BCB relieved by SC clearance

The clearance from the Supreme Court to hold the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) elections under the 2012 amended constitution

came as a huge relief for incumbent BCB president Nazmul Hassan Papon.

Soon after the verdict was delivered yesterday, the board called an official press conference at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur where a jubilant BCB boss said: "We had been going through a big crisis. The ad-hoc committee was formed to hold elections as soon as possible but we had problems with the constitution. The Appellate Division has given the verdict in the interest of the country. The International Cricket Council (ICC) has adopted this constitution, and the National Sports Council (NSC) has approved it. We can now hold elections under this constitution pending the full bench's approval. It is very good news, because the threat has been removed. We will hold elections as soon as possible and take all preparations from the June 29 board meeting."

When asked about what would happen to the elected body in case the full bench reversed the decision after the elections were held, Papon said: "It is very unlikely to overturn the ruling by the five judges. Unless it has very strong logic to the contrary, the

The BCB boss was surrounded by some of his ad-hoc committee members including Mahbubul Anam, who believed that it would not be easy to dismiss the elected board in the future as the ICC will take action against such a move as FIFA is doing against their members.

Papon also blamed the previous elected body for the current mess. "The last committee didn't make changes according to ICC's directives, which the NSC had asked it to make. The court has asked BCB to make the what they think."

changes, but that committee doesn't exist anymore. The previous directors didn't amend it for nine months. Who will take responsibility for making these changes?"

He also said that he was in no way a party to bringing the changes in the constitution.

"The major changes are the presidential election. In other boards, the executive body elects the president. Cricket players/organisers will get priority. The clubs went to the minister, complaining of a loss of balance. There are 71 votes from district councillors, 52 from Dhaka's. So now the Super League teams will get 2 votes each," he responded when asked about the four major changes in the constitution.

Asked about the chances of him contesting the election, Papon said: "I will have my own panel, but I don't think I will contest in the directors' election. As a president, I want to remain neutral. I don't want to join a panel. If there's more than one panel, I will directly contest for the president's election. Anybody can be a president. I have to see whether I have to be a director or directly president [as per 2012 amended constitution one has to be a director to contest the president's post]. I haven't yet decided. You have to understand that I was appointed through a gazette notification. I have to know from them (the government)

He couldn't care less

"To me the World Cup is top priority. It's good if we can arrange the Premier League but if we can't it doesn't matter," was what Bangladesh Cricket Board

president Nazmul Hassan Papon said to reporters yesterday.

Obviously hosting an event like a World Cup is a huge undertaking for any sports governing body, which will be the case for the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) when it hosts next year's ICC Twenty20 World Cups. So there is nothing untoward in BCB president Nazmul Hassan Papon placing the highest priority on the successful staging of the global event. And certainly, a World Cup is a much bigger event than a domestic competition like the Dhaka Premier League (DPL).

On superficial examination of a country's cricketing activities, it may be deemed acceptable that the chief of a sporting body responsible for carrying out all manners of activities and initiatives only concern himself with the bigger events like World Cups. There are after all other personnel to look after the domestic side of things, which are nonetheless the bread and butter of the country's professional cricketers. But as the sorry state of domestic cricket proves, a chief cannot only concern himself with one particular task at a time; instead he has to have a solid hold on all the activities within the community that he is responsible for.

In light of that sentiment, his latest remark on the dilly-dallying with the country's lone 50-over competition during yesterday's press conference came as a shock.

"We are trying (to hold the league). The league is important but I have to look into bigger issues. You may think that there is no need for the World Cup and that the Premier

League must take place. Work is ongoing at Mirpur, Fatullah, BKSP, and there will be an inspection in September. So August is a very important month for me. True, there is no point in sacrificing the Premier League but I firmly believe that the World Cup is more important than any domestic league," was the latest salvo from the BCB boss when asked about the uncertainty over the league.

Yes, we can sacrifice something for a bigger national cause but it should never have come to this in the first place. The league was supposed to be held in March but the BCB as usual bent to the allpowerful clubs and spent six months postponing the tournament repeatedly. The president seemed excited with the increase of councillorship for the six top clubs but he has not seemed to question whether it is desirable to give clubs more power when the same clubs have been reluctant to play the league, which is their only notable contribution to the country's cricket.

As host nation, Bangladesh's main job there are no opening or closing ceremonies for the 2014 event -- is to provide venues for an ICC-sponsored event like the World Twenty20. The president however is willing to put aside all other cricketing activities for the upcoming mega tournament.

While many may pat Papon's back for his eagerness to successfully host the event, the reality remains that Bangladesh's profile as a cricket nation will increase only through improvements in performance of the national team, for which the good health of domestic competitions is key. In that regard, a similar drive to the one being undertaken with a target to doing well in the 2015 50-over World Cup in Australia will not go amiss.

So if someone terms the activities and choices made by the incumbent president as short-sighted, there are enough arguments to back up the claim.

BD booters to go to Thailand

The Thailand Football Association finally agreed to host the Bangladesh national football team for two friendlies as part of Bangladesh's preparation for September's SAFF Championship.

The Bangladesh contingent will leave for Bangkok on July 28 and return home on August 5 after a nine-day tour.

"The dates of the friendlies have not been finalised but both matches will take place at the Rajamongola National Stadium," said Bangladesh Football Federation general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag yesterday.

Germany-based Reasat Khaton will be touring with the national squad in Thailand but the 23-year old midfielder has no chance to play in the matches as he does not have a Bangladeshi passport.

Shohag informed that the federation has started the process of obtaining a Bangladeshi passport for Reasat following the instructions from Dutch coach Lodewijk De Kruif.

U-16s lose final group match

The Bangladesh U-16 football side suffered a 2-0 defeat to India in their final group match of the SAFF U-16 Championship at the Nepal Army ground in Lalitpur, Nepal yesterday.

Bedashor Singh and Krishna Pandit struck goals in either half to help India emerge group B champions to set their semifinal clash against Afghanistan on Sunday while Group B runners-up Bangladesh will face hosts Nepal in the first semifinal on Saturday.

Having confirmed the semifinal berths, both Bangladesh and India started the final group match with an aim to avoid hosts Nepal in the semifinal, but it was India who drew first blood thanks to a free-kick goal



A five-member bench of the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court headed by Chief Justice Md. Muzammel Hossain came up with the order after allowing a leave to appeal petition.

The apex court, however, said the legality of that elected BCB committee will depend on the 9member full bench's final judgment in this case.

The BCB and the Nationa Sports Council (NSC) recently filed the petition against a High Court verdict that declared the amendment to the constitution illegal on January 27 this year. In the ruling the HC said that the NSC had no authority to amend the constitution. The HC delivered the decision following a writ petition by Yousuf Jamil Babu, president of the Bangladesh District and Divisional Sports Organisers' Association, and Mobasher Hossain, a former BCB director, on December 13 last year.

West Indies at the Beausejour Stadium on Wednesday.



Pakistan take the five-match series 3-1 with one tied and now both teams shift focus to the two Twenty20 Internationals to be played on Saturday and Sunday in St. Vincent.
