PM's visit creates traffic mess in Ctg city

The presence of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in Chittagong city, where she inaugurated different projects yesterday, caused severe traffic congestion and sufferings for passengers stuck in vehicles.

While she was inaugurating the Bahaddarhat flyover around 10:30am, the Muradpur-Bahaddarhat road, one of the city's busiest roads connected to the flyover, was closed off for around an hour.

This left hundreds of vehicles stranded on the adjoining Oxygen, Chawk Bazar, Badurtala and Number-2 Gate roads.

Afterwards, the prime minister addressed a rally on Jamiatul Falah Mosque premises for an hour from 11:30am and subsequently another adjoining major thoroughfare, from Lal Khan Bazar area to GEC intersection, was made offlimits to vehicles.

This created long tailbacks on the adjacent College, Momin, Sirajudollah, Bagmoniram, and Prabartak roads.

Businessman Md Aminul Haque told The Daily Star that he had barely passed one-third the distance from Lal Khan Bazar area to Agrabad on a vehicle when he got stuck at Ispahani intersection for over 50 minutes.

Another commuter, Md Said, a student, said, "Being stuck at Tiger Pass intersection, I walked for 45 minutes to reach Number-2 Gate."

Banani Graveyard in the capital at 9:00am today. She left behind her hus-


band Shamsul Bari, two daughters and four grandchildren to mourn her death. Supriya was born in Barisal district of the then
