

Forest robbers kidnap 4 shrimp enclosure owners for ransom

Forest robbers kidnaped four shrimp enclosure owners for ransom from a Golakhali area of Shyamnagar upazila early yesterday.

The four were identified as Debabrata Mal, 22, Kartik Gayen, 45, Pranab Bishwas, 34 and Jitendra Mal, 54. All of them from Bhelkhal village of the upazila.

Monoranjan Mondal, father of Debabrata Mondal said all the kidnap victims were staying at their shrimp enclosure to guard those. In the dead of night, armed gang members of Hazrat Bahini and Amir Bahini stormed into the shrimp enclosures and picked them up at gunpoint.

A staff of one of the enclosures said a gang of 15-20 swooped on the farms at about 1:00am.

Later, the robbers contacted the family members over phone and asked them to pay Tk 2 lakh per head for their release within the next three days, otherwise they would be killed and their bodies would be dumped in the river.

Aslam Khan, officer in-charge of Shyamnagar police station said he heard the news of abduction but yet to get any complaint from the family members of the victims.

Meanwhile, at least nine fishermen were injured by robbers at Tagar Char point of River Meghna in Monpura upazila of Bhola

on Sunday midnight, reports a correspondent.

Quoting injured fishermen, Gulzar Ahmed, sub inspector and in-charge of Char Nizam police camp, said when 10/12 fishermen were catching fish in the river on Sunday night, a gang of 30/32 robbers, led by notorious Kalam Dakat, swooped on at around 9:00pm.

As the fishermen fled to Janata Bazar area, the robbers opened fired on them injuring Bachchu Majhi, 30, son of Abdul Malek Hajji of Dakkhin Sakuchia union under Monpura upazila with bullet.

At that time, the robbers also beat up other fishermen mercilessly, injuring 8 of them.

Rangpur AL wants Joy to contest from Pirganj-6

Local leaders of the ruling Awami League want Sajeeb Wazed Joy, son of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, to contest the next parliamentary election from the district.

Mamotaz Uddin, acting president of Rangpur district unit AL told newsmen at Rangpur press club on Monday that they expect Joy to run the election from Rangpur-6 (Pirganj upazila) constituency.

The ruling party men were holding the press conference ahead of the prime minister's visit to the upazila today.

Replying to a question of the journalists, Mamotaz said Joy had already started campaign and people of Pirganj campaign for his election.

He also hinted that Hasina might introduce him at today's rally at Pirganj Government High School ground.

AL district unit general secretary Rezaul Karim Razu said Joy and his sister Saima Wazed Putul will accompany their mother Sheikh Hasina during her Rangpur visit.

Earlier, Rangpur district

Awami League awarded Joy the party membership in 2010. Since then, local leaders and activists of Awami League have been openly supporting Joy to take over the charge of the party.

During her visit today, Hasina is expected to open a number of development projects in Pirganj upazila.

Officials and local AL sources said she will also visit the homestead of her husband at Fotehpur Laldighi village, offer special prayers at the grave of husband Dr. MA Wajed Miah and address a public rally there at 2:00pm.

Scores of colourful gates have already been built from Pirganj upazila town to Fotehpur-Laldighi village to welcome the PM and her family.

Sources said, the prime minister will open the newly built Wajed Miah Bridge, Pirganj Dak Bungalow building and Rangpur Zonal Passport Office at Pirganj today.

Besides, she will lay the foundation stones of Rangpur Marine Academy, Rangpur Divisional Commissioner Office Complex, Annex Building of Rangpur Circuit House, Textile Institute and Pirganj upazila parishad building.

AL leader held for assaulting journo

Detective Branch (DB) of police arrested a local Awami League leader in a Kacharighat area of the town yesterday on charge of assaulting a journalist.

The arrestee is Nazim Ullah, relief and social welfare secretary of Nandail upazila unit AL.

Nazim attacked Shah Alam Bhuiyan, Nandail correspondent of The Daily Ittefaq, and staff reporter of Swajon, a local daily, with iron rod on Saturday when the journalist was talking with some of his friends in front of his business centre in the upazila town.

He was admitted to Nandail upazila health complex, police and hospi-

tal sources said.

Shah Alam came under the attack as he ran a report on 'gambling menace in Nandail' in the local daily, a few days ago.

Earlier, the AL leader threatened the journalist for publishing the report, said Khandaker Jahidul Islam, officer in-charge of Nandail police station.

Newsmen of the upazila formed several human chains and held rallies, demanding immediate arrest and punishment of Nazim Ullah after the incident.

On July 26, Shah Alam filed a general diary with the police station in connection with the threat, said the OC.

AL leader Nazim Ullah was arrested in a case for attacking the journalist, he said.

Cattle traders robbed

Robbers took away Tk 1 crore from cattle traders traveling by a passenger bus on Khulna-Sathkira highway under Tala upazila early yesterday.

Police and locals said a gang of 15/20 in a truck waylaid a bus of Chaklader Paribahan carrying over 60 cattle traders and injured three of them and took away the money.

Hearing the hue and cry, two on duty policemen chased the gang, but they blasted some cocktails, leaving the law enforcers injured and fled the scene.

In Dinajpur, robbers entered a warehouse of Bangladesh Power Development (PDB) in the district early yesterday and looted goods including copper wire, a motorcycle and other valuables worth Tk 3 lakh, reports our correspondent.

BSF picks up youth

Members of Indian Border Security Force (BSF) picked up a Bangladeshi national from a border point in Tahirpur upazila on Monday evening. The victim was identified as Isa Mia, 30, a stone quarry labourer of Manigaon village in the upazila. Locals said BSF men from Gomoghat camp chased Isa and caught him as he and a group of people entered Indian territory illegally for lifting stones from the Jadukata River at about 5:30pm.

Dinajpur Jamaat ameer held

Police arrested Jamaat-e-Islami's district unit ameer from Begumpur in Birampur upazila early yesterday. Acting on a tip-off, a team of Birampur police raided the area at about 5:30am and arrested Anwarul Islam while he was going to his Hakimpur village home, said Nasir Uddin Mondal, officer in-charge of Birampur police station. Anwar was wanted in three cases, including for vandalism and planning subversive activities, said the OC.

37 held near border

Members of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) arrested 37 people near Putkhali and Rudrapur frontiers here on Monday while they were being trafficked to India. 23 BGB commander in Khulna Lt Col Tayef UI Haque said, acting on secret information, they launched a drive along the two borders and arrested the 37 including 11 women and five children. The arrestees hail from Barisal and Faridpur districts. The trafficking victims were handed over to Benapole port PS police.

Wall collapse kills boy

An eight-year-old boy was killed when a mud wall of their house collapsed on him on Sunday night. The dead was identified as Faisal Ahmed, son of Tarikul Islam of village Krisnachandrapur under Moheshpur upazila. Locals said, Faisal was sleeping in his house. At about 10:00 at night, an earthen wall collapsed on him killing him on the spot.

Youth drowns in river

A youth drowned in the Naboganga River in Naldi union under Lohagara upazila of the district on Sunday afternoon. The deceased was identified as Rasel Sheikh, 18, son of Rezaul Sheikh of Jalalibad village in the same upazila. Family of the deceased said on the day Rasel went to catch fish in the Naboganga. Suddenly he started to drown. Locals rescued him and took him to Narail Sadar Hospital where doctor declared him dead.
