
Farah dispels Daegu blues

Farah, who is attempting to replicate the double 5,000-10,000m gold he claimed at last year's London Olympics, had a slow race pace, American training partner Galen Rupp and his own definitive race-end kick to thank for his victory.

There was an all-too-familiar finish to the 25-lap race when Ethiopia's defending world champion Ibrahim Jeilan tried to edge past Farah on the final bend.



Tamim blitz in vain

A steady 75 off 62 balls by opener Tamim Iqbal went in vain as his Saint Lucia Zouks slumped to a six wicket defeat against Chris Gayle's Jamaica Tallawah at Gros Islet in the Caribbean Premier League on Saturday.

Tamim's innings, which included six fours and three sixes, led the Zouks to 142 for seven in 20 overs. However, a whirlwind 47 off just 19 balls by Andre Russel led Jamaica to a comfortable victory in just 17.3 overs.

This was the second defeat in the last three days for the Zouks as they had given in to Shakib Al Hasan's Barbados Tridents on Thursday. Tridents had scored 175, and Zouks were bundled out for just 92. Shakib had scored 12 runs and finished with figures of none for 15 in two overs, while Tamim was caught for just one in that game.

Zia loses against Gelfand

Grand Master Ziaur Rahman lost against Boris Gelfand of Israel in the opening round of the Chess World Cup at the Norwegian city of Tromso yesterday.

Bangladesh's highestranked player Zia (2470) played with black pieces and conceded defeat after 63 moves against the 7th seeded Israeli GM who has a ranking point of 2773.

The two players will meet again today in this knockout tournament. This time Zia will play with white pieces. Anything but a win will eliminate Zia from the tournament. If Zia wins, a rapid play-off would take place to decide the qualifier for the next round.

Debutant delights Dortmund Moyes's Shield stroll

With Alex Ferguson's glorious reign consigned to the history books, David Moyes unveiled his blueprint for a new era at Manchester United in Sunday's 2-0 victory over Wigan in the

Community Shield. Some disjointed displays on the club's pre-season tour to Asia and Australia, followed by Friday's loss to Sevilla, had given the impression of a United squad struggling to adapt to their new manager's demands

following Ferguson's retirement. But there was enough invention and pace on display from the champions at Wembley to suggest Moyes will stay true to the attacking principles so well established by Ferguson over 26 and a half years at Old Trafford.

With FA Cup winners Wigan now plying their trade in the second tier after last season's relegation, it was difficult to draw too many definitive conclusions from Moyes' first significant outing as United manager.

One thing is certain. As Wayne Rooney tries to engineer a move to Chelsea, Moyes desperately needs Robin van Persie, scorer of both United's goals, to stay fit if the Scot is to to power a header past Scott Carson.

challenge for major honours. similar to the shape he used at Everton, but it was a far from rigid approach and allowed his attacking players plenty of room to improvise.

With Michael Carrick and Tom Cleverley patrolling the central midfield areas with quiet authority, Ryan Giggs -- nominally the third midfielder -- had freedom to either drift wide or get forward to link up with the front three.

Van Persie started as the most central of those three, with Wilfried Zaha, the £15 million signing from Crystal Palace, lined up on the right flank.

Danny Welbeck began on the left, but played centrally alongside van Persie for long periods.

Ferguson was more of a 4-4-2 man for much of his reign, but United's fluid movement when they took the lead in the seventh minute showed they should have few problems working in the system.

Giggs came into a central position and flicked a backheeled pass to van Persie, who dropped deep into midfield to take possession before spreading play wide to left-back Patrice Evra.

Evra whipped over a cross to the far side of the penalty area and, with Wigan's defenders distracted by the forward runs of Welbeck, Zaha and Giggs, van Persie timed his incursion perfectly, arriving completely unmarked

United's supporters were getting their Moyes sent out United in a 4-3-3 formation first look at England winger Zaha, who inspired Palace to win promotion to the Premier League before completing his move to Old Trafford in the close-season.

Van Persie wants Rooney to stay

Robin van Persie has spoken of his desire for Manchester United teammate Wayne Rooney to remain at Old Trafford this season, in an interview published on Sunday.

Unsettled Rooney is wanted by Chelsea, who have already had two bids for the England marksman turned down by United.

Although United manager David Moyes publically insists Rooney is not for sale, press rumours continue to claim he will soon be leaving the Theatre of Dreams.

But someone who is desperate for him to stay is strike partner Van Persie, who says one of the reasons he came to the club in the first place was his desire to team up with the 27-year-old. "Everyone wants Wayne to stay and deep down I think he

feels the same," Van Persie told The Sun newspaper. "One of the reasons I joined Manchester United was to play with Wayne. I hope he stays. Not only is he a great

goalscorer, he does so much work across the pitch. "He hates to lose - that's why you see him one minute pressing for goal, the next minute defending ferociously. He is an asset to any team.

"He will come good again. He is a strong lad." Rooney has not featured in any official friendlies in preseason as first a hamstring and now a shoulder injury have hampered his quest to gain full fitness.

He has been training with the reserves this week in a bid to accelerate his return to fitness but was still left out of the squad for Sunday's Community Shield against Wigan.

He was picked by England manager Roy Hodgson for next week's international friendly against Scotland but Moyes believes Rooney is not yet ready to play.

"I had a long conversation with Roy about it last week," Moyes told MUTV.

"Wayne has had a shoulder injury. He has been sore with it, which has meant he has not been able to have any contact, so he hasn't trained with us (the first team).

"He has trained a little bit with the reserves as a noncontact player, a floating player, so at least he got a little bit of football work.

"He trained with the first team today (Saturday) and he did a bit of extra work, so he is probably more likely to be ready for England than he will be for us.

"You've got to remember he has had no football practice. "I explained all this and I would only expect Roy to play him for a short time."

BD-A, U-19's batsmen fail again

Bangladesh A continued their dismal run in the warm-up phase of its tour of England falling to a seven-wicket defeat to Lancashire at Old Trafford yesterday in their third game. Half-centuries from Naeem Islam (57) and Shamsur Rahman (51) were the major contributions as the batting faltered to 171 all out in 47.3 overs. Lancashire's Arron Lilley and Steven Croft with three wickets apiece were the pick of the bowlers, while Stephen Moore's quickfire 61 provided the impetus for the chase to be completed in 33.1 overs.

Bangladesh A had earlier lost to Yorkshire by seven runs at Leeds on Friday.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh Under-19, who are participating in a tri-nation tournament, fell to a seven-wicket loss to Pakistan Under-19 at the Kibworth Cricket Club New Ground. Nazmul Hossain Shanto with 46 was-the top scorer as his side scored just 149. Pakistan had no trouble in chasing down the paltry target with seven wickets and 18.1 overs to spare. Pakistan U-19 won the sides' previous match

on Friday by eight wickets.
