A family lives in fear in capital

A mason of South Matuail who takes subcontracts and his family are living in fear as extortionists are repeatedly threatening him with death to withdraw an attempted murder case he filed against them.

The deluge caused waterlogging mainly in low-lying areas especially Bakalia, Chawkbazar, Agrabad, Halishahar, Kapasgola, Chandgaon, Shulakbahar, Bahaddarhat and Probartak intersection. The disruption to roads and transport

Chawkbazar. Many residents and traders spent a sleepless night bailing water seeping into their homes. One of them, Nitai Das, a laundryman at DC Road area in West Bakalia, said the

filthy water spoiled all his customers' clothes. The ground floors of Chawk Bazar

Kitchen Market and Adhunik Chawk Super Market in Chawkbazar went under water, damaging goods and outfits. "We did not get any scope to save the clothes

as torrential rain started from midnight when

the market was closed," said Jahangir Alam, a shop-owner of the super market. "I invested Tk 20 lakh for the upcoming Eid season and most of my clothes have been ruined," he added.

Subhash Barua, a town planner and vicepresident of Forum for Plan Chattagram, said silt from the hills and the city's litter and debris were blocking the drains, which are now too narrow to support the rapid pace of urbanisation, causing the waterlogging.



Jamaat declares fresh agitation programmes
