Reigning European champions Bayern Munich were paired with Manchester City for this season's Champions League group stage, while the draw was partic-

ularly unkind for Arsenal and Celtic. The draw, made in Monaco on Thursday evening, threw up several mouthwatering ties as well as bringing

together plenty familiar foes.

Under Pep Guardiola, Bayern are looking to become the first club to retain the European Cup in the Champions League era. They were drawn in Group D along with Manchester City, the Premier League giants who previously faced the Bavarians in the 2011-12 competition.

On that occasion, City finished bottom of their section while Bayern went all the way to the final, and

Roberto Mancini's side also failed to progress from their group last season.

This time, though, City are expected to pose a greater threat under Chilean coach Manuel Pellegrini, who has taken Villarreal and Malaga to the latter stages in the past and came up against Guardiola's Barcelona when in charge of Real Madrid in 2009-10.

Those two clubs are likely to fight it former Liverpool defender Sami Hyypia. out for first place in a group that also contains Russian champions CSKA Moscow and Czech club Viktoria Plzen.

The draw was even kinder to 2012 and Napoli. European champions Chelsea. The Blues will face Bundesliga club Schalke, 1986 European Cup winners Steaua Bucharest and FC Basel, who lost to Chelsea in the Europa League semifinals last season, in Group E.

taking the opposition lightly in what will be his first Champions League campaign at the helm of Manchester

United.

The English champions will be favourites to qualify for the last 16 from Group A but they must still face Ukraine's Shakhtar Donetsk, Spanish outfit Real Sociedad and Bayer Leverkusen.

Barcelona lifted the first silverware of the Spanish season on away goals after a 0-0 draw with Atletico Madrid in the second-leg of the Spanish Super

Cup on Wednesday night. Following the 1-1 draw in the first-

leg, the Catalans were left to thank goalkeeper Victor Valdes for preserving their advantage as he pulled off incredible saves from Arda Turan and David Villa either side of half-time.

Barca should have then sealed victory on the night themselves as after Filipe Luis was sent off for Atletico, Lionel Messi fired a late penalty off the bar.

Barca boss Gerardo Martino had handed a first start to Neymar as the Brazilian and Lionel Messi lined up for the first time in a competitive match since the former's switch from Santos.

And with the South American duo in attack, Barca started brightly as Messi was just denied by a last ditch challenge by Luis and Alexis Sanchez fired wide from Jordi Alba's dangerous cross.

Having weathered the early storm though, Atletico then started to gain a foothold and had the two best openings of the opening period.

Firstly Koke failed to connect properly when he was teed up at the edge of the box allowing Valdes to save easily before the Barca keeper made a stunning save to turn behind Arda's sweetly struck volley.

Valdes was called upon again after the break as he parried Villa's curling effort from the edge of the area as Atletico went in search of the away goal they needed to stay alive in the tie.

The more the visitors pushed forward though, the more they were susceptible to the Barca counter-attack and the Catalans passed up a host of opportunities to put the tie to bed.

Neymar was the biggest culprit as he squared when he ought to have gone for goal himself at the back post from Dani Alves' cross midway through the second-half.

Atletico were then reduced to 10 men when Luis saw a straight red card after he clashed with Alves off the ball on 80 minutes.

Barcelona under Guardiola outshone Mourinho's Real Madrid, and the latter's largely unhappy reign there came to an end at the end of last season.

That left the self-anointed 'Special One' needing to prove he has not lost his touch at delivering trophies, and where better to start than by beating his old rival in the process. Guardiola for his part took a year out --

stepping aside after Real ended Barcelona's reign as champions in 2012 -- and returned refreshed to take over a Bayern side that last season won the domestic double and the Champions League.

Finch smashes record score

Hafeez propels Pak victory

A commanding century by Mohammad Hafeez and a four-wicket haul from left-arm seamer Junaid Khan led Pakistan to a series-levelling victory over Zimbabwe in the second one-day international on

Thursday.

After Hafeez had carried Pakistan to an imposing total of 299 for four with an unbeaten 136, Junaid stubbed out a promising run chase by the Zimbabweans to secure a a 90run win and set up a series decider on Saturday.

Captain Brendan Taylor led Zimbabwe's reply from the front with an assured 79, but his dismissal saw the hosts collapse from 200 for four in the 39th over to 209 all out in the 43rd as Junaid finished with figures of 4 for 15.

Taylor had shared partnerships with Hamilton Masakadza, Sean Williams and Malcolm Waller as Zimbabwe laid a platform for what would have been the highest successful run chase at Harare Sports Club, only for Junaid and Saeed Ajmal to snuff it out.

French midfielder Mathieu Flamini has returned to Arsenal after being released by AC Milan, the Premier League club announced on Thursday.

The 29-year-old central midfielder made 153 appearances for Arsenal between 2004 and 2008 before leaving for Milan, where he spent five seasons.

He has been training with the Arsenal squad for the past month and Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger said he was delighted to have Flamini back on board.

"We are very pleased Mathieu has agreed to rejoin us," Wenger told the Arsenal website, www.arsenal.com. "He is a player of real quality, with a fantastic work rate

and great mentality. "As we know, Mathieu is a strong midfielder, but is also comfortable playing in defence too. He is a very good addi-

tion to our squad." Wenger also revealed on Thursday that the club will be without Lukas Podolski for up to 10 weeks after the German forward damaged his hamstring in Tuesday's 2-0 win over Fenerbahce.
