Join anti-govt agitation

Khaleda tells newly formed business forum

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia yesterday sought support from businesses for the opposition's caretaker government movement.

"If the incumbent government wants to hold a one-sided election in the country, you [businessmen] should join hands with the general people and the opposition to resist the poll," she told a views-exchange meeting with businessmen at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre.

She urged the business community to join the anti-government movement to restore the caretaker government system in the constitution.

The opposition leader asked the government to act responsibly and try to feel what she called the pulse of the masses.

She reiterated her call for forming Sangram Committees under every polling centre to resist any one-sided election.

Babosayee Parishad (Businessmen Council), a new platform of businessmen,

organised the meeting. Khaleda, who heads the BNP-led 18-party opposition alliance, called upon people to

get united to protect their voting rights. She said if voted to power at the next general election, her party would introduce fair politics with a "new trend in running the

government". "We'll establish national unity with opinions from all. We'll not do business; we will remove all barriers faced by businesses

and speed up the development of businesses and industries," she mentioned.

She excoriated the Awami League-led grand alliance government for its poor performance in different sectors. She accused the ruling AL men of "looting the state banks" in the name of taking loans.

He went on to say his father had never supported the division of greater India into India and Pakistan. The region had historically been a place where people moved about freely.

"My father was against clamping a geo-political division without much regard for whether the people of the territory would be compatible with each other, or whether they would have been more compatible with another group of people," Pervez observed.

He also described his father as one who thought East Pakistan was not compatible with West Pakistan.

He continued, "Having grown up with Bengalis, my father felt that Bengalis in general were a more pluralistic society with a large population of non-Muslims. Even the Islam practised by the Bengali Muslims is more secular in nature and more syncretic [tending to reconcile opposing beliefs or stated.

Religion can never be the strongest of the forces that unite a nation, since a population might have people with differing ideas about religion, Pervez maintained.
