

SAFF DEBACLE Stern action advised

10 days after it was formed the fact-finding committee of the Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF), formed to investigate the failure at the SAFF Championship, came out with a number of recommendations yesterday. The convenor of the three-member committee, BFF vice-president Badal Roy -- Tabith Awal and Shamsul Alam Chowdhury being the other two members -- read out the findings and recommendations which they handed over to president Kazi Salahuddin at the BFF House.

The committee recommended stern punishment against winger Zahid Hossain, who has been found guilty of gross negligence in his commitment to the team during the tournament and also in the past, and who failed to appear before the fact-finding committee for an interview. Although Roy did not articulate any specific punishment, he hinted that the talented winger must be banned from the national team and also club engagement.

"Zahid was irregular in training, avoided his duties and failed to perform which disappointed the nation greatly. His response to the fact-finding committee was also very disrespectful," Badal Roy read.

Roy also said that some of the key players -- Mamunul Islam, Soheli Rana and Shakhawat Hossain -- who have either underperformed or hid injuries, should be cautioned against repeats of such behaviour in the future.

The committee also found goalkeeping coach Kees Kalk's teaching unsatisfactory. But since Kalk's two-month tenure is going to come to an end soon, no action was recommended.

The committee identified some cases of negligence or indifference against head coach Lodewijk de Kruif and cautioned him, as far as his training methods and discipline were concerned.

Prime Doleshwar moved to the top of the Dhaka Premier League table following a three-run victory over Gazi Tank Cricketers at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium at Mirpur yesterday. Doleshwar owed their win to Sri Lankan recruit Roshane Shiwanka Silva (63), who further extended his run as the top-scorer of the tournament.

In the day's other games, Mohammedan continued their bad run despite the return of skipper Mashrafe Bin Mortaza who was rested for their previous game, as they went down to Prime Bank by two wickets at the BKSP-3.

Meanwhile, an all-round performance by

Nasir Hossain, who scored 77 and finished with figures of 1 for 33 off nine overs, led Victoria Sporting to a three wicket win over Cricket Coaching School at Fatullah.

After being put in to bat, Prime Doleshwar rode on half-centuries from Mehedi Maruf and Silva to post a below-par 211. They were the only batsmen who seemed comfortable in the middle. Silva, in particular, showed his class with a scoop over fine-leg for a six off Rubel Hossain in the last over. The rest of Doleshwar's batsmen though were pegged back by Gazi Tank's spin attack for most parts of the innings. They were also hurt by Rubel, who bowled with good pace in the second half of the innings and ended with figures of 4 for 53. Rubel's effort included an acrobatic caught and bowled act in the 48th over

to dismiss Hasantha Fernando.

Rain interrupted the match after 31 overs of Gazi Tank's chase. At that point Gazi Tank were poised at 115 for three. When the match resumed, Gazi Tank needed another 31 runs in five overs to win the match. However, some accurate bowling from Forhad Reza, who finished with figures of three for 18 in three overs and Shohag Gazi, who gave away just 16 runs in his seven overs, took Doleshwar home.

At the BKSP, Mohammedan posted 173 after batting first with Muktar Ali (30), who came to bat at nine, top-scoring for the side. A combined batting effort by Prime Bank led the team to the target in 47.4 overs, but not before losing eight wickets as Saqlain Sajib bowled an incisive spell to take three wickets.

BHF president takes time

BHF president also mentioned that he would talk to the coach, the captain, the team manager and other concerned people if necessary. "Whatever we do will be for the betterment of hockey, as we don't want to blame anyone purposefully," Bari said.

Titans stay afloat

That didn't look likely when Shikhar Dhawan and Parthiv Patel were belting some wayward bowling from Titans around in a rapid half-century opening stand, but, as has always been the worry for Sunrisers, their middle-order frailty was exposed and, this time, their bowlers failed to bail them out.

Captain Henry Davids, who has been prolific in most domestic games recently, and Jacques Rudolph -- who had got into double digits only three times in his previous eight T20 innings -- were involved in what was only the second century stand of the tournament, as Titans chased down 146 without breaking a sweat.

Davids took the early initiative, hitting six boundaries in the Powerplay, the highlight being an inside-hit off Dale Steyn over the covers for six. By the time he was dis-

missed for 64 in the 13th over, Titans needed just 34 more and Rudolph saw them through though he couldn't secure a half-century. Victory was sealed in the 17th over, with eight wickets to spare.

Sunrisers openers had got off to a similarly dominating start after being inserted. Dhawan and Parthiv took advantage, lofting the repeated deliveries comfortably outside off stump over the infield. But, playing primarily in the air cost Dhawan when he picked out third man in the first over after the Powerplay.

Medium pacer David Wiese was the bowler and, buoyed by that big wicket, he went on to turn the tide of the match. He had Patel bowled with a slower ball while hitting across the line and Hanuma Vihari caught brilliantly at midwicket with a well-directed short delivery.

Four new national records were set on the second day of the Bashundhara 29th National Age-group Swimming Competition at the National Swimming Complex in Mirpur yesterday. BKSP's Zahidul Islam set a new record in the 100m butterfly (boys' 13-14 years) at 1:04:07 minutes to win the gold medal. Nayan Ali (boys' u-12) of Laloni Shah academy won the 200m freestyle event in record time (2:22:39 mins). Rasheda Khatun (girls' U-10) of Meherpur Swimming Club won the 50m freestyle gold in a record 36:59 seconds while Marium Khatun (Girls 15-17) of Sagarkhali Swimming Club won the gold in the 200m butterfly event in record time (3:03:17 mins).

Sibley out, finally!

Eighteen-year-old Surrey batsman Dominic Sibley was bowled out for 242 against Yorkshire on Friday after entering the record books as the youngest double centurion in English county cricket.

Aged 18 years and 21 days, the schoolboy batted for 599 minutes and faced 536 balls in an innings that included two sixes and 24 fours before he was bowled by Ryan Sidebottom.

Sibley's maiden first-class century arrived off 301 deliveries, making him the youngest Surrey player to reach that landmark. The previous record was set by Jack Crawford in 1905 at the age of 18 and 257 days.

The 200 came 183 balls later, with a boundary that brought the crowd to its feet and made Sibley the second youngest Englishman to score a first-class double century since WG Grace -- who did it against Surrey at The Oval in 1866.

Naimur rejects Forum claims

Former national skipper Naimur Rahman, who has been nominated as councillor from the Manikganj district, has refuted Bangladesh District and Divisional Sports Organisers Council's claims of irregularities in the councillor's nomination from the district.

The organisation alleged that the process of nomination of the councillor from certain districts did not follow the constitution and was influenced by the government. Speaking to reporters in an impromptu press conference at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium, the former national captain said: "The claims are baseless. I had expressed my interest in becoming councillor from Manikganj a long time back and I had done nothing more than that. I have complete support from the Manikganj district," said Rahman.

The organisation, known as Forum, had made similar claims against the nomination of Akram Khan from the Chittagong Division and Akram too had refuted the claims, stating that the entire process had taken place 'according to the constitution' and in a 'democratic manner'.

The councillors will be responsible for electing 26 directors in the board who will in turn elect the next president of the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB).

The elections which are scheduled for October 10 will clash with Bangladesh's first Test against New Zealand, set to begin on October 9, making things rather difficult for officials who are participating in both the events. Rahman, who has been named the manager of the national team, is one of them.

"It will no doubt be challenging since the elections and the series will go side by side. I have to motivate the team and at the same time I might be a bit tense about the elections. However, I will still try my best to encourage the team," said Rahman.
