

BGB detains 31 trying to go to Malaysia illegally

Members of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) yesterday arrested 31 people on the Teknaf-Cox's Bazar Highway while they were trying to migrate to Malaysia illegally.

Major Shafiqur Rahman, acting commander of BGB-42 Battalion, said acting on a tip-off, a BGB team intercepted a Teknaf-bound bus at Damdamia BGB check post on the highway and detained 31 people traveling by it around 7:00am while they were being trafficked to Malaysia using the sea route. The arrestees hailed from different areas of Jessore, Rajshahi, Bogra, Narayanganj and Narsingdi districts.

During the drive, the BGB men also arrested an alleged member of the trafficking gang. He was identified as Mohammad Ibrahim, a citizen of Myanmar. However, four others of the gang managed to flee the scene.

All the 32 were handed over to Teknaf police yesterday.

Earlier, members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) here on Friday detained 38 people while they were being trafficked to Malaysia.

Acting on a tip-off, a Rab team from Cox's Bazar

Camp raided Hotel Sea Park and rescued them at around 12.15am, said Major Sarwar-e-Alam of Rab-7, who led the drive.

Quoting the victims the major said, they gave Tk two to three thousand each to the middlemen in their respective villages. Later they gathered at a bus counter in Chittagong on Friday and started together for Cox's Bazar on the same day.

In Cox's Bazar, a member of the traffickers' gang was supposed to receive them and take them to a ship or trawler to sail for Malaysia.

27 arrested on border

Members of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) detained 27 people from Putkhali border early yesterday while they were trying to enter Indian territory illegally.

23 BGB commander Lt Col Tayeful Haq said, acting on tip-off, a BGB team raided the border point and detained 13 men, 11 women and three children.

They were being trafficked India without valid documents. The traffickers, however, managed to flee the scene.

Only brother killed to grab property

A teenage boy was killed allegedly by his elder brother in Nishcinnopur area of the town on Sunday, just for enjoying their parental property alone.

Police arrested three people, including the brother, in connection with the killing.

The deceased is Jahid Hasan Joy alias Jony, 18, son of Nur Mohammad of Raninagar upazila in Noagaon and a first year student of Government Azizul Haque College, Bogra. He lived at a mess in the town.

To grab the parental property, elder brother Al-Faruque James, 28, for the last several days planned to kill Jony, said assistant police superintendent Gazipur Rahman.

On Sunday night, James hired a microbus and went to the mess area and called Jony for collecting money for monthly expenditure from him. James tactfully gave Jony sedative with juice and later strangled him.

The elder brother dumped the body at Bejora

Jamtola in the town at 9:00pm and fled the scene, said the ASP.

Police in a drive, however, arrested James in Colony area in the town yesterday morning. On information from the arrestee, Mahmud alias Shourav, 22, son of Mohammad Ali of Phuldighi in Shajahanpur upazila and microbus driver Abdul Mannan, 30, son of late Abdus Samad of Bhatkandi in Sadar upazila were also held.

Uncle of the deceased Nurul Islam filed a murder case, accusing the arrestees yesterday afternoon, said Gazipur.

Unsold sugar at Gaibandha mill godown melting

The godown of Rangpur Sugar Mills in Gaibandha is now packed with 3,267 tonnes of unsold sugar worth over Tk 16 crore, much to the worry of the mill authorities ahead of the next production season starting November.

The sugar produced in the mills has remained unsold for the last two years and some of it has started melting, mill sources said.

The dealers of Rangpur Sugar Mills have declined to draw the product from there at Tk 50 per kg, as sugar of private mills is available at Tk 44 per kg in the open market.

The mills produced 2,737 tonnes of sugar by crushing 49 thousand 375 tonnes of sugarcane in 2012-13 season and 1,509 tonnes of sugar by crushing 28,654 tonnes of sugarcane in 2011-12 season, although the yearly production capacity of the mills is 15,000 tonnes of sugar.

The production cost of the mill stood at Tk 178 per kg of sugar in 2011-12 season and Tk 125 per kg in

2012-13 season against stipulated sale price of Tk 50 per kg and so, the mills sustained losses of crores of taka, official sources said.

The mills, however, earned Tk 3.20 crore by selling 4000 tonnes of molasses (by-product of sugar) at Tk 8,000 per tonne this year.

AL men block highway

Activists of Shahrasti upazila Awami League (AL) blocked the Comilla-Chandpur highway yesterday morning, protesting the filing of case against an AL leader on charge of corruption. Earlier, one Md Muslim Mian, on September 17, filed a case against Md Kamruzzaman Mintu, general secretary of Shahrasti upazila unit of AL on charges of taking Tk 2 lakh from a party during a local arbitration.

BSF picks up cattle trader

Indian Border Security Forces (BSF) yesterday picked up a Bangladeshi cattle trader from Kushumpur frontier of Chuadanga. He was identified as Harun or Rashid, 27, son of Akher Ali of Chapatala village under Moheshpur upazila of the district. BGB Chuadanga-6 Battalion Commander Lt. Colonel Gazi Ashaduzzaman said, Harun was caught by BSF while entering India through Kushumpur border. BGB sent a protest letter to BSF and demanded return of the Bangladeshi national.

UP chairman sued for extortion

An UP chairman and a member and three others were sued on charge of extortion on Sunday night. The accused are Md. Hamidur Rahman, chairman of Bhinail UP in Birampur upazila, Akram Hossain, member of ward-8 of same union parishad and their aides Rafiqul Islam of Achintapur, Golam Kibria of Hamlakuri and Akkas Ali of Chapra village under Birampur upazila. Sarwar Jahan alias Ujjal, a former chairman of same UP, filed the case alleging that the accused recently demanded Tk. 50,000 as extortion from him [Ujjal].

JUBO DAL LEADER KILLING

Jubo League man held in Parbatipur

Police arrested a Jubo League leader in Parbatipur upazila on Sunday on charge of killing a Jubo Dal leader.

The arrestee is Mostafizur Rahman, 32, general secretary of Parbatipur municipality unit Jubo League.

Shiuli Begum, wife of slain Rabiul Islam, Jubo Dal ward president of the municipality, on Sunday night filed a murder case with Parbatipur police station, accusing 22 BCL and Jubo League leaders and activists of the upazila.

Rabiul Islam was stabbed to death allegedly by a group of BCL men on Friday night

following a feud over capturing a railway quarter in the area.

Protesting the murder, local BNP called a half-day hartal in the upazila on Sunday which badly disrupted train services in the western zone.

Meanwhile, railway authorities filed two cases against 70 to 80 JCD and Jubo Dal men for damaging public property and obstructing the officials from performing their duties during the shutdown.

However, none was arrested in connection with the cases, said Shawkat Ali, officer in-charge of Parbatipur police station.

Two army men among four electrocuted

Two army men and two others died from electrocution in Bandarban and Panchagarh districts yesterday and the day before.

Two soldiers of Bangladesh Army were electrocuted at Bandarban Cantonment early yesterday, reports our correspondent.

The deceased are sepoy Rubel, 26, of Dinajpur and sepoy Zamirul Haque, 24, of Chapainawabganj.

Both were posted at field workshop unit at the cantonment.

Sources in Bandarban Brigade said both the youths came in contact with a high voltage wire of an electric pole at about 1:00am.

In Panchagarh, two people were electrocuted at Muhurihat village under Tentulia upazila on Sunday

night as a power transformer caught fire following a big blast.

The deceased were identified as Yakub Ali, 50, son of Abbas Ali of Jamuriburi village and Shahida Begum, 35, wife of Abdul Mannan of Pramanikpara village under the upazila, reports our Thakurgaon correspondent.

Upazila Nirbahi Officer Md. Moniruzzaman told the correspondent over cell phone that at about 8:30pm, a transformer went off with a big bang snapping electric wire of several connections which fell on the ground.

At that time Yakub Ali came in contact with a live wire and died instantly while Shahida touched a live wire when she went to switch off power from a electric board and died on the spot.

RECRUITMENT 'QUOTA'

BCL men lock IU admin bldg to realise demand

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) Islamic University (IU) unit yesterday kept the offices at the administrative building under lock and key for over two hours as the university authorities convened a syndicate meeting without completing viva voce for recruitment of class three and class four employees.

The IU authorities fixed September 29 for holding the syndicate meeting while viva for recruitment of 30 employees is scheduled to be complete on September 3.

Campus sources said BCL has submitted a list of its candidates and is putting pressure on the IU authorities to recruit its candidates. The BCL men want the VC to convene syndicate meeting after September 3 to give approval to new recruits, sources added.

A group of BCL activists led by IU unit convener Samim Ahmed went to administrative building at around

10.00am and chanted slogans against Vice-Chancellor Abdul Hakim for fixing the date for syndicate meeting without completing the ongoing recruitment process.

The BCL men urged the officials and employees to come out of their rooms and then locked all office and main entrance to the administrative building. Neither the VC nor the Pro-VC was present on the campus during the incident.

Later, IU Treasurer Dr Afzal Hossain talked to the BCL leaders and assured that he would place their demand before the university authorities soon. Following the assurance, the BCL men unlocked the office rooms at around 12:30pm and left the administrative building.

Refuting the allegation, BCL leader Samim Ahmed said they didn't submit any list of candidates to the university authorities. "The vice chancellor is incompetent and has totally failed to run the university," he said.

Hizla JCD enforces half-day hartal

A half-day hartal enforced by Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) in Hizla upazila yesterday passed off peacefully.

Upazila JCD called the hartal, protesting BCL attack on its activists at Muladi upazila headquarters on Saturday and foiling of its conference by imposing Section 144 by the local administration on Sunday.

Police arrested two pro-hartal activists for their alleged bid to vandalise an auto-

rickshaw in Sreepur area of the upazila in the morning.

Vehicular were off the roads in the upazila during hartal hours from 6:00am to 12:00noon. Upazila units of BNP and Jamaat also extended their support to the shutdown. JCD men blocks roads at different points by burning tyres and putting logs.

Hizla upazila administration imposed Section 144 from 6:00am on Sunday as JCD and BCL called their meetings at the same venue and time in the upazila town.
