

"I catch birds to earn a indigenous fishes and indisliving. Many others in the criminate poaching are responsible for the situation," said Altaf Hossain Sarker, 82, a farmer at Batrish Hazari village in Lalmonirhat Sadar.

The Wildlife (Protection and Safety) Act 2012 keeps the provision for awarding one year jail and a fine of up to Tk 1 lakh or both to the bird poachers, said Dr Abu Hossain Sarker, district livestock officer. "With the help of law

enforcers, I will conduct drive against bird poachers if I get information. It is highly necessary to build up awareness among the people to stop bird poaching," he said.

No fire station in seven upazilas of Comilla

2.5 million people remain vulnerable

YASMIN REEMA, Comilla

Seven of the 16 upazilas of the district are still without any fire service and civil defence station, leaving around 2.5 million people living in the areas vulnerable to serious losses in case of fire incidents.

The seven upazilas are Debidwar, Burichong, Brahmanpara, Nangalkot, Monoharganj, Meghna, and Titas.

At least 539 fire incidents took place in the district in one year till July 20 this year, causing an estimated damage to properties worth Tk 7 crore 24 lakh 62 thousand taka.

Fire service stations could not be established in the seven upazilas due to the acquisition, although the city would be built as per an government allotted necessary fund for the purpose, said Md Sahabuddin spots uninterruptedly," said
