convicted by any national or international tribunal or court under International Crimes (Tribunals) Act, 1973 for committing any war time offence," he said. The proposed Electoral Roll Act (amend-

ment), 2013 will be sent to the law ministry, after which it will be passed in parliament, the commissioner said. After dropping the names of the war crimi-

nals and collaborators, the government would take decision whether their citizenship would stay or not, said the commissioner. Last month, the EC received a list of 47

#### teachers threaten blockade during post-Eid rush STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Teachers and employees of secondary and higher secondary educational institutions, which are not on the monthly pay order (MPO) list, yesterday threatened to launch a 72-hour road, rail and waterway blockade on August 12 if their institutions are not enlisted for the benefits by Eid-ul-Fitr.

They raised the demand at a press briefing at Dhaka Reporters Unity in the capital, organised by Non-MPO Shikkha Pratishthan Shikkhak Karmachari Oikya Jote.

"August 12 coincides with the time when people will start rushing back to the cities from their home districts after having celebrated Eid-ul-Fitr. If we are not enlisted for the MPO by the Eid, the government runs the risk of leaving thousands stranded without transports," said Md Esharat Ali, president of the association.


The blockade will begin from 6:00am, he added.

Teachers and employees of schools, colleges, madrasas and technical institutions entitled to MPO receive the same amount of basic pay as their government counterparts.

Esharat Ali claimed that around 1.15 lakh teachers and employees did not get regular pay because their institutions were not on the MPO list. The teachers declared

that all non-MPO institutions will remain shut from August 25 and the teachers will stage a sit-in in front of the capital's Jatiya Press Club from that day if the demand is still unmet.


