A mother killed her two sons by throwing them into a pond following a family feud at Alia village in Nasirnagar upazila of the district early yesterday.

The deceased siblings are Samrat, 4, and one-year-old Tajin. Their father Akbar Ali works at a private firm in Chittagong.

Police and locals said the tragic incident occurred following an altercation between Rumena Begum and her mother-in-law over a family matter after sehri.

As Rumena started crying, saying that she had thrown her two sons into the nearby pond, neighbours rushed in and recovered the bodies of the two A felled chambol tree on Adhajhurifrom the pond.

Hide market poses serious health hazards to 3,500 families

A more than half centuryold hide market in a densely populated area in the district town has been spreading stench and filth, posing serious health hazards to some 3,500 families.

Local residents said waste from the hide market at Ramnagar, around 2.5km away from Deputy Commissioner Office, have polluted drinking water sources as saline water used to wash hide drains out to ponds and canals.

Living in the area has become next to impossible as stink from the market hovers in the air in the local-

They said the market was shifted to its present site Lalbagh area back in 1950, and since then the market gradually expanded allowing hide traders from 13 upazilas of the district to buy and sell raw animal skins here.

At last 30 warehouses have been built in the market to store the hides, which continuously spread bad smell often causing breathing difficulties.

'It is tough to breathe here, but we have been forced to live in this way," said Md. Shamsul Haque, a shopkeeper of the area.

Waterlogging spoils seedbeds as sluice gates kept shut

Same old tale of illegal shrimp cultivation

Heavy rainfall following cyclone Mahasen on May 16 and tidal surges create water logging on the agricultural land in the Char Lata but stagnant water cannot recede as Zahid Hossain and his men keep the sluice gates closed for shrimp cultivation, local farmers said. "We went to local leaders

Local farmers fear setback demanding step to open the

sluice gates but in vain," said Zafor Mridha, a farmer.

"Aman cultivation this season has become uncertain as seedlings have already rotten due to waterlogging for long," said Feroz Chowkider, a farmer of the char.

Several other farmers including Delwar Hossain, Fazlur Rahman, Babul Mridha, Moni Chowkider and Akkas Boyatee expressed similar concern.
