Aman cultivation in the ongoing peak sowing season is badly hampered amid insufficient rain in the district as farmers are reluctant to bear the high costs for irrigation.

The Department of Agriculture Extension (DAE) office in Jessore recorded 40 millimetres of rainfall from July 1 to 25 this year while it was 184 millimetres during the same period last year.

Dependent of rainwater during this season, cultivation of aman paddy usually do not require any irriga-

But this year many farmers in the district are watering their fields with electric or diesel-run pumps for the purpose as the rainfall is much less than usual.

The target of aman cultivation in the district this season is 1 lakh 29 thousand 624 hectares of land but only 29 thousand 130 hectares have been brought under the cultivation till July 25, said sources of DAE in Jessore.

During the same period last year, aman was sown on over one lakh hectares of land, they said.

Sowing of aman paddy starts early July and continues till late August.


along with his four friends went to have a bath in the river and suddenly he drowned. In Thakurgaon, a schoolboy drowned in the Kulik
