

ILLEGAL NETTING OF HILSA

Fishermen swoop on mobile court

Six bullet-hit, UNO injured in Barguna

Six fishermen were bullet-hit while the upazila nirbahi officer (UNO) of Barguna Sadar and a policeman received injuries from brick-bats during a clash between a mobile court and a group of fishermen on Bishkhali River at Major Char in Barguna Sadar upazila Saturday night.

"I conducted a mobile court on Bishkhali River Saturday night to prevent netting of hilsa during the ongoing October 13-23 ban period. But when we were crossing Major Char area a group of local fishermen attacked us," said UNO Md Nae-E-Alam.

"They threw brick-bats, causing injuries to me and ASI Md Obaidul of Barguna police station. Police fired blank shots to control the situation," the UNO said.

Injured fishermen Julhas, 34, Mosharaf Hossain, 32, and Pintu, 28, all from Kakkira village, were admitted to Barguna hospital while the other bullet-hit fishermen took medical treatment privately to avoid police harassment.

However, local union parishad member Sarwar Ul Alam said at first the fishermen took the mobile court men for robbers at night but when they realised the matter they stopped throwing brick-bats.

Meanwhile, Md Rezaul Karim, executive magistrate and UNO of Charfashion upazila, awarded one year jail to Akbar, 25, Barek, 40, Sahabuddin, 19, Nazim Uddin, 25, and Sofi, 30, and fined Tk 500 each to three other fishermen for catching fish illegally in Boalkhali area of Tentulia River yesterday, said Asaduzzaman, upazila fisheries officer of Charfashion.

Meanwhile, the mobile court sent fishermen Chan Mia, 65, Abdur Rahman Khokon, 28, and Mahbulul Alam, 29, of Major Char area to jail for seven days for catching hilsa in violation of the ban imposed by the fisheries department.

Lightning kills five

Five people, including three of a family, were killed by lightning in Srimangal and Kulaura upazilas yesterday.

Of them, four were killed in Srimangal.

Witnesses said Shakil Mia, 25, his wife Sumi Akhter, 22, and Sumi's younger brother Rahi Mia 7, of Birahimpur village in Srimangal upazila, were killed during rain at about 12:30pm.

Rahi was struck by a lightning while he was playing at a field in the village.

In another incident, Turok Miah, 58, son of late Konor Miah, was killed when a thunderbolt hit him while he was bathing at a pond at Sreegaon village in the afternoon.

In Kulaura, a woman was killed and her husband and mother-in-law were injured by a lightning strike at Takiuli village in the afternoon, reports UNB.

The deceased was identified as Selina Akhter, 30, wife of Abdul Hafiz of the village.
