EU worried over unsolved cases

A European Union (EU) deligate yesterday expressed concern over the culture of impunity that perpetrators seem to enjoy in Bangladesh given the high number of criminals who go unpunished and cases of crimes against journalists that remain unsolved.

Migrant workers may face horrors

Labour attachés tell conference

Bangladeshi nationals working abroad with manual passports may face difficulties if they fail to obtain machinereadable passports (MRPs) by March 31, 2015, said labour attachés of Bangladesh foreign missions yester-

The workers will face difficulties in renewing their work permits, obtaining new visas and even returning to the country, they said at a five-day conference organised by the Ministry Of Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas

Employment in a Dhaka hotel. They said the Bangladeshis with manual passports have been asked to apply for MRPs by March 31, 2015.

Referring to the deadline set by the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO), the attaches said the Bangladeshis will have to return home upon expiry of their visas as they will not be able to renew work foreign workers in the next five years.

"A large number of Bangladeshi workers are working without MRPs in Malaysia. They will face difficulty in changing their visa status if they fail to obtain MRPs before the deadline,' said Malaysia labour council member Mantu Kumar Bishwas.

He urged the government to take steps for providing MRPs for the Bangladeshi workers in Malaysia quickly as the country has already started a crackdown on illegal foreign nationals.

Muhammad Maqsudur Rahman, labour attaché of Bangladesh embassy in Qatar, said the workers whose passport and visa validity will expire before the MRP deadline have to return to Bangladesh as they cannot renew their work permits.

He urged the government to create skilled manpower to tap into the opportunity for working in Qatar as the country has a plan to hire one million


