#### Long tailbacks occur on Dhaka-Ctg road

Thousands of commuters had to endure immense suffering due to two consecutive tailbacks on Dhaka-Chittagong highway near Comilla yesterday.

A 30-kilometer traffic gridlock occurred on Raypur-Daudkandi road after a covered-van overturned around 3:30am. Gouripur highway police removed the vehicle around 9:00am and the traffic started to ease after six hours.

However, the traffic worsened again when another coveredvan collided head-on with a truck at Nurpur around 10:30am; clogging the road up to Kalakochua for some four hours.

#### Enayet new ambassador to Jordan

The government has decided to appoint Muhammad Enayet Hussain, currently serving as the consular general of Bangladesh in Los Angeles, as the new ambassador of Bangladesh to Jordan, according to the foreign ministry.

He previously served in the Bangladesh consulate general in Jeddah and Bangladesh missions in Brunei, Doha and Berlin in various capacities.

#### Schoolgirl found dead in capital

A schoolgirl was found dead in a waterbody in the capital's East Badda yesterday, two days after she went missing.

Badda police recovered the floating body of Tamanna Akhter, 12, a sixth-grader, and sent it to Dhaka Medical College Hospital morgue for an autopsy.

Tamanna went missing on Wednesday when she went out for buying a shampoo, said Tamanna's father.

#### China for sharing armed forces expertise

#### Mugger beaten to death in Gazipur

An unidentified mugger was beaten to death by a mob on Banmala road at Dattapara in Tongi of Gazipur yesterday. Police said locals managed to catch him after his

group snatched a bag containing Tk 30,000 from Kohinur Begum.

On information, police rescued him and took him to Tongi hospital where doctors declared him dead. The body was sent to Gazipur Sadar Hospital morgue for an autopsy.

### 10 hurt in BNP factional clash

Around 10 people were injured in a clash between two factions of BNP on Jurain Commissioner Road at Kadamtali in the capital yesterday afternoon.

The clash ensued when the group, led by former lawmaker Salahuddin's son Robin, attacked the activists loyal to Kadamtali Thana BNP President Mir Hossain Miru, while the latter were trying to organise an iftar party there, said Kadamtali police.

Three motorbikes were also vandalised on the spot, said

Sub-inspector Zakir Hossain. There was a long standing feud between Miru and Salahuddin to establish supremacy in the area, said the SI

while talking to The Daily Star. The trouble makers had left the spot before the police

arrived there, said SI Zakir.

However, Salahuddin said neither he nor his son were involved with the clash.

## MV Hope's 2nd officer arrives home

The second officer of Bangladeshi cargo vessel MV Hope, which tilted in the Andaman Sea off Thailand's coast early July 4, reached home yesterday after receiving treatment in a Thai hospital for 21 days.

Mohammad Mobarak Hossain reached Dhaka at noon on a Thai Airways flight from Bangkok and arrived at Chittagong Shah Amanat International Airport in the afternoon, said Mohammad Musa, brother-in-law of the victim.

Mobarak, along with two other crewmen Raek Fairooz and Mushfiqur Rahman, were rescued from the sea by the crew of merchant vessel, MV Bux Lagoon, on July 5, a day after the ship tilted. Since then, Mobarak had been treated

in a hospital at Phuket. Nine of the 17 crewmen of the ship were rescued alive, while the bodies of two were recovered. The six others, including the captain, are still missing.

# Two buildings remain unused since 2006

Visiting teachers running one department; Remaining two yet to start functioning due to absence of teachers IQBAL SIDDIQUEE, Sylhet

Despite having adequate structures and Tk 12 crore worth of laboratory equipment, Sylhet Engineering College (SEC) is struggling to run one department, let alone admit students in

the remaining two, due to absence of permanent teachers since its 2006 inauguration. Around 12 visiting teachers from Shahjalal University of Engineering and Technology, MC College and private universities in Sylhet have been running the Department of Computer Science and Engineering, having a capacity

of 60 students. However, the crisis of teachers had prompted SEC to refrain from enrolling students in the 2010-11 session.

The remaining Department of Electrical and Electronics Engineering, and Department of Civil Engineering, having the same capacity, exist in name only. Two buildings allotted for the departments lie vacant.

The government-run institution does not even have a principal. Its acting principal is Sushanta Kumar Bosu, principal of Sylhet Polytechnic Institute.

In a recent meet with The Daily Star, Sushanta said SEC requires at least 100 permanent teachers and staff to run its three departments.

Students enrolling in SEC have staged demonstrations and submitted memorandums to the finance and education ministries in the past five years to no effect.

A number of educationalists, including Principal Ataur Rahman Pir and ANAA Mahbub Ahmed, told The Daily Star that the

appointment might have been stalled as SEC was founded during the previous government's tenure.

Talking to The Daily Star recently, Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid said the previous government constructed the buildings and procured the equipments but did not create posts for the teaching staff. He said steps were being taken to appoint teachers, which might be possible within this fiscal.

Ending in 2007, the construction of SEC on an eight-acre land surrounded by scenic hillocks in Sylhet city's suburban Baluchar took two years costing Tk 51 crore.

The construction comprised a laboratory, a library, three academic and an administrative building and the principal's, teachers' and staff quarters. The first batch of 60 students was enrolled

Selim Ahmed, adding that that batch passed out successfully and the graduates were working at reputed institutions. Students were enrolled for the next three years, 2008-09, 2009-10 and 2011-12, except

students, including 45 females, he added. The education ministry has prepared a structure for SEC with 85 posts, including that of the principal, and it would be soon placed before the finance ministry for approval, said Selim.

A meeting has been called at the education ministry on August 4 to discuss the appointment procedures, informed acting principal Sushanta.

# 3 'kill themselves' in capital

Three persons allegedly committed suicide early yesterday in the capital's Mohammadpur, Adabor and Demra.

Sudipto Sarker, 31, an undergraduate student of University of Liberal Arts Bangladesh, overdosed on sleeping pills in his residence in Mohammadpur, said Kamal Uddin, a sub-

inspector of Mohammadpur Police Station. He was rushed to a private hospital around 3:00am where on-duty doctors declared him dead, he said.

Sudipto's family members claim he had been a drug addict, said the police inspector.

Meanwhile, the body of Mosammat Hassanur, 14, was found hanging in an unused room in the building where she resides, said Maruf Hossain Russel, a sub-inspector of Adabar Police Station.

Mosammat's relatives said she suffered from psychological problems and had made

several suicide attempts before, said Russel. Meanwhile in Demra, Najmun Nahar, 23, allegedly hanged herself over an altercation

with her husband. She was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital at about 2:00am where doctors declared her dead, said Demra police.

## Bus driver shot dead by robbers in Feni

The driver of a passenger bus was shot dead by a gang of robbers in Daudpur bridge area in Feni yesterday. The dead is Abu Taher, 55, of Mirsarai upazila of

Witnesses said when some cloth traders were going to Dhaka in the reserved bus of Saudi Paribahan, the robbers tried to halt it by hurling brick chips at them around

3:00am. When the driver started to drive away, the criminals opened fire on him leaving him critically injured. Humayun, helper in the bus, then took control of the steering and drove the bus to a nearby filling station in Fatehpur. The helper took Taher to a hospital where doctors

declared him dead.

#### 9 JCD leaders sued for activist 'abduction'

Nine JCD leaders, including its president and general secretary, alongside 18 others unnamed were sued in a case filed yesterday over the alleged assault on a JCD activist following his abduction and confinement.

The case statement says the accused, under the directive of the president and general secretary, abducted Shakhawat Hossain Chayon at gunpoint from before the capital's Paltan Tower on Wednesday noon. The former Jatiyatabadi

Chhatra Dal (JCD) Central Committee member was then confined and beaten inside a tin-shed house in Paltan area. Locals rescued and took Chayon to Dhaka Medical College Hospital. He is now undergoing

treatment at Brighton Hospital. Chayon's brother filed the case with Paltan Police Station. Chayon said around half an hour before the abduc-

tion, he and some other JCD activists had placed a demand, at BNP's Nayapaltan headquarters, for their inclusion in JCD's recently declared Central Committee.

JCD President Abdul Quader Bhuiyan Jewel denied being involved.


