Parked rickshaws occupy city roads

Many pedestrian walkways in the capital have been permanently turned into makeshift rickshaw garages, leaving barely enough space to fit feet.

The people managing these garages are neither hesitant to encroach upon the road itself, taking up to one lane with illegally parked rickshaws.

Busy streets like Green Road and the Paribagh road, which empties out onto Shahbagh road near Aziz Supermarket, are two such examples. The four-lane Green Road is half occu-

pied by rickshaws parked nose-to-nose day in and out almost all the way from Panthapath traffic signal to Farmgate bus

stop on both sides. The parked vehicles spill out onto the

street in such a way that a sliver of the road is all that is left for vehicles headed out to the Panthapath signal.

The stretch of Green Road is broken up into two or three different "garages" controlled by a manager each, who guards the rickshaws, according to rickshaw-pullers in the area.

On the footpaths, pedestrians would be barely seen braving to walk through the tangle of steel. They choose to jaywalk instead.

Tahia Jahan, a student of a coaching institution nearby, told The Daily Star that she hated using this road.

"When I walk by, the rickshaw-pullers stationed on the sides leer at me. Sometimes they pass comments as well. It is extremely discomfiting," she said.
