Jubo League leader shot at AL leader Henry's Sirajganj house

Victim's cousin arrested

A Jubo League leader was bullet hit during a clash with his cousin at the residence of central Awami League (AL) leader Jannat Ara Talukder Henry in Sirajganj town on Wednesday night.

The victim - Md Selim Ahmed, 40, organising secretary of Sirajganj district unit of Jubo League, also a panel mayor of Sirajganj municipality, is undergoing treatment in Sirajganj Sadar Hospital.

Selim Ahmed and his cousin Mamunur Rashid had a long standing family feud, said police and locals.

On Wednesday night, Mamun along with Selim's younger brother Dulal went

to the residence of Henry, forest and environment affairs secretary of AL central committee, to seek her help to settle their feud concerning landed property.

Being informed, Selim along with fellows rushed to Henry's residence when a clash erupted.

Selim was bullet-hit during the incident, police said, adding that a stutter gun was seized from the spot.

Aggrieved Jubo League men besieged Henry's residence. Later police removed them.

Selim filed a case yesterday morning accusing his cousin Mamunur Rashid, Jannat Ara Talukder Henry and her husband Shamim

Talukder Labu. Police arrested Mamun.

Meanwhile, Labu filed another case against Selim and his fellows on charge of extortion and ransacking the house.

"Selim and his fellows attacked my residence and demanded money on the occasion of Eid. As I declined to meet the demand they vandalised my residence," Labu told this correspondent.

Contacted, officer in charge of Sirajganj Police station Md Rafikul Islam said, "The clash occurred as sequel to a long standing family feud between Selim and Mamun. Police is investigating the matter."

Stalkers attack houses, injure four in Noakhali

A gang of stalkers attacked four houses at Shankarpur village in Chatkhil upazila of the district early yesterday, leaving four people injured.

The injured, Md Harun, 14, Abul Hossain, 35, Md Aziz, 25, and Anawara 60, were admitted to the upazila

health complex and Noakhali Medical College Hospital.

Police quoted locals as saying that students of Khilpara High School had an altercation with local youths Anu, Karim, Manik, Jasim and Kanu over teasing some girls of the school on Monday.

As a sequel to the incident, a gang of criminals swooped on four houses at

Shankarpur village adjacent to the school at around 2:00am, they said, adding that the gang vandalised the houses, looted valuables and injured the four.

As villagers rushed to the spot and put up resistance to the criminals, they fled the scene, firing gunshot and blasting crackers.

49 Jamaat-Shibir men land in jail

A Sirajganj court on Tuesday rejected bail prayers of 49 Jamaat-Shibir men in a case for vandalising Awami League office at Enayetpur in the district on March 3. Judge Sadia Begum of the Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court passed the order, court sources said.

Earlier, the High Court granted bail to the accused, asking them to appear before a lower court. Rashedul Islam, general secretary of Enayetpur unit of the ruling Awami League, filed the case on March 12, accusing the 49 Jamaat activists of vandalising the AL office during country-wide dawn-to-dusk shutdown on March 3.

Tea saplings destroyed

Criminals destroyed around 33,000 tea saplings at Moinaguri Tea Company Ltd at Shalbahon village in Tentulia upazila of Panchagarh district on Wednesday. Company sources said 35,000 tea saplings worth Tk 2 lakh were brought to the tea estate on Tuesday for planting. Of them, 2,000 samplings were planted on the day while the rest kept in the garden area. Tea workers said unknown criminals destroyed the saplings in the early hours of Wednesday.

Indian goods seized

UNB, Dhaka

Members of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) seized huge smuggled Indian goods worth Tk 13.79 lakh in Comilla, Rajshahi and Dinajpur districts on Tuesday. Acting on a tip-off, BGB 10 battalion seized nine bottles of Indian liquor, six kg hemp, 1939 pieces chocolate, 45 pieces of sarees, 175 kg cumin, 54 kg dried grape, 76 kg malabathrum leaves and eight pieces of bronze-made pitchers worth Tk 5.96 lakh from different areas including Kotbari, Shahbali, Bibirbazar areas of Comilla, said a PID handout. In Rajshahi, BGB patrol team recovered 250 bottles of Phensidyl, 196 kg cumin, 75 kg dried grape and 505 pieces of Indian tube-light worth Tk 3.87 lakh in drives at Padmarchar and Belpukur areas. In Dianjpur, BGB-40 battalion seized 991 bottles of Phensidyl worth Tk 3.96 lakh in a drive at Fulbari border point.

Bus strike called off

Bus owners and workers called off their indefinite strike on all routes of the district after eight hours yesterday. Dipak Chandra Das, vice president of Barisal Bus Owners' Association, said the decision to withdraw the strike following a 'fruitful' meeting with the local administration. Earlier, the bus owners and workers called the strike yesterday morning, protesting frequent harassment by police. The strike virtually cut off the district from the rest of the country causing immense sufferings to the traveling public. On Wednesday, bus workers went on a wildcat strike around 3:30 pm on some routes of the district. Jahangir Hossain, president of Barisal Sarak Paribahan Sramik Union, alleged that police often seize their vehicles without any valid reason and sometimes demand high amount of extortion from them.

Robbers loot 7 houses

Robbers looted cash, gold ornaments and other valuables worth Tk 40 lakh from seven houses at Siberia village in Sadar upazila on Wednesday night. Locals said a gang of 20/25 entered the houses of Mojumdar Bari around 9:00pm and looted 40 tolas of gold ornaments, cash and other valuables at gunpoint. They also injured two family members before fleeing. The affected house owners are Uttam Majumdar, Biplob Majumdar, Nidan Majumdar, Jhantu Majumdar, Naran Majumdar, Montu Majumdar and Rentu Majumdar.

Interns at RMCH withdraw strike

The interns at Rangpur Medical College Hospital (RMCH) called off their indefinite strike yesterday morning. The decision to withdraw the strike was taken following a 'fruitful' meeting with the the hospital authorities in the morning. The interns also threatened to go for a tougher programme if their demand was not met within next Sunday. On Wednesday, the interns at RMCH went on an indefinite strike, demanding payment of their outstanding allowance for May and June.

2 held with bullets

Police in a drive have arrested two people along with bullets and bomb-making materials in Daulatpur area of the city. The arrestees are Shahriar, 22, son of Shahidullah of the area and Rakib, 20, son of ZakirHossain of Shahpara area. On information, police arrested Rakib and Shahriar on Tuesday evening, said Officer in-charge of Daulatpur Police Station M Akhter Hossain. Later, they recovered two bullets and bomb-making materials from their possession.

Fry catching wreaks havoc on fish in coastal rivers

Indiscriminate catching of fries is causing a sharp depletion of shrimp and other fish resources in the rivers of the coastal district.

A section of unscrupulous fishermen are continuing the mindless netting of fries, locals alleged.

The Bay of Bengal on the south links with Bishkhali and Payra rivers across the district.

During tide, huge fries of lobster, prawn and different other fishes are carried by the sea water into the two rivers.

Innocent fishermen catch these fries from the rivers by using mosquito nets.

The Fisheries Department apprehends that if the practice continues unhindered this way, different species of fish will soon

disappear from the rivers and water bodies of the coastal region.

While visiting the area, a large number of women and children were found catching fries of lobster and prawn on the banks of the Bishkhali, Baleswar and Payra rivers.

Bangladesh Fisheries Research Institute conducted a study on the rivers and canals in the offshore areas from 1991-97 under the title "Survey and Assistance of Shrimp Fry Resources of Bangladesh."

According to the study, fry collectors are causing harm to 38 species of prawn and six other fishes and 100 species of aquatic animals because of the senseless act.

It was found that in one single drive innumerable fries of tetra, poa and

taposhi were caught with seven or eight fries of prawn.

There are 147 hatcheries of prawn in the country. These hatcheries produce one thousand crore fries each year and the annual demand of fries in the country is three thousand crore.

Experts said the deficit could be met by increasing the number of authorised hatcheries and it will protect different species of fish.

Barguna assistant fishery official Ruhul Amin said netting fries from the river is officially restricted.

The fishery department has strengthened its activities to stop collection and netting of prawn fries, he added.

Legal actions are needed alongside mass awareness to stop such mindless catching of fries, he pointed out.

Jamaat men clash with cops

At least five people including two policemen were injured in a clash between the activists of Jamaat-Shibir and the law enforcers in the town yesterday afternoon.

The injured policemen are Assistant Sub-Inspector Jahir Uddin and Constable Shafiq of Sadar Police Station.

The activists vandalised several vehicles and business establishments during the incident, said

Assistant Police Commissioner Nishkriti Chakma.

Police fired 40 bullets to bring the situation under control and arrested three Jamaat-Shibir men.

Jamaat-Shibir men brought out a procession, protesting Election Commission (EC) decision to exclude their leaders, who were convicted by war crimes tribunals, from voter list.

As police tried to resist them, a clash took place, leaving the five injured, said

the ASP. At one stage, Jamaat-Shibir men attacked several business establishments and damaged vehicles.

Later, the traders and shop owners brought out a procession in the town, protesting the attack.

On Wednesday, the EC decided to exclude from the national voter list the names of convicts who were sentenced by the International Crimes Tribunals or found guilty under Bangladesh Collaborators Order, 1972.
