Lightning kills 4 youths

Four youths were killed and five others injured by lightning at Namajgram Pacher Baor in Benapole yesterday afternoon. The dead are Saddam Hossain, 17, son of Bhatto Mia, Bappi Hossain, 18, son of Billal Hossain, Imran Hossain, 16, son of A Jobbar and Motiar Rahman, 30, son of Mofizur Rahman of Mankia village under Benapole port police station in the district. Mizanur Rahman, officer in-charge of Benapole port PS said the four were struck by lightning while catching fish at Pacher Baor, a water body, at Namajgram village at around 5:00pm. The injured were sent to Navaron Hospital in the upazila.

Prisoner dies at hospital

A prisoner of district prison died at Sadar Hospital on Saturday night. The deceased was identified as Ashraful Islam, 25, son of Abdul Kuddus of village Arpara in Kaliganj upazila of the district. Jailor Mohammad Abdullah said that the youth was brought to the prison on August 27 after a court sent him to jail in a case filed with Kaliganj police station. He fell sick at about 8:00pm on Saturday and taken to Jhenidah Sadar Hospital where he died at about 9:30pm. The reason behind the death could be known after getting the post mortem report, the jailor said.

College girl found dead

Police on Saturday recovered the body of a college girl from a private dormitory at Dakkhin Ramnagar of the town. The deceased, Aysha Siddiqi, 19, was an honors first year student of Zoology at Dinajpur Government College and daughter of Mansoor Ali of Kaliganj village in Haripur upazila of Thakurgaon. The owner of the dormitory told police that they found the girl hanging from the window at her room in the morning. Police recovered the body but they could not ascertain whether it was a case of suicide or murder.

Minor boy 'commits suicide'

A minor boy allegedly committed suicide yesterday morning at Dakkhin Salondar village in Sadar upazila. The deceased was Saimun Islam Santa, 11, son of Khalesur Rahman of the same village and a student of Class-VI at Thakurgaon Police Line High School. Police and family sources said, Khalesur Rahman brought a pair of new shoes for his elder daughter on Saturday evening. When Saimun also demanded new shoes, his father beat him and later Santa went to bed without taking meal. Yesterday, his mother Sefali Begum again beat him as he was going to school without taking food. Following the incident, Santa committed suicide by hanging himself from a beam of his room with the help of a scarf.

Farmer killed in Satkhira

A farmer was stabbed to death at Bakchara village in Sadar upazila yesterday morning. Local people found the body of Abdul Khaleq, 40, of the village in a shallow machine room near his home and informed police in the morning. On information, police recovered the body and sent it to Sadar hospital morgue for autopsy. Additional police superintendent Joydev Chowdhury said the body bore a few marks of injury. The motive behind the killing could not be known immediately.

Youth stabbed to death

A youth was stabbed to death allegedly by his cousin following a family feud at Birgaon village in Nabinagar upazila on Saturday night. The deceased was identified as Mainuddin, 20. Witnesses said, when Mainuddin's cousin Ibrahim was beating his (Ibrahim) wife, Mainuddin tried to stop him which led to an altercation between them. At one stage, Ibrahim stabbed Mainuddin with a sharp weapon around 8:30pm, leaving him critically injured. He was rushed to Bhairab upazila health complex where the doctors declared him dead. Ibrahim went into hiding soon after the incident.

Housewife found dead

Police recovered the body of a housewife at Nekmarad Faridpara village under Ranishankoil upazila yesterday. The deceased was identified as Kanchan, 19, wife of Nasirul Islam of the same village. Police and locals said Nasirul and his wife often engaged in family feud. On Saturday night, Nasirul and Kanchan locked in an altercation over a trifle matter when Nasirul returned home at late night. Family members informed police that they later found Kanchan hanging from a beam of their room in the morning.

Boy electrocuted

A 10-year old boy, who worked at a welding shop died from electrocution at his workplace in Adamdighi upazila on Saturday. The deceased was identified as Masum Rana, son of Ilias Ali of Sudin village of the upazila. Police said, Masum died on the spot when he came in contact with a live electric wire while working at the welding shop at about 12:00pm. Welding shop owner Palash Hossain went into hiding soon after the incident.

Mawa launch service to resume today

Launch service on Mawa-Kawrakandi route will resume today, after a suspension for 11 days following a chaotic situation centring vandalism of a launch at Mawa terminal on August 22.

The launch owners agreed to resume service on the route following a meeting at the office of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority yesterday, said Khondakar Shamsuddoha, chairman of the organistaion.

Meanwhile, Mawa-Kawrakandi ferry route continues to see huge pressure of vehicles following disruption of ferry service on Daulatdia-Paturia route.

The goods laden trucks bound for southern parts of the country remained stuck in a three-kilometre-long tailback at Mawa yesterday.

Several truck drivers alleged that they could not get the ferry service although they have been waiting for more than three days while a section of ferry staff in collusion with law enforcers are adding to the problem by allowing some vehicles to break the serial in exchange of bribe.

"The route is experiencing excessive pressure due to the stalemate at Daulatdia-Paturia ferry route. Thirteen vessels engaged in ferrying vehicles are struggling to cope with the increasing pressure from passenger vehicles and goods laden trucks," said Sirajul Haque, manager of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Corporation, Mawa office.

A good number of passengers are now crossing the route on speedboats while many others have hardly any option other than the ferry service meant for vehicles.

REMOTE KHEBUKPARA IN BANDARBAN

Basic civic amenities elude 75 families

The people of Khebukpara village in Sadar upazila under the district are still deprived of basic civic amenities including safe water and sanitation although Chittagong Hill Tracts Development Board (CHTDB) implemented a rubber plantation project there around 20 years ago.

CHTDB rehabilitated 75 families in Khebukpara in 1994, providing each household five acres of land -- 3.75 acres for rubber cultivation and 1.25 acres for home-steads gardening.

The residents are still outside the jurisdiction of electricity supply from Power Development Board (PDB) although people of nearby Dakbungalow, Bridgeghata areas are getting the facility.

On a limited scale, Grameen Shakti arranged electricity supply from solar panels in the area but it is too expensive for most people.

"I took solar panel from the company on condition of paying Tk 750 as monthly instalment for three years. Sometimes, I fail to pay the instalment in time due to financial problem," said Bihari Chakma, a villager.

Unu Mong Marma, Uchimong and Lal Chandra Chakma have similar tales to tell.

Under the CHT electrification project, PDB in 2009-2010 fiscal year installed poles and wires but locals are yet to get power supply.

"Earlier the government authorities installed some tube-wells but those went out of order shortly afterwards. We are now using water from wells for drinking and cooking," said Painkranu Marma.

Visiting the area recently, this correspondent saw women fetching water from nearby wells and ponds for cooking and drinking.

People use old and unhygienic toilets. Consequently, water borne diseases often affect people, especially children and elderly ones.

People do not know about hygiene practice as absent of government programme and even no one NGOs reached the area.

As there is no school in the village, primary students there have to walk about four kilometres to reach Rajvira Primary School and secondary level students have to make a 20-kilometre bus journey to go to Bangalhalia High School.

TWO UPAZILAS OF PABNA

Padma devours around 150 homesteads in a week

Erosion by the River Padma devoured around 150 homesteads and over 1000 bighas of cropland under Sujanagar and Ishwardi upazilas in the last one week.

A large number of erosion-hit people have taken shelter on roads and high land, said an official of Water Development Board (WDB) in the district.

The river eroded at least 100 houses and 600 bighas of farmland in Khapur Char, Charsada and Degree Char villages of Sujanagar upazila, said Md Moshirur Rahman, chairman of Nazirganj union parishad.

The union office, Nazirganj Bazar, Goaria Bazar, Nazirganj School and other establishment are facing erosion threat, he said.

Despite repeated pleas, the authorities are yet to take any steps to protect the erosion, he alleged.

Meanwhile, more than 40 homesteads and 500 bighas of cropland at Arambaria and Majhdia villages in Ishwardi upazila went into the river during the period, said Jarjis Hossain, chairman of Sara union parishad.

Tk 1 lakh was allocated by the upazila administration, which was too small an amount to thwart the erosion, he said.

However, a number of sand bags have been dumped at different erosion points to check the erosion, said the chairman.

The points include Arambaria school, Boropara mosque and Majhdia graveyard, he said.

Rony's men give death threats to 2 plaintiffs

Golam Maula Rony's men allegedly have given death threats to two plaintiffs who filed cases against the AL lawmaker and his 27 aides.

They issued the threats -- one on August 30 after getting bail from the High Court and the other on August 31.

Both the plaintiffs filed separate GDs (General Diary) with Galachipa police station on August 31 night in this connection.

Badrul Islam Khan, president of Dakua union unit of the ruling party, sued Rony and his men on charges of extortion with Galachipa police station on August 11 while Abdul Mannan Howlader, a businessman of Ullania bazar under Galachipa upazila, filed another case with the police station on July 27, accusing

Rony and 16 others, accusing them of extortion, snatching and attack.

According to the GD, Rony's close associates, who got interim bail from the High Court recently gave death threat to Badrul at about 6:00pm on August 30 at Pangashia bazar in Dakua union.

They told Badrul that if he did not withdraw the case against them, they would kill him.

On the other hand, at about 5:30pm on August 31 at Ullania bazar they threatened Abdul Mannan in a similar way.

Contacted, Shishir Kumar Paul, OC of Galachipa police station admitted that the two plaintiffs filed separate GDs with the PS.

"We will take lawful action matters after proper investigations," the OC said.

FOUNDING DAY FUNCTIONS

40 injured as rival BNP groups clash

At least 40 people were injured as rival BNP factions clashed in Sirajganj and Lalmonirhat districts while marking the party's 35th founding anniversary yesterday.

More than 30 BNP men, including two policemen, were injured in a clash between two rival groups of the party in Ullahpara upazila of Sirajganj yesterday.

The law enforcers fired at least 70 rubber bullets to bring the situation under control, reports our Pabna correspondent.

Police and locals said, the supporters of upazila BNP president Akbar Ali brought out a procession on the occasion of the party's 35th founding anniversary at noon.

When the procession reached nearby Jhikra graveyard the men of upazila BNP secretary Azad Hossain attacked the supporters of Akbar, triggering a clash.

At least eight cocktails were exploded during the incident, leaving 28 from both sides injured. Two policemen were also injured.

Of the injured, municipality BNP joint secretary

Md Aulia and activists Abdul Bares, Saidul Islam, Farhad Hossain and Abdus Sobur Khan were admitted to Ullahpara upazila health complex while the rest given first aid.

Contacted, Akbar Ali and Azad Hossain blamed each other for the incident.

In Lalmonirhat, at least 10 BNP men were injured in a clash between two factions of BNP while celebrating the 35th founding anniversary of the party in Hatibandh upazila town yesterday.

The injured were admitted to Hatibandha upzila health complex, reports our correspondent.

Police said when a procession, led by upazila BNP president Mosharaf Hossain, was parading the streets in the town, another procession, brought out by another group, led by district BNP vice president Jaynal Abedin, came face-to-face at a point, triggering a clash.

Contacted, Mosharaf Hossain and Jaynal Abedin blamed each other for the attack.

Additional police personnel have been deployed to avert any further untoward incident, said Tapos Kumar Sarker, OC of Hatibandha police station.
