





The beautiful world of solitude

Ganesh Haloi's exhibition at Bengal Gallery

"Nature has always been my greatest source of inspiration. I always try to communicate with nature. The nature that surrounds us is an endless source of beauty and mystery. I find inspiration in the finest details, like light filtering through the leaves, the silence of nature, a drop of rain, foliage, a fragment of white in a blue sky etc. Each of these elements contains a new story for me and an invitation to embark on a new journey," says noted Indian artist Ganesh Haloi, sitting in a cozy room at the Dhaka Club.

The painter's solo art exhibition, titled "Rhythm of Beauty" is now on at Bengal Gallery of Fine Arts in Dhanmondi.

Haloi is a nature painter. His keen aptitude is to draw the philosophical aspect of nature, volume and colour and to create sensitive lyrical compositions. At the exhibition, his gouaches and watercolours both are fresh, contemplative and provide the spectators a sense of bliss. His artworks are lively and have the right kind of restraint. He knows where to stop.

"I feel rhythm is the main root of all creations. Nature has its own rhythm and my main focus is to unfold the pulse of nature. Loneliness and quiet are the most important features in the works. You are alone with nature, and then you become part of it – you participate in it," utters Haloi.

Haloi's themes and approaches are closely connected to physiological experiments. He has also added illusion and emotion to his works. His use of colours is thick, expressive and nostalgic. He is simulta-



neously a water colourist and oil painter. His watercolours are superb in terms of his personal techniques and in creating the effects of water and essence of nature. The artist's technique is particularly based on flat wash and thick colour. He seeks to depict the spirituality and mysticism of nature.

Haloi himself has said of his works, "I merge so completely with the landscape that I lose my own identity. The landscapes are part of me." It might be his quest for identification of landscapes in his life. Haloi was born at Jamalpur in our country. He moved to Kolkata in 1950 after the partition. This tragic part of his life has of uprooting has left a mark of trauma on his works. "I still remember the Brahmaputra River, and its people, villages and untainted nature around it. Some of my friends are still living there. After migrating there (Kolkata), we stayed at a refugee camp in Ranighat,

Kolkata," Haloi recalls. The artist creates his own territory

with marks in varied colours, curves, semi-curves, encircled lines and other forms. He feels that if anyone intimately observes nature, he or she could easily notice the motifs. It has been comprehended that most of his compositions have the sternness of geometrical designs, yet the artist makes nature come alive. His works in watercolours have a richness and maturity which he has achieved after working for years.

Lines, dots and dashes turn to mysterious symbols for soil, water, birds, trees, foliages, green fields in his works. He expresses his preoccupied state in his artworks through the subject of catastrophe and malleability. At 77, his works are precisely linked to his thoughts, commotion and his experiences. His style is scholarly. He successfully maintains good craftsmanship standards along with depiction of nature and environment, and child-

hood memories. The exhibition ends on

September 8.

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
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IT'S TRUE
