Youth hurt in BSF firing

A Bangladeshi cattle trader was injured as Indian Border Security Force (BSF) opened fire on him on Molani border in Haripur upazila of the district on Friday night. The man was identified as Anwar Hossain, 26, son of Azimuddin of Moradhar village in the upazila. Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) sources said a patrol team of BSF from Sripur camp opened fire on a group of cattle traders including Anwar at night, leaving him injured. Other cattle traders brought Anwar to a safe place and his family later admitted him to hospital.

Arrest of 'rapist' demanded

Students of Lahiri Bohumukhi High School formed a human chain on Lahiri-Baliadangi road at Lahiri village under Baliadangi upazila on Saturday demanding arrest and punishment of a teacher for allegedly raping a student. Several hundred students of different institutions of Lahiri Bazaar area joined the programme. They also brought out a procession that paraded different streets of the bazaar. The programmes was followed by a discussion where the speakers demanded immediate arrest and punishment of an assistant teacher of the school who allegedly raped a female student of Class-X several days ago in a classroom when she came alone to take lesson from him. The teacher was suspended immediately and a case was filed.

46 rescued on border

Members of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) rescued 46 people while they were being trafficked to India through Sadipur border point here on Friday night. On information, a team of BGB-26 battalion raided the spot around 10pm and detained 46 people including women and children, said BGB commander Motiur Rahman. All the victims hail from different parts of Dhaka, Narayanganj, Narail, Khulna and Faridpur districts. The human traffickers, however, managed to flee the scene.

Attack on teacher protested

Several hundred students of two government high schools formed a human chain in front of the press club in the town yesterday noon, demanding arrest and exemplary punishment of the criminals who hacked and injured a teacher on Friday night. The two schools are Chapainawabganj Government Girls High School and Horimohon Government High School. The protesters later handed over a memorandum to the deputy commissioner. Mohammad Kamruzzaman, a teacher of Chapainawabganj Government Girls High School was attacked at Gabtala intersection by a group of masked criminals. Severely stabbed, he was rushed to Chapainawabganj Adhunik Sadar Hospital. None was arrested in this connection.

Abducted girl rescued

A girl abducted from Joydebpur of Gazipur district on Thursday was rescued at Chatiangram under Adamdighi upazila of the district on Friday night. One Ashraf Islam, 25, son of Shamsul Islam of Dakkhin Durgapur under the upazila was arrested in connection with the abduction. Police said that the father of the victim filed a case with Joydebpur police station Friday. Acting on a tip-off, police of Adamdighi and Joydebpur jointly raided a house at Chatiangram village and rescued the girl and also arrested the alleged abductor.

AMANULLAH MURDER

104 BNP men sued in Satkhira, 7 held

A case has been filed against 104 BNP men in connection with the killing of district Jatiyatabadi Matsyajibi Dal general secretary Amanullah Aman.

Fatema Khatun, mother of the deceased, filed the case against 54 identified and 50 unidentified BNP men with Sadar police station early yesterday.

In the case, district unit BNP president and former lawmaker Habibur Islam Habib has been made the prime accused.

The other accused include district Jubo Dal president Abul Hasan Hadi, its secretary Aynul Islam Nanta, Swechchhasebak Dal convenor Tariqul Hasan and Kalaroa upazila unit Jubo Dal chief Abdul Kader Bachchu.

Police arrested seven people including Sadik Anwar Chhoto, general secretary of Jatiyatabadi Matsyajibi Dal unit of Assasuni in this connection.

Amanullah Aman, 35, district Matsyajibi Dal general secretary, was killed and a dozen others were injured in a clash between two groups of BNP at Shilpakala Academy in Satkhira town around 11:00am on Friday over taking seats on the podium during a workers' meeting of the party.

Dumki BNP calls hartal to protest Jubo Dal attack

Dumki upazila unit of BNP has called for a half day hartal in the upazila town today, protesting attack on unit president Khalilur Rahman at Lebukhali ferry terminal on Friday night.

Police and witnesses said Jubo Dal men led by upazila unit president Ripon Sharif swooped on Khalilur Rahman when he along with some party men went to Lebukhali Ferry Terminal at around 9:00pm.

They used sticks and sharp weapons, leaving Khalilur Rahman and four others injured. Khalilur Rahman sustained serious injuries and is undergoing treatment at Patuakhali General Hospital.

Cop kicks door, causing tragic death of woman

An elderly woman met a tragic death as her house door, allegedly kicked by a policeman, hit her on the head when a team went to arrest her son at a village in Kathalia upazila under the district on Friday night.

The deceased is Nasera Begum, 70, wife of late Chhunu Mia of Uttar Chorail village in Kathalia upazila.

Accompanied by two constables, Mehedi Hasan, sub inspector (SI) of Kathalia Police Station, went to Talukdar Bari of Uttar Chorail village to arrest Ameer Hossen, 45, warranted in a case with Jhalakathi court, said Md Tofazzal Hossen, officer in

charge (OC) of the police station.

"When the policemen reached our house on Friday midnight, the SI ordered us to open the front door. As nobody opened it, the SI broke open the door," said Ameer. "Then the SI kicked the room's door when my mother was opening it. The door hit the head and face of my mother. After that she fell on the ground and died on the spot," he said.

Asked about the matter, SI Mehedi said, "I heard a sound inside the room when I was waiting at the door. After Ameer opened the door, I entered the room and found the body of the woman lying on the floor, bleeding. Then I did not

arrest Ameer on humanitarian grounds."

"I called a local doctor who advised sending the woman to hospital. She died when I went to arrange a vehicle for her," he added.

The body was sent to Jhalakathi Sadar Hospital for autopsy to find out the real cause of the death, said OC Tofazzal Hossen.

"We will file a case against the police who went to our house and killed my mother," said Moniruzzaman, another son of Nasera Begum.

Md Mohidul Islam, additional superintendent of police, Jhalakathi, said they will take action through proper investigation after getting the autopsy report.

No trace yet of two abducted sisters

Police are yet to rescue two abducted daughters of a schoolteacher in Teknaf upazila of the district.

Both were kidnapped by armed gangs from their house at Shikderpara village in the evening of July 4 and on the night of August 15. Of the victims, one is a class eight student of Nhila High School in Teknaf while the other a first year student of Cox's Bazar Government College.

Victims' father, also the headmaster of Nhila High School, filed two abduction

cases—one on July 5 against Ayaz Uddin, Joynab Bahar, Tobarak Hossain, Mobarak and Abdullah and another on August 16, accusing Jasim Uddin, Saiful Islam, Emran, Md Abdullah, Saiful Karim, Abu Bakar and Rahim Ullah of the area, said OC Md Farhad of Teknaf Police Station.

Though police arrested two of the accused, they could not rescue the girls and arrest the remaining accused as of yesterday. The teacher has already sent his third daughter to a safer place, fearing the same incident.

Launches on strike again

Launch owners yesterday again went on a strike, demanding fresh route permits to 31 launches of Mawa-Kawrakandi route.

The sufferings of hundreds of passengers mounted again as the launch service came to a halt, only six days after resumption on September 2.

Launch owner Md Iqbal Hossain said the decision to cancel route permits of 31 launches was withdrawn following talks with the chairman of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authorities (BIWTA) on Sunday night.

But the BIWTA traffic inspectors continued to harass the 31 launches, prompting the owners to go on the strike, he said.

Rival FFs in Dinajpur clash, 10 injured

At least 10 people were injured as two groups of freedom fighters of Dinajpur district Muktiyoddha Sangsad clashed in the town yesterday.

Siddique Goznabi, deputy commander of Dinajpur Muktiyoddha Sangsad, is among the injured. They all are undergoing treatment at Dinajpur Medical College Hospital.

Wahedur Rahman, chief engineer of LGED and vice chairman of central Muktiyoddha Command, convened a meeting of the

district and upazila commanders of Rangpur division on the premises of local LGED office.

Two rival groups of Dinajpur Muktiyoddha Sangsad—one led by Siddique Goznabi and the other by immediate past commander Syed Mokaddes Hossain Bablu—were present at the meeting with Wahedur Rahman in the chair.

When Bablu was proceeding towards the dais to deliver his speech at around 11:30am, his rivals led by Goznabi chanted slogans against him.

At one stage, they locked in a scuffle and hurled chairs

at each other, leaving at least 10 people from both sides injured. Goznabi group had earlier brought corruption charge against Bablu, saying that he misappropriated the fund of the sangsad.

Being informed, police rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control. The two rival groups blamed each other for the incident.

Meanwhile, Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) Dinajpur office is investigating the graft charge brought against Mokaddes Hossain Bablu by his rivals.

MEMO TO TWO PRIME MINISTERS

'Implement enclave deal'

The representatives of the people living in Indian enclaves inside Bangladesh territory submitted a memorandum to the prime minister through the deputy commissioner of Lalmonirhat yesterday demanding implementation of the enclave exchange agreement between Bangladesh and India.

Demanding the same, the Bangladeshi enclave dwellers in India also submitted memorandum to the Indian prime minister through the district magistrate of Cooch Behar in Pashchimbanga the same day, said Azizur Rahman, general secretary of Lalmonirhat district unit of Enclave Exchange Coordination Committee.

Bangladesh-India Enclaves Exchange Coordination Committee will hold rally at all the enclaves, stage sit-in in front of the offices of upazila nirbahi officers and deputy commissioners in the areas concerned and observe hunger strike in the capital, Golam Mostafa, general secretary of the committee in Bangladesh side, said at a meeting in Tin Bigha Corridor area yesterday morning.

"If we do not get any result, finally we will lodge a case about our demand with the

International Court of Justice by this year," he said.

The committee in Indian part will also observe similar programmes, said Abdul Hamid Aktery, vice president of Lalmonirhat district unit of the committee.

"Now we are in a do or die situation as numerous initiatives regarding the problem between India and Bangladesh have resulted in only lip services," he said.

There are 111 Indian enclaves in Bangladesh, including 59 in Lalmonirhat, 36 in Panchagarh, 12 in Kurigram and four in Nilphamari districts, and 51 Bangladeshi enclaves in Cooch Behar district of Pashchimbanga in India. The Indian enclaves in Bangladesh comprise 17,149 acres of land while Bangladeshi enclaves in India amount to 7,110 acres.

A joint census conducted in July 2011 found 37,334 people living in Indian enclaves in Bangladesh and 14,215 people in Bangladeshi enclaves in India.

Following creations of the enclaves on both sides of present India-Bangladesh border during the partition of 1947, the people living there are undergoing indescribable sufferings as they are virtually deprived of citizens' rights and basic civic amenities.
