Quasem indicted

He faces 14 war crimes charges; trial starts Sept 30

The International Crimes Tribunal-1 yesterday indicted Jamaat-e-Islami leader Mir Quasem Ali on 14 charges, including murder, torture, abduction and confinement of people and complicity in crimes against humanity during the Liberation War.

A member of Jamaat's executive council, Quasem, 60, pleaded not guilty by saying, "Honourable tribunal, I am completely innocent."

The tribunal also fixed September 30 for the

opening statement of the prosecution and the commencement of the trial. Born in Munsidangi Sutalori of Manikganj on December 31, 1952, Quasem became the general secretary of Islami Chhatra Sangha, the then student wing of Jamaat-e-Islami, on November 7, 1971.

Chhatra Sangha members formed the Al-Badr force to collaborate with the Pakistani military to commit genocide and mass killing during the war, according to historical records and earlier tribunal verdicts. The charges say that Quasem had led members of the Al-Badr of Chittagong in 1971.

Rejected, he killed her

For Saoda, the story is this: She was loved and killed by the same man.

The 18-year-old succumbed to the mortal injuries she suffered in an attack by her former lover yesterday.

But that was just yesterday. Before that the boy, Russell Mia, 20, had been in love with her for at least one year, or so sources at Barisal University where the two studied say.

Their relationship turned sour about a month ago when Russell proposed to the girl, upon which her parents rebuked him, said Prof Harunur Rashid, vicechancellor of the university.

Following this, the girl had been trying to avoid him over the past one month. Infuriated, Russell hacked her with a knife in the back and neck around 8:30am on

BIBIYANA-1 POWER PROJECT

Summit contract cancelled

The government has decided to end the deadlock over the Bibiyana phase one power project by terminating the contract with Summit Power and encashing its \$3 million bid bond.

The power ministry on Monday asked the project's implementer Power Cell to take action on the ground that Summit could not close its finances for the 341 megawatt gasfired power plant by its final deadline

of February 12, 2013.

The power producer is currently implementing Bibiyana gas-fired phase two and Meghnaghat dual fuel power projects of similar sizes. It won all the three contracts in late 2010 through open tenders by quoting lowest prices.

But soon after signing the contracts in 2011, Summit faced problems with arranging finances. The company faulted the government for not being able to help it obtain a \$200 million
