Sea Spat: Philippines recalls envoy to China

The Philippines has recalled its ambassador to China for consultations, the foreign department said yesterday amid fresh tensions in a seething maritime territorial row.

Ambassador Erlinda Basilio flew back to Manila as the defence department this week accused China of laying 75 concrete blocks on disputed territory in the South China Sea, foreign department spokesman Raul Hernandez said.

Russia, UK agree nuke reactor deal

Russian state nuclear company Rosatom, Rolls-Royce and Finnish utility Fortum yesterday agreed to consider building nuclear power plants in Britain.

The agreement was signed after talks between Rosatom chief Sergei Kiriyenko and British Business and Energy Minister Michael Fallon in Moscow.

China 'watch' official gets 14 years in prison

A Chinese official who became known as "Brother Watch" because of his taste for luxury timepieces was convicted of corruption and sentenced to 14 years in prison yesterday, reports said.

Yang Dacai first came under scrutiny from Chinese Internet users after he was pictured grinning broadly as he assessed the twisted wreckage of a bus and a methanol tanker following an accident which left 36 people dead last year.

The former work safety boss in the northern province of Shaanxi was later derided online after images of him wearing various luxury brand watches were tracked down and circulated.

Blast hits Pak girls' school; 11 wounded

A bomb wounded 11 people, mostly children, when it exploded outside a Pakistani girls' school yesterday, a doctor said.

The bomb went off at the end of the school day as pupils walked into a street lined with fabric shops in the northwestern town of Bannu, which has been a flashpoint for Islamist mili-

tancy. Doctor Omar Zeb told AFP that 11 people had been brought to the local hospital -- seven primary schoolgirls and four other people who had been in the street. There was no immediate claim of responsibility.

Modi says he wants to serve

Gujarat till 2017

Playing down his prime ministerial aspirations, Gujarat chief minister Narendra Modi yesterday said he never dreams of holding the top post as he is bound to respect the mandate given to him by the people of his state till 2017.

"Those who dream of becoming something end up destroying themselves. One

should not dream of becoming something, but one should dream of doing something," Modi said when a student asked him whether he will come and interact with them in 2014 after 'he will become the Prime Minister'. "I never see such dreams (of

becoming PM), nor am I going to see such dreams. People of Gujarat have given me a mandate to serve them till 2017 and I have to do this with my full strength," Modi said.

The BJP strongman, who is in the race for the party's PM candidate, was replying to questions asked by students who had gathered at a function for felicitating best teachers of

the state on the occasion of Teacher's Day. Modi shared the dais with state governor Kamla Beniwal at the function for the first time after fresh confrontation between them. Beniwal has returned the controversial Gujarat Lokayukta Bill for reconsideration to the government with stinging remarks.

Modi's comments come at a time when opposition Congress is gunning for his resignation and has given a call for Gujarat bandh on Friday over an IPS officer's resignation.

Pacific leaders sign plea for action

Pacific leaders yesterday signed a declaration committing themselves to urgent action on climate change and pleading with the rest of the world to follow their lead on an issue that threatens their existence.

Members of the 15-nation Pacific Islands Forum (PIF) finalised the so-called Majuro Declaration, named after the Marshall Islands' capital where they gathered this week, saying it should be a "game changer" in stalled efforts to address global warming. The declaration contains specific pledges

on cutting greenhouse gas emissions and adopting renewable energy from each of the PIF nations, some of which are barely a metre (three feet) above sea level and face being swamped by rising waters.

Marshall Islands President Christopher Loeak said the declaration was only the beginning, adding "the real work begins now" to persuade the rest of the world to also take concrete action on the issue.

"We want our Majuro Declaration for climate leadership to be a game changer in the global fight against climate change," he

will for the world to adopt legally-binding climate change targets by 2015.

The mission begins on Friday when the PIF leaders meet with representatives of 13 countries attending the summit as dialogue partners, including major polluters such as China and the United States, and attempt to sign them up to the declaration.

The PIF will then present it to United Nations Secretary General Ban Ki-moon in New York to bolster his efforts to forge an ambitious new climate agreement.

Egypt minister survives assassination bid

Egypt's Interior Minister Mohamed Ibrahim yesterday survived a bomb attack on his convoy, emerging unscathed to warn the country faced a "wave of terrorism" amid a sweeping police crackdown on Islamists.

Security officials said a car bomb struck the minister's convoy around 10:30am near his home in the Nasr City area, in the first such attack in Cairo in years. The bombing, which comes as the security forces press a clampdown on

loyalists of ousted president Mohamed Morsi, has sparked fears of a resurgence of the Islamist militant attacks that plagued Egypt in the 1990s. The interior ministry said the blast was "possibly caused by a suicide

bombing in which a powerful bomb was placed in the truck of a car." It said 10 policemen and 11 civilians were wounded in the attack, updat-

Afghan Taliban shoot dead Indian author

Suspected Taliban in Afghanistan have shot dead Indian author Sushmita Banerjee, writer of a popular book about her dramatic escape from the militants in the 90s, police said yesterday. Police in insurgency-hit Paktika prov-

ince, in the east of Afghanistan, said they found the body of the 49 year old yesterday morning, after the militants dragged her out of her husband's home late in the night and shot her repeatedly in a nearby location. "We found her bullet-riddled body near a

madrassa on the outskirts of Sharan city (the provincial capital) this morning," provincial police chief Dawlat Khan Zadran told AFP, confirming earlier reports from Indian media.

Banerjee's book "Kabuliwala's Bengali Wife", about her escape from the Taliban, was made into a Bollywood film in 2003.

Police suggested the book may have been

the reason the militants went after her.

"She had been shot 20 times and some of tants," police said.

200 languages lost in India AFP, New Delhi

More than 200 languages have vanished in India over the last 50 years, a new study says, blaming urban migration fanned out across India, visiting comand fear among nomadic tribes of speaking their traditional tongues.

The extensive study, conducted throughout the country over four years and released this week, has found 230 languages have "elapsed" while another 870 have survived the test of time in richly diverse but rapidly modernising India, home to a vast number of indigenous or tribal peoples.

Ganesh Devy, who spearheaded the survey, said 480 tribal languages are among those still spoken in India, where Hindi and English are strengthening their grip in an increasingly mobile and interconnected world.

"I am concerned and alarmed that a very large number of languages have been rapidly declining in India," Devy,

an author and founder of the non-profit Bhasha Trust, which seeks to preserve languages, told AFP.

Devy's team of 3,000 volunteers munities in the most remote parts of the country of 1.2 billion people, to study and document living languages spoken and written today.

The team scrutinised evidence of the existence of a language such as a community's use of folk songs and stories in their mother tongue as well as terms used for their geographical surroundings.

The team compared their findings with the results of a government census conducted in 1961 which stated that some 1,100 languages existed throughout the country.

India's constitution lists 22 official languages, with Hindi as the main official language and English -- the preferred language for business and academics -- given associate status.

Maldives faces democracy test after 'coup' violence

The Indian Ocean archipelago of the Maldives goes to the polls this weekend for a presidential election that will test its young democracy 18 months after a violent change in leadership.

Political unrest in February 2012 briefly threatened the country's vital tourism sector, which draws a million well-heeled visitors a year, following the ousting of former president Mohamed Nasheed.

Nasheed, a scuba-diving former democracy activist, won the Maldives' first free vote in 2008, but resigned last year after a mutiny by police officers.

The 46-year-old denounced it as a coup, saying he was forced to step down at gunpoint, and accused then vice-president Mohamed Waheed of conspiring with former dictator Maumoon Abdul Gayoom to replace him.

Waheed's ascent to the presidency a resort tycoon and one of the country's sparked months of protests and violent clashes, meaning observers -- particularly regional power India -- are anxious for a Gayoom. clear and uncontested result tomorrow.

Looking relaxed as he posed for photos with supporters, held babies and stroked a kitten, Nasheed said he was confident of win-

ning an outright majority in the first round.

Maldives, an election monitoring group, said campaigning by Nasheed, Waheed and the two other candidates had so far taken

place "smoothly and peacefully". Waheed, a Stanford-educated former UN diplomat who lacks his own political base, is widely forecast to come last in tomorrow's election. He declined to be interviewed by AFP for this article.
