Suicide bomb kills minister on Eid day

A suicide bomber killed at least eight people including a provincial law minister after breaking into his home in northwest Pakistan on Wednesday, officials said.

Israr Ullah Gandapur, law minister for the restive Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, was meeting constituents in his home village of Kulachi when the bomber struck, provincial health minister Shaukat Yousafzai told AFP.

More than 25 people were also wounded in the attack, which occurred on the first day of the Islamic festival of Eid-ul-Azha, he added. Gandapur is the most senior member of former cricket star Imran Khan's

Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party (PTI) to be killed in a wave of attacks which have left hundreds of people dead in recent months. Yousafzai, the health minister, said the suicide bomber had managed to

break into the area despite "very tight security". The attack was later claimed by little-known militant group Ansarul Mujahideen in a phone call to AFP.

"It was revenge for the martyrdom of some of our mujahideen," Abu Baseer, a spokesman for the group said, referring to the killing of militants during a daring jailbreak in July.

Taliban militants armed with guns, mortars, rocket-propelled grenades and bombs bombarded the prison in the town of Dera Ismail Khan, before escaping with some 250 inmates after a three-hour shootout that left 13 dead.

Wednesday's attack involved 8-10 kilograms of locally made explosive, Inayat Ullah, a bomb disposal expert, told AFP.

Gandapur won his seat as an independent from the village of Kulachi, near the city of Dera Ismail Khan, which borders the country's lawless tribal regions where the Taliban and al-Qaeda have carved out strongholds.

Prof Yunus for participation of all parties

Nobel laureate Prof Muhammad Yunus on Thursday urged the government to hold the upcoming general elections with the participation of all political parties.

"We do not want chaos in the country. We want to cast our votes in a peaceful environment. We will not allow the election if all the parties do not take part in it," he said.

Prof Yunus was addressing a gathering of female enthusiasts in arts, literature and education arranged by Nobel Joyi Yunus Suhrid (Friends of Nobel laureate Yunus) at the Ladies Club in the port city.

He said, "We do not want to find ourselves in hard times again, rather want to live in peace within the law."

Terming the country's condition very bad, he said everybody was in fear of what would happen after October 25.

The Nobel laureate urged the government to take effective measures to remove all confusion among the people while there is still time. Criticising the Awami League-led government's moves

Sleep cleans brain

The brain uses sleep to clean away waste toxins that have collected during the

day, a new study has shown.

The brain uses the time we spend asleep to remove all the waste that builds up when we are awake, much like a "garbage removal system", the US based scientists found.

A team at the University of Rochester Medical Center (URMC) for Translational Neuromedicine now believe this waste removal system is one of the fundamental reasons for why we sleep.
