## Hockey league with 7 clubs?

The Bangladesh Hockey Federation (BHF) yesterday decided to start the new season through the inter-club players' transfers, scheduled to be held over October 29-31, with as many teams as possible taking part in it.

The decision was taken yesterday at the meeting of the BHF Working Committee, which also finalised the code of conduct for the national players. The sport has been experiencing tumultuous times following noncooperation from six premier clubs -- Mohammedan, Mariner Youngs, Wari Club, Dhaka Wanderers, Bangladesh Sporting Club and Ajax SC -- who decided not to take part any hockey activities under the existing BHF committee and pulled out of the elections a few months ago.

And so far Mohammedan, Mariner Youngs, Wari Club and Bangladesh Sporting stuck to their previous decision of staying away from the transfers.

## Smith, De Villiers punish Pakistan

Graeme Smith smashed a double century and AB de Villiers hit a robust hundred to guide South Africa to an impious position in the must-win second Test against Pakistan in Dubai on Thursday.

South African skipper made 227 not out for his fifth double ton while De Villiers -- dropped off the first delivery by wicket-keeper Adnan Akmal off pace man Mohammad Irfan -- was unbeaten on 157 for his 17th Test century.

The duo plundered a hapless Pakistan attack to take South Africa to 460-4 at close on the second day, giving them a big 361-run lead with three full days to play to force a series-leveelling win.

Pakistan won the first Test

by seven wickets in Abu Dhabi last week.

## C'Ron sinks Juventus

Cristiano Ronaldo scored twice as Real Madrid all but secured their place in the Champions League last 16 with a 2-1 win over Juventus at the Santiago Bernabeu on Wednesday.

The Portuguese had fired the hosts into a fourth minute lead with a tidy finish, but Juventus were level midway through the first-half when Fernando Llorente bundled home from close range.

Ronaldo took his tally to an incredible seven goals in just three Champions League games this season with a penalty five minutes later and Juve's task became even steeper when Giorgio Chiellini was sent-off just after the interval.

Gareth Bale was then introduced to make his home European debut for Real, but despite failing to make the most of their numerical advantage they held on to make it three wins from three in Group B.

Defeat however leaves the Italian champions in a perilous situation with just two points from three games, now two behind Galatasaray after they beat FC Copenhagen 3-1 in the other game in the group on Wednesday.

The return of Iker Casillas in goal was one of four changes that Real boss Carlo Ancelotti made to his side from the 2-0 win over Malaga at the weekend, but the Spanish captain showed no signs of rustiness as he parried away a fine drive by Claudio Marchisio inside the first two minutes.

Two minutes later and Madrid were in front as Angel Di Maria cut inside and slipped a perfect reverse ball in behind for Ronaldo to round Gianluigi Buffon and find the net from a narrow angle.

Juventus responded brilliantly to going behind though as they swarmed forward and Carlos Tevez saw two efforts from distance fly just off target.

And they were deservedly level on 22 minutes when Casillas parried Paul Pogba's header at the end of a flowing move and Llorente swept home the rebound for just his second Juve goal since joining from Athletic Bilbao.

It took Madrid just seven minutes to edge back in front as referee Manuel Grafe rightly awarded a penalty when Chiellini hauled down Sergio Ramos as the defender tried to get on the end of Di Maria's free-kick.

## CCS demoted

Cricket Coaching School (CCS) have been demoted from the Dhaka Premier Division Cricket League as punishment for not showing up on time for their match against Brothers Union in the ongoing competition at the Fatullah Cricket Stadium on October 8.

The Cricket Committee of Dhaka Metropolis (CCDM) in a statement yesterday confirmed that they took the decision against CCS in line with tournament bylaws. It may be mentioned here that for a similar offence Surjo Torun, who failed to show up on time for their match against Kalabagan Kira Chakra at BKSP last season, were scrapped from the top-flight league.

CCS reached Fatullah more than half an hour later than the scheduled start and as a result Brothers refused to respond to match referee Samiur Rahman's request to start the match half an hour later and finally the late arrival saw the cancellation of the match.

One more team will be relegated from the league this year after this decision. The league will resume on October 27.

## Benaud stable

Legendary cricket commentator Richie Benaud was in a stable condition in hospital Thursday after driving his vintage car into a brick wall.

The former Australia captain, who has worked in the commentary box since retiring from Test cricket in 1964, was driving to his Sydney home on Wednesday when he mounted the curb and hit the wall.

The 83-year-old, who is due to commentate on the Ashes series against England for Australia's Channel Nine starting next month, suffered chest and shoulder injuries.

A Nine statement said he was expected to be hospitalised for several days.



## Good night for giants

Holders Bayern Munich and Paris Saint-Germain were the biggest winners in the Champions League on Wednesday as Real Madrid and both Manchester clubs also recorded important victories.

Frenchman Franck Ribery scored a brace, including one from the penalty spot, while David Alaba, Bastian Schweinsteiger and Mario Goetze were also on target as Pep Guardiola's Bayern romped to a 5-0

home win against Czech champions Viktoria Pilsen, their eighth consecutive win in the competition.

The German outfit are three points clear at the top of Group D from Manchester City, the Premier League club who claimed a potentially crucial 2-1 win at CSKA Moscow earlier in the day.

City had fallen behind on a difficult pitch at the Arena Khimki when Zoran Tosic lobbed Joe Hart, but Sergio Aguero netted twice before the interval to turn the game on its head.

"It is an important win," City manager Manuel Pellegrini said

after the game. "Now we have to play the next two games at home. I told the players that we had to make sure we didn't lose this one. We are not in the next round yet but this was an important step."

PSG recorded their biggest European away win as they took Anderlecht apart in Brussels, Zlatan Ibrahimovic scoring four times and Edinson Cavani once in a 5-0 victory.

Ibrahimovic's evening featured a hat-trick in the space of 19 first-half minutes, with his third goal a ferocious volley from 30 yards that brought many of the home support-

ers to their feet. And he now has nine goals in his last four games in all competitions.

With Oscar Cardozo's late equaliser earning Benfica a 1-1 draw at home against Olympiakos in the group's other game, PSG are now five points clear at the top and in a position to clinch qualification when they meet Anderlecht at home next.

Despite Ibrahimovic's feats, the competition's top scorer is Cristiano Ronaldo, who took his tally for the season to seven with a brace in Real Madrid's 2-1 win against Juventus at the Santiago Bernabeu.
