Apart from holding talks with the top Indian leadership today, Moni, who arrived in New Delhi yesterday, will also meet Leader of the Opposition in Rajya Sabha Arun Jaitley in a bid to ensure his party's support for smooth sailing of the Land Boundary Agreement (LBA), which is expected to come up in the monsoon session of Indian Parliament beginning on

US for warming Venezuela ties

The US said Wednesday it is open to improving ties with Venezuela after Caracas called off the rapprochement, accusing Washington of meddling in its internal affairs.

The nations, which were often at odds during the 14year rule of Hugo Chavez, hinted at warmer ties after a meeting of diplomats in June.
