Woman to die for killing husband's another wife

A Dhaka court yesterday sentenced a woman to death and her husband to life term imprisonment for killing her husband's another wife and her baby girl at Kashiani in Gopalganj in 2009.

The court handed down the verdict to Khadiza Begum. The court also sentenced Mohammad Nawshad Fakir in absentia, husband of the two women, to seven years' imprisonment for concealing bodies of the victims.

Nawshad's punishment will be effective from the day of his arrest or surrender, said the court. According to the prosecution, over a family feud Khadiza

killed Taslima Begum and Taslima's six-month-old baby Sadia on January 31, 2009 and concealed the bodies under earth at her house.

Later, Nawshad lodged a general diary with Kashiani Police Station for rescuing the victims. Police arrested Khadiza who later confessed before a magistrate court to the killing.

begin on November 20.
