Obama warned as he met key congressional leaders at the White House that Syrian President Assad must pay a price for violating an international norm by unleashing what the US has said was sarin gas on a Damascus suburb last month.

The use of such weapons not only resulted in "grotesque deaths" but also risked falling into the hands of terror groups or "non-state actors," Obama warned.

"That poses a serious national security threat to the United States and to the region," Obama said. "And as a consequence, Assad and Syria needs to be held accountable."

Just over an hour later, John Boehner, the Republican speaker of the House of Representatives -- who has fought tooth and nail with Obama on domestic policy -- emerged from the West Wing with a firm endorsement of the president's strategy. least 34 people and leaving

"I am going to support the president's call for action," Boehner said.

Many of these loans were given against false documents and without adequate collateral, according to the BB probe report.

Allegations are rife that many of the loans were granted to nonexistent companies in exchange of kickbacks which, according to some borrowers, were 10-12 percent of the total "He [Bachchu] has
