JnU students clash with shopkeepers

Vehicles damaged, 4 hurt in the brawl erupting when one didn't want to pay watch repair cost

Four people were injured and several vehicles were vandalised in a clash between retail goods traders of Patuatuli market and students of Jagannath University yesterday over paying the repair cost of a watch. Police arrested a student named Srabon, a Jatiyatabadi

Chhatra Dal member, in this connection.

A student of Jagannath University went to get his watch fixed at the shop from which he bought it about two months ago; but he refused to pay the cost of the repair work, said Dr Ashok Kumar Saha, proctor of the university.

He said the student and shopkeeper argued over it and the student claimed that at one point the shopkeeper slapped him.

The student told his friends on the campus about the incident and then about 20 to 25 students went to the shop, ransacked it and beat up the staff, Dr Saha said.

The traders of the market then closed their shops and protested the incident vandalising several vehicles in the process. They then clashed with students of the university and hurled brick chips at the university building smashing its windows, said university sources.

The officer-in-charge of Kotwali Police Station claimed that the students that ransacked the shop are all activists of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal.

However, denying the allegation, Faisal Ahmed Sajal, president of Jagannath unit of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal, said, "We had a meeting at Suhrawardy Udyan and we were busy preparing for it, so our activists could not be involved in the incident."

'Bangladesh First' quiz PW statement recording, cross-examination end

Judge to read out the depositions on Sept 9

The trial of the country's biggest ever murder case, over the 2009 BDR carnage, yesterday marked a big step forward with the court wrapping up recording statements and cross-examination of prosecution witnesses. Counsels of former BNP lawmaker

Nasiruddin Ahmed Pintu, one of the accused, yesterday finished cross-examining the case's Investigation Officer (IO) Abdul Kahar Akand, whom the court had decided was the last prosecution witness. Out of 1,333 prosecution witnesses, the

makeshift court in the capital's Bakshibazar recorded statements of 654.

Judge Mohammad Zohurul Hoque fixed September 9 to read out the witnesses' statements against the accused and to ask the

accused whether they were guilty. The court will then ask the accused Pintu to harass him politically, he alleged. whether they will produce defence witnesses

to claim themselves innocent. Once their depositions are recorded and they are crossexamined, the court will hear arguments from the prosecution and the defence.

The court will then fix a date to deliver judgement. Yesterday, Khandker Mahbub Hossain, Aminul Islam and Md Shahjahan cross-

examined the IO, a Criminal Investigation Department special superintendent. Noted lawyers Rafique-Ul Huq, former attorney general AJ Mohammad Ali and BNP leaders Moudud Ahmed and Rafiqul Islam

Mia were also present to represent Pintu.

Aminul said the addresses which three prosecution witnesses against Pintu gave have houses owned by former Awami League lawmaker Haji Selim, a political rival of Pintu.

The witnesses are loyal to Selim and the Awami League-led government implicated

Allegations Against JU VC Probe body formed

The government yesterday formed a two-member probe commission to resolve the stalemate at Jahangirnagar University over some teachers' demand for removal of Vice Chancellor Prof Anwar Hossain.

The commission led by University Grants Commission member M Muhibur Rahman will submit its report in 15 working days, said an official order of the education ministry. The second member is the ministry's Joint Secretary Mohammad Ahasanul Jabbar.

The order came upon a directive of President Abdul Hamid, also chancellor of JU. On August 24, Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid at a

meeting with the agitating teachers, who had confined the VC to his office for four days since August 21 to force him to quit, assured them of investigating their allegations against Prof Anwar. The crisis at JU began on April 6 when Bangladesh

Chhatra League's JU unit General Secretary Rajib Ahmed Rasel assaulted a teacher. The agitating teachers demanded Prof Anwar's removal for not expelling Rajib. They also accused him of doing anomalies in teachers' appointments, ruining the campus by taking up unnecessary projects, and misusing funds.


