I didn't threaten war tribunal

Mahbub now claims upon contempt of court notice

The International Crimes Tribunal-1 yesterday asked BNP chairperson's adviser Khandaker Mahbub Hossain to explain by October 21 why contempt of court proceedings should not be initiated against him for his recent comments on war crimes trial.

The three-member tribunal led by Justice ATM Fazle Kabir, however, exempted Mahbub, vice-chairman of Bangladesh Bar Council, from personal appearance before it, "considering his status", and fixed October 21 for further order in this regard.



ICT LAW VIOLATORS

Cops can arrest without warrant

The House yesterday passed the controversial bill bringing changes in the information and communication technology (ICT) act to empower law enforcers to arrest anybody without a warrant for violating this law.

In one of the changes, the maximum punishment has been raised to 14 from 10 years.

Another bill was passed in parliament to amend the electoral roll law to bar convicted war criminals from being registered as voters.
