A member of the Grameen Bank Commission has recommended maintaining the present share structure of the microlender.

Ajmalul Hossain QC, one of the three members of the body, has also suggested that the government enact a law for Grameen Bank that is now run by an ordinance formulated in 1983.

The renowned lawyer submitted a 44page report to the finance ministry on Friday. He had been assigned to report on the legal issues from the findings of the commission's investigation into Grameen Bank and its 48 associated organisations.

The suggestion regarding the share structure may reassure the borrower-directors, employees and supporters of Grameen Bank as the commission had a plan to recommend increasing government stake in SEE PAGE 10 COL 5


