Ten people were killed and eleven others injured in separate

Our staff correspondent reports, a 15-year-old street hawker, Uzzol, died when a local bus ran him over at Bijoy Sarani intersection in the capital.

Police arrested the driver.

Our Mymensingh correspondent reports, two persons were killed and four others injured when a truck rammed the CNGrun auto-rickshaw carrying them at Bonkua village in Bhaluka upazila.

The dead were Abdul Karim, 21, of Tangail, the autorickshaw driver, and its passenger Selim Miah, 22, of Sagardighi. The injured four of a family are undergoing treatment at Mymensingh Medical College Hospital.

Our Gazipur correspondent adds, two persons died when a train rammed a vegetable laden shallow engine-run threewheeler when it was crossing rail tracks at Daripara near Arikhola Railway Station in Kaliganj upazila, despite the bar was down yesterday.

The victims are Md Russel Mia, 22, the three-wheeler driver, and Rahim Uddin Gazi, 35, a vegetable vendor, of Narsingdi.

Our Khulna correspondent adds, an auto-rickshaw driver, Kamal Hossain, 45, Rupsha upazila, died when a bus of Satabdi Paribahan hit him at Power House Intersection in Khulna city.

A Comilla correspondent adds, an unidentified person was killed and five others were injured as bus of Eagle Paribahan collided head-on with a pick-up van at Chiowra in Chauddagram upazila.

Meanwhile, an unidentified woman, around 35, was killed and two children were injured when a tractor hit the CNG-run auto-rickshaw carrying them at Barella at Debidwar upazila.

In another accident, Faruk ahmed, 13, son of Sultan Ahmed, died when a bus rammed his bicycle at Chhoygoria in Chandina upazila.

A Sherpur correspondent adds, Rumana Hamid, 25, of Jamaplur, died after the motorbike she was on collided head-on with a locally assembled three-wheeler, Bhotbhoti, at Bakchar Kantipara in Shreebordi upazila.

# 1971 ideals must be defended

### Sylhet citizens' rally told

Speakers at a citizens' rally in Sylhet city yesterday said the ideals of the Liberation War should be defended at any cost, and none should dare to hurt the spirit.

The country's women have made the national economy vibrant but Hefajat-e Islam wants to take them backwards, said Professor Emeritus Anisuzzaman.

"If we want to ensure the rule of law, all should stand up unitedly against the backdated ideas of Hefajat," he told the programme in Sylhet district administration auditorium. "We want to see Bangladesh as a welfare state and a secular country to uphold the spirit of the hardearned independence."

"Bangladesh Rukhey Darao", a Dhakabased platform of civil society members, organised the division-level rally with a fivepoint demand, including banning of Jamaate-Islami and Islami Chhatra Shibir, accelerating the trial of war criminals, resisting communal violence, and thwarting any move to make Bangladesh a Taliban-style state.

The platform's Sylhet chapter convener Prof Abdul Aziz, also vice-chancellor o Metropolitan University of Sylhet, chaired the rally. Laying importance on accelerating the

war crimes trial, Anisuzzaman, one of the 33

conveners of the platform, said Jamaat had employed lobbyists at home and abroad, including Europe and America, to foil the process of the trial. He called upon all to join the forum's national conference in the capital in September. Former adviser to a caretaker government

Sultana Kamal gave her reactions to the observations of Human Rights Watch, a USbased rights body, about the war crimes verdict against former Jamaat chief Ghulam Azam. She said, "We don't need to go much to justify the misdeeds of Jamaat and its leaders during 1971."

Liberation War Museum trustee Sarwar Ali and Dhaka University's Prof MM Akash also spoke. Sylhet Press Club President Ahmed Nur read out the demands.

#### CURRENT POLITICAL CRISIS BNP leader fears civil war if not solved soon

The country may plunge into a civil war if the present political crisis centring restoration of the caretaker government system is not resolved within the next two or three months, BNP standing committee member Lt Gen (retd) Mahbubur Rahman said yesterday.

"A severe political crisis is going on in the country. The only way to resolve it is holding dialogue between the two rival camps--Awami League and BNP," Rahman, also an exarmy chief told a discussion at the capital's Jatiya Press Club. United Democratic Front organised it, demanding

release of the leaders of different political parties. Separately, senior BNP leader Khandaker Mosharra Hossain yesterday claimed that the government wanted to stay in power by force through not holding the next parlia-

mentary polls. "But their [government] daydream of staying in power won't come true, as 90 percent of the country's people support BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia's movement on the caretaker government system," he told a discussion of

Doctors Association of Bangladesh at Jatiya Press Club. The pro-BNP body organised it demanding release of Daily Amar Desh acting editor Mahmudur Rahman and Odhikar Secretary Adilur Rahman Khan.

Mosharraf, also a BNP standing committee member, claimed that the government was planning to hand over power to a third force after creating anarchy in the country. "But consequences of such thinking will not bring good for you [government]," he added.

## Take decision on sending Bali home

Indian Supreme Court asks govt

The Supreme Court of India yesterday directed the central government of India to take a decision regarding sending Shukharanjan Bali, a witness in the war crimes case against Jamaat leader Delawar Hossain Sayedee, back to Bangladesh.

The apex court of India has given full freedom to the Indian government to take decision about Bali who sought political asylum in India on August 12, reports BBC Bangla. Bali earlier pleaded with an Indian court to not send him

ing India illegally. According to his family and lawyers, he may face harassment in Bangladesh if he returns. Kolkata High Court recently dismissed Bali's plea for

back to Bangladesh after he finished serving time for enter-

asylum, as neither Bali nor his family could provide any proof in support of his claim. The verdict said Bali can be sent back to Bangladesh any

day after August 20. "Such fear was just an assumption," the High Court of

Kolkata observed. Bali, who was originally a prosecution witness but according to the defence later agreed to testify for Sayedee,

went missing from the International Crimes Tribunal premises in Dhaka on November 5 last year. Indian Border Security Force (BSF) arrested him in

Shwarupnagar area of Uttar Chabbish Pargana on December 23 last year for trespassing.


