

Kidnappers free 34 more PCJSS men in Rangamati

15 still remain captive

Thirty-four more activists of Parbatya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samity (PCJSS), abducted from Kattholi in Longudu upazila of the district on February 16, were released yesterday.

Police and PCJSS sources said six of the 34 activists were released in Chhoto Kattholi area under Longdu upazila while the remaining 28 in Barunachhari area under Shuvalong upazila in the morning.

In the last week, the kidnapers released three others in different areas of Longudu upazila.

Confirming the release of 37 in phases, PCJSS Assistant Information and Publicity Secretary Sajib Chakma said the kidnapers are yet to release 15 party men.

Razaul Haq, officer-in-charge of Langdu Police Station, said the released PCJSS activists were in good health and returned to their respective villages.

As many as 52 PCJSS activists were kidnapped at Joratilla in Kattholi area under Langdu upazila while they were returning home from Rangamati town after attending the party's 41st founding anniversary programme.

Longudu police said some 40 people blocked an engine boat in Jotetila area at around 10:30am and abducted the PCJSS men at gun point.

Moni Shankar Chakma, secretary of Longudu upazila unit of PCJSS, Josho Chakma, secretary of Jubo Samity, and Milon Chakma, organising secretary of the samity, were among the victims, said Longudu police.

PCJSS leaders blamed the United People's Democratic Front (UPDF) for the abduction.

Michael Chakma, secretary of the Rangamati unit of Gonotantrik Jubo Forum, the youth body of the UPDF, refuted the allegation.

After the incident, a joint team of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) and police conducted drives in different areas of the upazila but could not rescue the abducted PCJSS men.

Protesting the incident, PCJSS staged demonstrations and held rallies in the town at different times, demanding steps to rescue the abducted party men.

Razaul Haq, officer-in-charge of Langdu Police Station, said the released PCJSS activists were in good health and returned to their respective villages.

280 dead birds seized from Narail poachers

Mobile court fines, frees gang

Police in separate drives on Sunday seized at least 280 dead birds in Lohagara upazila and arrested six poachers.

A mobile court later fined the poachers Tk 500 each and released them.

Lohagara police said, a gang of poachers active in the upazila trapped the Asian Pied Starling, locally known as Shalik, in different areas to sell them in local markets.

Police first arrested Shukur Mondol, 26, from Lohagara village with a few dead birds and on his confessional statement arrested five others.

The other arrestees were Ramzan Kha, 28, Zohir Kha, 23, Nayan Sheikh, 20, Musa Kha, 17, and Ainul Fakir, 20, of the same area.

Iqbal Bahar Chowdhury, officer-in-charge of Lohagara PS said that the criminals had been doing this for a long time. Later he handed them over to a mobile court led by Lohagara upazila nirbahi officer UNO Rebeca Khan, he added.

Contacted, Rebeca Khan said, she fined the six as per the Wildlife Preservation Act. They were fined Tk 500 each as they committed the offence for the first time, she said.

However, sources said that the gang had been hunting

birds setting various types of poison traps. They sell the birds at different markets in the upazila openly.

Locals alleged that a section of people buy the dead birds to eat them.

The hunters use current nets, hanging nets, poisonous baits and hooks to trap the birds. These poachers not only kill the Asian Pied

Starling, they also catch different migratory birds in winter season.

Borun Kumer Biswas, a biology teacher at Narail Government Victoria College, expressing concern, said indiscriminate hunting of birds causes ecological threat. He stressed the need for people's awareness and strict enforcement of law to protect the birds.

Charge sheet against 22 in Bogra Sujan killing case

Police have submitted charge sheet against 22 men in Bogra district Awami League youth and sports affairs secretary Sujan killing case.

The charge sheeted accused are local Jubo League activists Mostakim Rahman, Adil, Kafi, Noman, Anamul, Nadim, Sumon, Shimanto, Pallob, Hossain, Hasan, Bellal, Manik, Shanto, Shahidul, Nayan, municipality councillor and town BNP leader Hiru Pashari and Bappi, Jewel, Kabir, Bappa and Nurunnabi.

Nur-e-Alam Siddiki, officer-in-charge of Sadar police station and investigation officer (IO) in the case, submitted the charge sheet before the court of Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate on Saturday.

On November 29 last year, Sujanur Rahman Sujan, 53, was stabbed to death near his residence at Malgram in the town.

The killing took place while Sujan was returning home from his business centre.

Sujan's wife Monjuara Begum Rubi filed a case accusing 26 people in connection with the killing.

Police then arrested seven people including charge sheeted accused Bappa and Nurunnabi, said the IO.

Prime minister to visit Rangpur tomorrow

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is scheduled to visit Rangpur along with her family members tomorrow.

During her visit, she will inaugurate several development projects including Wazed Miah Bridge over Karatoa River at Kachdah under Tukuria union in Pirganj upazila, Dak Bungalow at Pirganj and Rangpur divisional passport and visa office building.

The PM will lay foundation stones of Pirganj upazila parishad building, Marine academy complex in Patgram area under Baro Alampur union in Pirganj and annex building of Rangpur Circuit House.

Sheikh Hasina, also president of ruling Awami League, is also expected to address a rally at 2:00 pm at Pirganj Government High School and Pirganj. Besides, she has other day-long programmes in different areas of the district.

MP Rony's brother, 15 others sued on extortion charge

Sixteen people, including a brother of lawmaker Golam Maula Rony, have been sued on extortion charge in Galachipa of the district.

Abdul Mannan Howlader of Ulania Bazar under Ratandi-Taltali union filed the case with Galachipa Police Station on Saturday night.

Rony's brother Golam Sarwar, father-in-law Md Fazle Ali Khan, brother-in-law and also Chairman of Dakua Union Parishad (UP) in the upazila Mokbul Khan, are among the accused.

In the case statement, the complainant stated that the accused entered his house at around 8:00pm on July 25 and demanded Tk one lakh from him. As he refused to pay the money, Mahazib, one of accused, took away Tk 30,000 from a showcase.

The plaintiff further stated that the accused beat up his wife Fatima Begum and looted her gold ornaments.

Officer-in-Charge (OC) SM Ziaul Haque of Galachipa Police Station told this correspondent yesterday that they recorded the case against the accused. "After proper investigation, we will take necessary steps against the accused," the OC said.

Members of a team that produces a crime-investigative show, Talash, for Independent TV visited Galachipa and Dashmina upazilas in the first week of July to collect information about alleged corruption of Rony, AL lawmaker from Patuakhali-3 constituency (Galachipa and Dashmina).

Locals said Mannan's interview with Talash team at Ulania Bazar in Galachipa had angered Rony's men, who later attacked his house.

Schoolboy kidnapped

A schoolboy was abducted from Dampara union in Nikli upazila on Sunday.

The victim is Sumon Mia, son of Nurul Islam of Uttar Dampara village. He is a class nine student of Mahtab Uddin High School.

Family sources said, an unknown person introducing himself as a surveyor of an NGO, came to their house

a few days ago and sought Sumon's help for surveying the area.

On Sunday afternoon, he and Sumon boarded a boat and took him to an iftar party. And since then Sumon remained missing.

An unknown caller demanded Tk 30 lakh ransom for his release over phone yesterday, said Sumon's elder brother Mokarrom Hossain.

Two siblings in Chuadanga buy freedom

Another youth kidnapped

Two siblings, abducted on Saturday night from Damurhuda upazila of Chuadanga district, were released yesterday in exchange for ransom.

The victims are Jalal Uddin, 32, and his brother Kamal Uddin, 30, of Kashipur upazila in Bogra district.

At midnight on Saturday, a gang of 10/12 armed men kidnapped the duo when they were asleep at their furniture shop at Natipota intersection in the upazila.

Later, the gang demanded a ransom of Tk 2 lakh from the two for their release. After negotiation, the captors released Kamal Uddin on Sunday morning just to manage the ransom money.

"The abductors freed both of us on payment of Tk 50,000," Kamal told local journalists yesterday. He, however, declined to disclose the identity of the gang members.

Sub-Inspector (SI) Ashrafuzzaman, in-charge of Bhogirathpur police camp, four kilometres from Natipota, said no one came to the camp to file any complaint in this regard.

Ahsan Habib, officer-in-charge (OC) of Damurhuda Police Station, said they visited the shop on receiving information on release of the two brothers. But they immediately left the area for their home in Bogra, he added.

In another incident, a gang of 8/9 armed men kidnapped a youth named Mehedi Hasan, 20, from Salamat Bazar area in the same upazila on Saturday.

Victim's father Mahtab told journalists that the gang kidnapped his house and later demanded Tk 1 lakh for his release.

Mahtab said he recently bought a piece of land at Salamat Bazaar for Tk 10 lakh to set up a shop there for Mehedi. "This might have prompted the gang to pick up my son for ransom," Mahtab said.

Being informed by Mahtab on Sunday, law enforcers of Shambhuganj police camp have launched a drive to rescue the youth.

Two Limon cases cleared in one, other to be withdrawn Aug 18

A court here yesterday cleared Limon of charges in the arms case, while the other case against him for obstructing law enforcers from performing their duties will be heard and withdrawn on August 18.

Police had submitted charge sheets in both the cases against a gang, including Limon. Though Limon has been cleared of the charge, the arms case against the remaining accused will continue, the PP further said.

On March 23, 2011, a Rab team shot Limon in the left leg at Shaturia village, taking him for a notorious criminal it was looking for. The elite force then picked up Limon and sent him to a hospital. On the same day, Rab filed two cases against him- one for possessing arms and another for obstructing law enforcers.

Meanwhile, the hearing of the case filed by Limon's mother Henora Begum against five Rab personnel will be held on August 13.

Erosion renders 300 families homeless in a week

Dyke washed away in Kurigram

Erosion by Brahmaputra washed away a big portion of the river protection embankment, rendering around 300 families homeless at several villages in Jatrapur union of Sadar upazila in the last one week.

The worst affected villages are Char Jatrapur, Farazipara, Parbattipur, Ghanoshyampur, Baldipara and Garuhara.

A large number of erosion-hit people have already taken shelter on government roads and high lands, said an official of Water Development Board (WDB) in the district.

About a kilometre of the embankment went into the river, causing immense sufferings to the people of Jatrapur, Nayerhat and Begumganj unions as they have to go to the district town by using boat, said Mahabubur Rahman, 50, a villager.

Earlier, they used the embankment as a

road for going to the town, he said.

If the authorities did not reconstruct the embankment immediately, floodwater in the few weeks would enter Baldipara, Garuhara villages of Jatrapur union and Araji Palashbari, Shitajihar and Gabindapur villages of Pachgachhi union, rendering over 20,000 families homeless, feared Abdul Gafur, chairman of Jatrapur UP.

Besides, several thousand acres of lands would turn uncultivable if they remain covered with sands carried by floodwater, said the chairman.

Despite repeated appeals, the authorities are yet to take any remarkable steps to protect the erosion, he alleged.

Kurigram WDB executive engineer Enayet Ullah however, said, the work for protecting erosion came to a halt due to heavy current at erosion point of the river.



Erosion by Brahmaputra washed away about one kilometre of the flood protection dyke and rendered around 300 families homeless in a week at several villages under Jatrapur union of Kurigram.
