Ever since the new format of the players' transfer of this year's Dhaka Premier League was announced-- where clubs would have to depend on a lottery-based, rotational system to buy their desired players -- there

were talks about how the clubs with the earliest calls would go after the likes of Shakib Al Hasan and Tamim Iqbal in the very first round of bidding.

However, as it turned out, of the four players from the A plus category it was national captain Mushfigur Rahim who was bought first by Sheikh Jamal for Tk 22 lakh, the fixed grade price, in the transfers which took place at a city hotel yesterday.

Last year's champions Victoria, who were second in line for the round, bought Nasir Hossain. Tamim, who is set to return from Brothers Union.

The fourth buyer in line was Abahani and with three out of the four players of the grade already sold, everyone expected them to buy Shakib. However, in a rather surprising move Abahani decided against buying the ace allrounder and passed their chance to Kalabagan Krira Chakra, who seized the opportunity.

Abahani officials stated that they were focussed on building a young team without

Along with Mashrafe the club also bought promising batsman Shamsur Rahman, veteran Rajin Saleh and slow left armer Saqlain Sajib.

Victoria, signed up national players Anamul Haque Bijoy and pacer Robiul Islam to go with their A+ grade signing of Nasir.

Sheikh Jamal, after signing Mushfiqur in the first round, also bought Abdur Razzak and Jahurul Islam in the second and third rounds.

Last year's runners up Gazi Tank bought national vice-captain Mahmudullah Riyad. Imrul Kayes, Rubel Hossain and Rakibul the West Indies today, was bought by Hassan are among the other players bought by the club.

The league is scheduled to begin on September 3. However, it might be delayed by a few days since some of the clubs are yet to fix their jerseys and contact their foreign players. With regards to the payment of the players, 40 per cent of the fees are supposed to be paid when the contract is signed, 30 per cent after the first round of the tournament and the remaining within one month of the end of the league.

The booters will have their first practice session today, four days before the start of the SAFF Championship.

dent about doing well. If we can make it through the group stages, we have a great chance of reaching the final. The first match will be a big match for us," said striker Wahed Ahmed, who is in good scoring form. Bangladesh take on Nepal in the opening

match of the competition at the Dashrath Stadium in Kathmandu on August 31. Bangladesh's second match is on September 3 against defending champions India and their last group match is on September 5 against Pakistan.

Pakistan have already had their first practice session yesterday, having reached Nepal on the previous day. India will reach Nepal tomorrow.

Snicko could rule out DRS

The International Cricket Council (ICC) is considering using "Snicko" technology in the next Ashes series in Australia, the ruling body's chief executive Dave Richardson told the BBC on Sunday. The current series between

England and Australia has been dogged by controversy surrounding the Decision Review System and there have been problems with the "HotSpot" technology which is supposed to show whether the ball makes contact with the bat.

"Snicko will probably be the first bit of technology introduced," Richardson said. "It's always been reliable."

Big defeat in hockey

The Bangladesh hockey team got their 9th AHF Asia Cup campaign off to a frustrating start, losing 0-9 against three-time champions South Korea at the Azlan Shah Stadium in Ipoh, Malaysia yesterday.

They conceded four goals in the first half and five more in the, three of those coming in the last three minutes.

Bangladesh took defensive approach from the beginning, pulling down the midfielders in the backline. The Koreans, who launched attacks one after the other, won nine penalty corners in the first half, converting only 2, and five more in the second, converting two more. Goalkeeper Zahid Hossain had to be at his best to deny a number of attacks and penalty corners. At 6-0 and into the last

five minutes, Bangladesh looked like pulling a goal or two back, but lack of control from strikers cost them as instead they conceded 3 more goals in the last 3 minutes.

Coach Naveed Alam said it is never easy to contain a team like Korea and thinks a 6-0 defeat would have been far more ideal.

Bangladesh had lost by an identical margin against the powerhouse in their last meeting in the 2009 Asia Cup.

"Our boys forgot their duty. The first 45 minutes was good from us even though we conceded four goals. But we lost in the last few minutes," said Naveed adding that he was hopeful of winning today's match against Oman.

Year's final Grand Slam begins today

Once the hunter, now the hunted, Andy Murray is braced for an all-out assault on his US Open title from

rejuvenated Rafael Nadal and world number one Novak Djokovic.

Murray ended Britain's 76-year wait for a Grand Slam men's champion by triumphing in New York in 2012 and backed it up with his historic Wimbledon victory this year, the first by a British man since Fred Perry in 1936.

The Scot beat Djokovic to win the US Open 12 months ago and repeated

the dose against the Serb at the All England Club six weeks ago.

But it is Nadal, rather than Djokovic, who is tipped to win a second title in New York, to add to his 2010 victory, and clinch a 13th career major.

The 27-year-old Spaniard missed the 2012 tournament as he rested his troublesome knees, part of a sevenmonth injury lay-off which stretched from the second round at Wimbledon to Vina del Mar in Chile in February.

Since his return, Nadal has racked up nine titles, including five Masters, and boasts a win-loss record of 53-3.

His only blip was a first round

trauma at Wimbledon, his bitter-sweet relationship with grass courts rekindled far too quickly after the draining march to an eighth French Open just two weeks earlier.

Meanwhile in the women's draw, world number one Serena Williams enters the US Open as a heavy favourite to defend her title, but secondranked Victoria Azarenka leads a host

of rivals looking to dethrone her. Williams is seeking her 17th Grand Slam singles crown and fifth US Open title, which would move her one shy of Chris Evert's Open-era record for most titles at the year's final major event on the Flushing Meadows hardcourts.

The window of the interclub players' transfers opens today as the Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) yesterday

approved the bylaws of the upcoming 7th Bangladesh Premier League.

The game's governing body approved the professional football league committee's proposal to incorporate suspension for players and monetary fine for clubs in the bylaws of the league but rejected another proposal of allowing members of the BFF executive committee at the dugouts during the league.

The decisions were taken at an emergency meeting of the BFF executive committee after the professional football league committee

had on Saturday sent their proposals to the highest body for final approval.

The game's governing body however kept last season's decision of not allowing any members of its executive committee at the dugouts during the league matches, though it relaxed the rules to allow the BFF members to stay at dugouts during the Super Cup last season.

The meeting also exempted the remaining 10-month suspension on Rahmatganj MFS official Salahuddin Kala, who was handed over a three-year suspension for his involvement in designing a 'compromised match' with eventual champions Sheikh Jamal DC in the fourth professional league.

The season will start with the Federation Cup, slated to begin at the end of October, after the completion of the transfers on

Test drawn in bad light

England clinch Ashes series 3-0 AFP, London



England and Australia drew the fifth Ashes Test at The Oval on Sunday as the

series win.

hosts wrapped up a 3-0 England, set a target of

227 for victory in a minimum of 44 overs, after Australia declared their second innings, needed just 21 more runs to win off 24 balls on the final day when the umpires, controversially, took the players off the field for bad light at 7.35pm local time.

As play had gone beyond the scheduled close, a restart was impossible and England finished on 206 for five off 40 overs with Chris Woakes 17 not out.

This draw meant Australia had failed to win

a single Test in an Ashes series for the first time since a 3-0 loss in England in 1977, and left them winless in their last nine Tests against all opponents.
