Coaches want window shortened

Europe's leading soccer coaches want the transfer window to be shortened, contradicting the position of their clubs.

"The clubs like it as it is but the coaches are of the opinion that the market should be closed earlier," Tottenham Hotspur coach Andre Vilas-Boas told reporters after a meeting at UEFA headquarters.

"The coaches need time to prepare their teams for the season," he added.

"Most coaches would like it be open less time and closed earlier; obviously we will have to have further meetings."

Ozil's arrival excites Podolski

Injured Arsenal star Lukas Podolski has said he is relishing the chance to "rock" the Gunners alongside his Germany teammate Mesut Ozil after the latter signed a five-year deal. Podolski is expected to

miss the rest of 2013 after tearing his left hamstring in the Gunner's 2-0 win over Fenerbahce in last week's Champions League play-off but is relishing the chance to play for Arsenal alongside ex-Real Madrid star Ozil in the new year.

"Mesut and I are going to rock Arsenal," Podolski told German daily Bild.

"It's great that he's coming, he's a good friend and a brilliant footballer."

The 24-year-old Ozil joined Arsenal for 50 million euros (\$65.94 million) on Monday and left winger Podolski said he is relishing the prospect of linking up with Germany's

midfield play-maker. "He's a great fit for us. We're already playing great football, the only thing that was missing was the final punch, that element of surprise," said Podolski.

Big guns eyeing Brazil

Some of Europe's leading nations can clinch qualification for the 2014 World Cup finals in a double-header of fixtures over the next week, start-

ing on Friday.

Four-time world champions Italy, the Netherlands and Germany will all be in a position to book their flights to Brazil, while the situation in all of the continent's nine qualifying groups will become clearer before the final fixtures in October.

Cesare Prandelli's Italy have taken 14 points from a possible 16 in qualifying Group B without ever producing

their very best form. The Azzurri are four points clear of Bulgaria and five ahead of Czech Republic at the top of the group, so wins against both teams in Palermo and Turin in the next week will be enough to confirm qualification.

The Netherlands have cruised through Group D so far, winning all six qualifiers, and that run appears unlikely to end when they go to Estonia on Friday and then Andorra next week, even with Rafael Van der Vaart out injured.

Wins in those games will see them qualify irrespective of what nearest chal-

lengers Romania and Hungary - who meet in Bucharest on Friday -- can achieve.

Germany need other results to go their way if they are to stand a chance of sealing first place in Group C this month, with Joachim Loew's side currently five points clear of Austria, Sweden and Republic of Ireland.

Germany face Austria in Munich's Allianz Arena on Friday, and wins there and in the Faroe Islands on Tuesday will be enough if Ireland and Sweden slip up.

Elsewhere on Friday, reigning European and world champions Spain play their first competitive fixture since their Confederations Cup final defeat to Brazil when they face Finland in Helsinki.

Spain are top of Group I but, with a lead of just one point over France, they still need to win their remaining three fixtures to be certain of a return to Brazil next year.

Fight for places

Argentina and Colombia will look to wrap up qualification for next year's World Cup as South America's battle for places at the finals in Brazil enters the home stretch.

Leaders Argentina have a bye for Friday's round of fixtures but will be able to guarantee their 11th consecutive World Cup appearance with victory

over bottom team Paraguay in Asuncion next Tuesday. Second-placed Colombia meanwhile will go level on points with the Argentines and stand on the threshold of a first World Cup appearance for 16 years if they defeat thirdplaced Ecuador in Barranquilla on Friday.

The Colombians' preparations for their clash with Ecuador have been disrupted by an injury to star striker Radamel Falcao, who twisted an ankle in Monaco's clash with Marseille in Ligue 1 last weekend.

Colombia team doctor Carlos Ulloa said Falcao was responding well to treatment but rated the forward as doubtful for Friday's showdown with their bitter rivals at the Estadio Metropolitano Roberto Melendez.

'Real move was stressful'

Gareth Bale said his drawnout move to Real Madrid for a world record transfer fee was "stressful to say the least".

The 24-year-old joined Madrid from Tottenham Hotspur on Sunday for 100 million euros (\$131.97 million), a fee which made him the world's most expensive player, the day before the transfer window closed and after months of speculation about his future.

"It was a long time. It was very stressful to say the least," Bale told BT Sport on Thursday.

"I knew their interest from the start and I was always confident the move would go through but obviously the chairman Daniel Levy had to do his business and do Tottenham well so I kind of understood that.

"But at the same time, thinking of myself, it was a hard time, it was stressful and I just had to be patient and try and focus."

Bale is currently preparing for Wales's upcoming World Cup qualifiers against Macedonia and Serbia after being unveiled at Madrid's Bernabeu on Monday.

He has not played since July and missed most of Spurs' pre-season training due to injury, so is unlikely to play the full 90 minutes in either Friday or Tuesday's qualifier.

"It's obviously been a whirlwind few days," the former Southampton player said.

Messi repays taxman

Barcelona star Lionel Messi and his father have repaid five million euros (\$6.6 million) owed to the taxman before facing court on tax evasion

charges, according to a judge's ruling obtained Thursday. The tax fraud charges filed in June were a stunning blow to the prestige of Messi, long seen as a more humble figure than most top-class footballers -in particular his fierce Real Madrid rival Cristiano Ronaldo.

The ruling by a judge in Gava, a Mediterranean coastal town near Barcelona, said the Argentine player's father Jorge Messi had deposited 5.02 million euros with the court on August 14 to cover more than four million euros in unpaid taxes, plus interest.

The judge rejected a prosecutors' request for the 26-year-old Argentina international

to be obliged to deposit a financial bond so as to ensure he pays any fine on the tax charges.

A bond was unnecessary "given the worldwide renown of professional footballer Mr. Lionel Andres Messi Cuccittini and his resulting solvency," the judge said, also citing the fact that the taxes had been repaid.

The judge said he was consulting with the prosecution before making a ruling on a separate request by Messi's lawyers for the planned September 17 hearing to be postponed.

Prosecutors have charged the four-time World Player of the Year and his father with defrauding the tax office of income related to the use of his image from 2006-2009.

Messi and his father are accused of trying to deceive the state by ceding the player's image rights to companies based in tax havens such as Belize and Uruguay so they would pay no tax in Spain.

Younis leads fightback

Veteran Younis Khan led a Pakistan fightback after his side lost three early secondinnings wickets on the third day of the first Test against Zimbabwe at the Harare

Sports Club on Thursday. Pakistan were 168 for four at the close, a lead of 90 runs, with Younis unbeaten on 76.

Younis and fellow veteran, captain Misbahul Haq, ground out a fourth-wicket stand of 116 after their side, who trailed by 78 runs after the first innings, slipped to 23 for three against Zimbabwe's new ball bowlers Tinashe Panyangara and Tendai Chatara.

It was slow going against accurate bowling on a pitch of occasional low bounce. The partnership occupied 48.4 overs and Pakistan were still in trouble when Misbah played too early at a slower ball from Shingi Masakadza and gave a simple catch to cover. Misbah made 52 off 157 balls, with four fours.

Younis and Asad Shafiq saw out the day and will resume on Friday, with a new ball due after 10 more overs. Shafiq was 15 not out.

They will aim to take their side to a total which will give off-spinner Saeed Ajmal a chance of bowling Zimbabwe out. Ajmal took seven for 95 in Zimbabwe's first innings of 327.

Ajmal took all three Zimbabwe wickets that fell on Thursday as the host nation added 46 runs to their overnight 281 for seven.
