The Bangladesh U-19 football team started their preparation yesterday for the qualifying round of the AFC U-19 Championship with 33 players joining the residential camp.

The players, who were picked through an open trial, are following the training schedule prepared by Dutch coach Rene Koster. Local coaches Mahbub Hossain Roxy and Golam Rabbani Choton are conducting the training and Rene will take charge following the completion of his role with the national team which is playing the SAFF Championship in Nepal at

present.

Bangladesh were drawn along with last edition's runners-up Iraq, mighty Kuwait and Pakistan in Group C of the qualifying round of the AFC U-19 Championship, which will be held in Iraq from October 8-12. The top team from each of the nine groups and six-best second place side will qualify for the 16-team finals where hosts Myanmar will be playing directly.

The AFC U-19 Championship will also serve as the qualifiers from Asia for the FIFA U-20 World Cup with top four sides of the 2014 finals booking their places in the 2015 U-20 World Cup to be held in New Zealand. Bangladesh finished fourth among five teams in the last edition of the qualifying round which was held in Dhaka.

u19s start preparations Real unveil Bale

Gareth Bale's prolonged transfer from Tottenham Hotspur to Real Madrid was finally completed for an unconfirmed world record fee on Sunday after the Spanish club offi-

cially announced the move. "Real Madrid and Tottenham have reached an agreement for the transfer of Gareth Bale," confirmed a statement on the

club's website. "The player will be tied to the club for the next six seasons."

Widespread reports in England have suggested that the move will make Bale the world's most expensive player with Real set to pay 101 million euros (\$133.5 million, £86 million) for his services.

However, media in Spain insisted on Sunday that Real will only pay 91 million euros, three million less than Los Blancos paid for Cristiano Ronaldo back in 2009.

Gareth Bale hailed his move to Real Madrid as a "dream come true" as he was officially unveiled in front of 20,000 fans at the Santiago Bernabeu on Monday. "It is a dream come true for me to play for

Real Madrid," he said in Spanish, to the delight of the local fans.

Real Madrid president Florentino Perez had earlier welcomed Bale to the club and repeated Spurs chairman Daniel Levy's sentiment that the player's desire to move to Madrid had played a key role in the deal.

"We are in this temple of Real Madrid to incorporate a new man who knows very clearly what are the values of this club," Perez said.


"A man who has been chosen as the best player in the Premier League last season. A young footballer but with great qualities, committed to the sport and whose dream has been to be a Real Madrid player.

Kaka back in Milan

Brazilian midfielder Kaka has completed a return to AC Milan on a two-year contract after the Serie A side agreed a deal with Real Madrid, the Italian club confirmed Monday. "Done deal", Milan CEO Adriano Galliani

announced on the club's website, adding that discussions ran until "around 0235-0240 CET" Monday morning before the move was completed.

According to the Italian press, Real allowed the 31-yearold to return to his former club on a free transfer, having paid 65 million euros to bring Kaka to Madrid in 2009.

"I'm going home!" the player told journalists at a Madrid airport before boarding a flight to Milan, where he landed shortly after Monday lunchtime.

The Brazilian was said to have taken a significant pay cut to facilitate his move to the San Siro, accepting an annual salary of four million euros plus bonuses, a considerable reduction from the 10 million euros a year he received in Madrid.

"I'm very happy, the talks took a long time. Money was never one of my priorities," Kaka told Milan Channel, the Italian club's TV station, upon his arrival at the Milan-Linate airport.

The Brazilian had fallen out of favour in Madrid while former boss Jose Mourinho was in charge and had yet to feature for the Spanish side this season following the arrival of new coach Carlo Ancelotti.

"When I understood that there was no longer space for me (at Real), I had to leave," said Kaka.

"I really want to play. It's a special year because there is the World Cup. First of all I have to do well for Milan, but I think the club can help me play in the World Cup," added the Brazilian, who has scored 29 goals in 87 appearances for his country.

Kaka's first spell at the Rossoneri, from 2003 to 2009, coincided with his rise to prominence that culminated in him winning the 2007 Ballon d'Or after leading Milan to the Champions League title that year.

Demichelis joins City

Atletico Madrid defender Martin Demichelis has joined Manchester City on a two year contract, the Premier League side announced on Sunday.

The 32-year-old Argentina international is renewing his ties with City's Chilean manager Manuel Pellegrini, the pair having worked together at both River Plate and Malaga.

"I am delighted to have joined City because I am still hungry for success and want to improve," Demichelis told City's website.

"I have been in Europe for 11 years now and this was a great chance for me to play in the Premier League with such a big club.

"When there is a change, there is always a process. There's always a period of adjustment you have to go through. Moving from South America to Europe is a big change and you need some time to settle in because everything is new.

"But in my case, I have lived in Europe for many years and I don't think there'll be any problems in adjusting to life here."

Montella's Fiorentina the lead at Genoa after 10 minutes before Giuseppe Rossi scored his second in as many games four minutes later and Gomez tapped in his goal four minutes before the break.

Alberto Gilardino gave the home side some hope nine minutes after the break with a stunning volley, but Rossi tapped in his second almost immediately afterwards.

A first-half hattrick by Lionel Messi ensured Barcelona maintained their 100 % start to he La Liga season with a thrilling 3-2 win over Valencia as Real Madrid also made it three wins from three games on

Sunday. Messi had looked far from his best in Barca's Super Cup victory over Atletico Madrid in midweek, but looked more like his old self as he put Barca 2-0 up inside 39 minutes and was then brilliantly set up by Neymar to complete his hattrick.

However, Valencia were amazingly back in the game by half-time as Helder Postiga struck twice in first-half stoppage time.

Barca then passed up a host of chances to put the game to bed in the second-half and were nearly punished when Jonas struck the post four minutes from time.

Neymar had already had a goal ruled out for offside when Cesc Fabregas sprung Valencia's high line with a fine through ball on 10 minutes and Messi evaded challenge from Adil Rami and Diego Alves to bundle home from close range.

Victor Valdes was then forced into a fine save to deny Dorlan Pabon levelling on his debut for Los Che.

in control of the game, Barca struck twice in

two minutes. Firstly, Sergio Busquets robbed the ball in midfield to allow Fabregas to set Messi free again to roll into the far corner.
