English in Schools 2nd Phase The Baily Star, Robi sign BPC high-ups deal for launching

The Daily Star entered into a contract with telecommunications giant Robi yesterday to launch next month the second phase of the "English in Schools", a programme aiming at enhancing English language skills of the secondary school students.

Mahfuz Anam, editor and publisher of The Daily Star, and Michael Kuehner, chief executive officer of Robi, signed the deal at The Daily Star Centre in the capital.

The two organisations under their corporate social responsibility (CSR) programme will jointly provide three copies of the newspaper to each of a thousand secondary schools all over the country five days a week (except Friday, Saturday), initially for six months.

Mahfuz Anam said this was to promote the practice of English among secondary school students. "Newspapers can be used as an instrument for learning English," he said. In the second phase, English teachers from 100 schools in

Rajshahi, Khulna, Chittagong, and Sylhet will be trained in the language skills for six months, said Michael Kuehner.

Mohiuddin Babar, vice president of the Corporate Regulatory and Legal Division of Robi, also spoke at the

The English in Schools programme supported by the education ministry first began in 2009 as a partnership between The Daily Star and Robi, then known as Aktel.

10 injured; party office vandalised in feud over assaulting Hiron's follower

A nearly hour-long clash between the followers of two local Awami League leaders injured 10 activists and left the party office ravaged in Barisal city yesterday.

Police blasted two sound grenades, fired 11 teargas shells and nine rubber bullets, and used batons to stop around 200 people from the two sides from clashing.

The supporters of Barisal city AL President and ex-mayor Shawkat Hossain Hiron and district AL President Abul Hasanat Abdullah got engaged in the fighting following a feud that sparked after some Hasanat loyalists assaulted Mohiuddin Babul, a city AL member and follower of Hiron, in a hotel in the capital Sunday night.

Hiron alleged that Ashim Dewan, president of the district

unit of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) and follower of Hasanat, led around 20 activists in the attack, as Babul, a brother-in-law and former follower of Hasanat, had started supporting the ex-mayor recently.

AL now occupies Sylhet billboards Prime minister visits today

Over 200 billboards of different commercial companies and individuals in Sylhet city were grabbed overnight on Saturday by the ruling Awami League ahead of the visit of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, its president, today.

The AL occupied the billboards in the same way it had done in Dhaka and elsewhere in the country in August and the way BNP had done in Bogra town a day ago.

The digital banners, bearing portraits of Hasina, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, Finance Minister AMA Muhith and AL Central Organising Secretary Misbah Uddin Siraj, describe successes of the government in the last four and a half years.

These were most prominent on Rekabi Bazar, Humayun Rashid Square, Bandar Bazar, Chouhatta, Ambarkhana, Sobhani Ghat and along the Sylhet-Golapganj road.


The advertisement agencies and advertisers, in fear of reprisal, refused to comment on the matter although they were suffering huge losses. Billboards in Sylhet cost Tk 60,000 to 1.25 lakh a year depending on the location. Seeking anonymity, one advertiser said local AL leaders

and activists had not sought permission to replace the advertisements on the billboards. Owner of a firm in Taltola said, "I would ask the city

corporation to look into the matter and ensure that those are removed after the prime minister's visit." Sylhet City Corporation Chief Engineer Nur Azizur

Rahman told The Daily Star that none sought permission to replace or put up the digital canvasses on the hoardings. However, one district AL leader had called to inform that

the billboards were "needed", he said. Asked whether the permission was taken, Misbah said, SEE PAGE 4 COL 3
